## Sobukwe may not stay with friends

By PAM KLEINOT MR Robert Sobukwe, ban-ned leader of the banned Pan Africanist Congress has been refused permis-sion to stay with friends when he goes to Cape Town next month for a check-up at Groote Scienar Hospital.

The Minister of Justice, Mr J T Kruger, has granted Mr Sobukwe permission to go to Groote Schuur Hospital'on January 6, subject to these conditions:

e. That he leaves Kimber-ley by train on January 3 after reporting to the divi-sional commander of the Security Police in Kimber-

 That when he arrives in Cape Town on January 4 he reports to Caledon Square Police Station.

That he spends the

night of January 4/5 at the Holiday Inn in Woodstock.

That he reports to Groote Schour Hospital on January 5, and rensains there as long as the hos-pital authorities deem it

necessary. · That on his discharge from hospital he returns to Kimberley up the first avallable train.

. If he has to wait for a train after discharge from hospital, he must stay at the Hohday Inn.

He must report his de-parture at Calreden Square Police Statten, and his artival at Kimberley to the Devisional Commander of the Security Police.

Mr Sobukwe, 53 (who is confined to Kimberka had a hing tumour open ation at Groote Schutter Hospital in September He was granted permission by the Minister of Justice to fly to and from Cape Town, and was at to permitted to recuse: ste at a friend's home for two weeks before retiim

ng to Kimberley. Three hours after dis charge from hospital he was ordered by the Security Police to seave the house of Rishop Patrick Matengue in Newlands and return ou haspetal or to his home in Symbertey. Later he was then granted permission to stay with a Cape Town

Mr Sabukwe was released from Robben Island prison in 1969 and allowed to train as an astorney in Kimberley He was formerry a tecturer in African tanguages at the University of the Witwatersrand. Robert Sobukwe Papers
