

Lecture 7.

1824-1834.

Great unrest among native tribes, largely owing to Chaka who followed Dingiswayo. Drove Amponi & Shangaans north - terrorised what is now Natal.

Amsilkazi father of Lobengula fled & devastated S. Transvaal. Basutoland was ravaged by the Mantsos ^{Dikonyela}. The Bangwaketse of Kamee headed off the raids & the Hottentots of the lower Orange with guns & missionaries did so too.

Intermittent Portuguese occupation of Delagoa Bay. 1823. ^{Capt} Owen ^{Rm} tried to take Delagoa for English.

1824 Farewell & King bought 100 x 30 ^{miles} from Chaka. But there was trade friction & insufficient communication with the colony.

1828-33-34. Suggestion that criminal law be extended to Natal English & an official appointed. Jardines supplied a government with 100 troops. Declined

1823 → Missionaries pushed into the Transkei & north on the "Missionary Road"

The Hottentot States of Fingialand w. were reasonably flourishing due to arms & missionaries.

European migration had pushed to Transorange.

3 expeditions went to investigate

S.W. Africa

Zoutpansberg

Through Kaffraria to Natal.

} good reports

1834. Jemsh Maritz & Piet Retief began to organise both

Land was scarce. Cattle farming is wasteful of land.

Tribes of Kaffraria in state of unrest. Pressure of Europeans. Change of policy as regards reprisals.

Macomo + Tyali with 12000 poured into the Colony.

Sir Henry Smith commanded Col. forces.

Hutsa shot. Macomo Robben Island. Kxeli, Hutsa's son great

Chief. 1st extermination policy Walker p 192.

1835 The Farms + Reserves in Kistei. Trips settled round Poddio. also Walker p 193

Area north of the Stormber annexed to central River families.

Louis Trichardt slipped away north afterwards to be joined by Van Rensburg's party.

Mphahle came into prominence. Treaty system

Treaty system - White men under Whittaker

1836. Jardines made useful progress in Durban.

+ secured S. Natal from Dungenan American

Missionaries entered. 1837. Jardines Magistrate
no annexation.

Dec 1835. General Dispatch. Annexation of Kistei

then withdrawn. (on advice of Philip Stoetenstrom)

aborigines com. met in London.

Stoetenstrom back to Lieut. Gov. of S.P. including
Beaufort West.

Conclusions of Committee

1. Care of aborigines must devolve not on
Colonial legislatures but on Imperial officials
who were to regulate all labour contracts.

2. Brit. subjects going beyond boundaries at their

3. No new territory without Act of Parliament

4. Because of disparity of parties treaty

Period of stabilisation of conditions

1852. Transvaal independence formally recognised on the agreement that should be no slaves.

1854. 845⁰ recognised as a republic.

1856. Natal became Crown Colony.

1852. Cape Constitution.

In Cape Colony Parliament provided for 4 electorates to be on qualification without colour bar. (Qualification occupation of premises worth £25 p.a. or £50 salary or £20 + board lodging) raised in 1892.

In Natal no colour distinction except that £5000 p.a. was set apart for native development.

Divergent Native Policy.
Cape Colony
Within the colony policy of civil & political equality between white, coloured, & black.

Datal

Small European + increasingly large Bantu population.

Shepstone ^{Sontsen} as Diplomatic Agent arranged for large reserves. Shepstone's policy intended to station agents with good schools + agricultural schools + European police officers with ~~other~~ native police.

Racial differentiation as regards law.

Bantu to be subject to Native Law in so far as it was not repugnant to the dictates of humanity. The Chief to assist. Shepstone delegated much to chief + appointed them for disorganised tribes. Probably he could not have done so much if he had not been empowered for magistrates.

Republics had agreed to no slaves.

Religious conviction that Natives were lower race. Apprenticeship supposed not to be unwilling. Determination to have "proper relations" between master + servant.

Dependent class. Locations held during good behaviour. No guns. No horses. No waggons. "Labour tax".
