Sir, I let you know that we are back from Queenstown ^{Da 56} as Mr. Gaboutloeloe, you will tell you, we came via Blearynter and turned to go through Thala-ncho. The Thala-ncho people had sent £230 to England in January, now they are anxious to hear from you at Mafikeng.

About the journey I was very anxious to go with Rev. Amos Burnett and Mr. William Hosken who left by ^{Castle} Laurence, this week, but there was no room in the ship. They will see later this month.

The Congress was very interesting, because we found that Rubusana had already spread a bad spirit among the Ndebele people to spoil the Congress. We managed to wipe out that spirit. Now will fill as if we could burst them behind their backs. You will get all the news from Gaboutloeloe.
