

I wrote some little time ago to Mr. I. Amin enclosing a draft of the section on table tennis of a fact-paper which I am preparing on Non-White sport in South Africa. I was not too sure of the office-bearers of your Board, but he tells me that he sent to draft on to you.

Since then, I have also been in touch with Mr. & Mrs. Roberts of the Union who were able to give me some supplementary material. I have therefore re-done the draft, and enclose a copy herewith.
