Sun: 30<sup>th</sup>. Trinity VIII. Sung Mass 7 a.m. Dora was brought back at 2 a.m. as she had had 6 bad fits, she relatives were very frightened! Many visitors during the day, & cars all round. The grounds looked like fountains! Nabel Abbott-Smith left in the afternoon.

Mrs. Rossop came in the morning. Miss Bosman's people also came. Evensong & sermon, 6.30 p.m. S.E.I. in retreat from 3 p.m.

Mon: 31<sup>st</sup>. Mass 7.15 a.m. Miss Hunt, Miss Bosman & Miss Koller all left in the morning. Christian, Frances & James were blessed in Chapel at 11 a.m., & Maria was dismissed after. In the afternoon James & Frances went to the Adoption Home. S.E.I. in retreat until 3 p.m., & the Assistant in retreat all day.

Tues: Aug: 1<sup>st</sup>. Mass 7.15 a.m. Sr. E. Irene went to JHBurg by the 10.20 train to see about her special shoes. Mrs. Fehrsen came & brought a new girl, Nora. Mrs. Cullinan came to see about a girl. A most lovely warm day!

August 1939.

Weds: Aug: 2<sup>nd</sup>. Mass 7.15 a.m. Fr. Shelley came in the morning, meditation at 10, confessions at 11. In the afternoon the Assistant went into Pretoria by car to see Mrs. Duxbury about the Sale. Girls' service 6.30 p.m.

Mass of the Bl: Sacrament, 7.15 a.m. Miss Plaistow came to stay. In the afternoon a girl had to be fetched from Hospital, so Sr. Hilary Clare went in by the car to shop.

The ladies went by car after supper to see "The Zeal of These House" at the City Hall, Pretoria. As the car was out, Team had to be taken to the Noorderbond by ambulance about 11.30 p.m.
- Weds: 30<sup>a</sup>. Mass of the Departed, C.S.P.V. School Srs. both in retreat. Mrs. Soames came to spend the day. Fr. Shelley came, & brought Fr. Hyde-Smith with him. Fr. H-Smith saw Olga, as he had sent her here.
- A Mrs. Barrett came to see about adopting Pamela. Girls' service 6.30 p.m.
- Thurs: 31<sup>a</sup>.  
St. Aidan. Mass 7.15 a.m. The School Srs. left after morning tea in Trust with the Assistant. Miss Maeder came up from Durban to help for 2 months. In the afternoon the Assistant & Sr. F. May went to town to shop.

September 1939.

St. Giles. Sr. E. Irene went to town by van to take a

6.30 p.m., beginning the night of prayer for  
peace.

Trinity XIII. day. Wireless reports received stating (1)  
War declared. that Britain had declared war with Germany  
+ (2) that France had done the same.  
Evensong + sermon at 6.15 p.m. in order to  
allow the Ss. + ladies to listen to the  
King's speech on Vic's wireless. It came  
through very clearly.
- Mon: 4<sup>th</sup>. Mass 7.15 a.m. (Salus populi.)  
The Assistant had all the girls in Chapel at  
11 a.m. + read them the King's speech +  
also talked to them for a few minutes.
- Tues: 5<sup>th</sup>. Mass 7.15 a.m. Sr. Agnes Irene, Sr. B. Mary  
+ Sr. K. Elisabeth arrived from E. London at  
5.51 p.m. They had had a very good time.
- Weds: 6<sup>th</sup>. Mass 7.15 a.m. After 6 p.m. the Assistant  
went to town by car, + brought Sr. Flora  
Mary back with her. No girls' service in  
the evening. 4 Irs. went into white  
habits as it was so warm.  
News received from the U.C. Office that the  
Carnarvon Castle is expected at C.T.  
tomorrow.

Carnarvon Castle not in, + not expected  
until Friday. Isabel Brown went off to

Vespers 5-15 p.m. The van took all the providers to the Cecilia ground & S<sup>2</sup>E J. also drove down in it. A N<sup>2</sup> & N<sup>2</sup> Hunt called in the afternoon leaving clothes for the Hanes & they walked down to the field to see Matron Florence. The girls danced in the evening. S<sup>2</sup>E J. was taken ill at the picnic & the car had to be fetched to bring her up to the Hanes. She went straight to bed.

Friday.

Octave Day of the

September 15<sup>th</sup>

Mass 7-15 a.m. Most of the morning taken up with seeing about S<sup>2</sup>E J. who was very poorly with a high temperature. It was decided to send her into the Arcadia Nursing Home & the ambulance came & fetched her at 12-45. S<sup>2</sup>O F. went in with Sister. S<sup>2</sup>B H. went into Princeton on the Van.

Mrs Denslow left after breakfast. Mother & the Assistant went to St. Margaret's for Morning tea at 10-30 a.m. Heavy rain & thunder at 4-30 p.m. Classes as usual.
