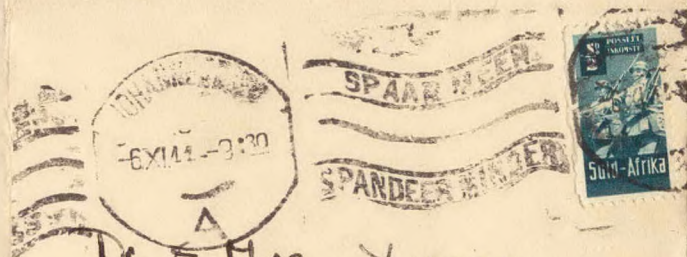

The Society, whose primary object is to develop African Drama by staging plays written and produced by Africans, is now rehearsing a Bantu play "Moshoshoe", which will be staged in April.

AIMS AND OBJECTS.

To stage plays written and produced by Africans, and encourage the development of indigenous dramatic art forms ; to arrange dramatic programmes for African National Festivals such as Moshoshoe's day, Mendi Day, Ntsikana's Day, Shaka's Day etc., to work for the establishment of an African National Theatre ; to encourage the development of African Opera ; to encourage histrionic art among Africans, and to place before the public African talent in this field ; to investigate the possibility of shooting films of Bantu historical plays ; to serve as an African Drama Bureau ; to encourage the study of European Drama and the production of classical and modern plays ; to foster the love of Drama and kindred arts in Bantu Schools and locations.
