I am of the opinion that it is necessary, for the proper administration of the provisions of the Media Emergency Regulations, that these copies be supplied until 9 June 1989.

Your attention is also drawn to the following relevant provisions of regulation 10:

- "10(2) A copy of an issue of a periodical which in pursuance of an order under subregulation (1) is required to be supplied to the said official, shall be sent to him within one day of the day on which that issue is published in the Republic.
- (3) In this regulation "issue", in relation to a periodical issuing different editions on the same day, means each edition of that periodical which is so issued."
