### Principles

ANC

Congress does not belong to officials

Any institution must have a constitution  
to regulate the activities - to guide officials  
and ~~make them~~ to restrict to use the  
institution for the cause.

For carry the work of the organisation,  
Certain officers are elected with  
executive power and all others  
must ~~also~~ follow <sup>and obey</sup> articles of the  
Constitution if there is to be smooth  
working of the organisation for those.

The organisation has branches and  
a national organisation. Branches  
which can only have constitution within  
spirit of the national organisation.  
in other words - Branches are directly  
under the control of the national and  
can do nothing against the will of the  
national organisation but are part and  
parcel of the national organisation.  
For those who infringe the principles  
discipline is provided for.
