Mr. Vorster, replying to ques-

tions by Sir De Villiers Graaff,

said during the debate on the

justice vote that he had deci-

ded "in the interests of South

Africa" not to grant Sobukwe an exit permit.

He added that legislative provision would be made before the end of the session to extend Sobukwe's detention for another year.

Mrs. Helen Suzman (P.P., Houghton): How long are you

going to keep him locked up?

Mr. Vorster did not answer this question, but said that a Red Cross official from Geneva had visited Robben Island recently and had seen Sobukwe. The official had reported to him that Mr. Sobukwe's accommodation was similar to that of a high ranking-officer in time of war.

Mr. Vorster added that Sobukwe had a radio and received daily
