It has also emerged during the hearing, that subsequent to the sealing off of the Hostel, strict controls were put in place by Iscor to monitor those entering and leaving the hostel.

According to Mr Moses Mthembu, Iscor has records of those people who entered and left the hostel subsequent to it being sealed off.

Please can we have copies of those records for the period 18 June 1992 to 31 October 1992.

In respect of the period prior to the massacre, Mr Moses Mthembu has stated that Iscor kept records of all hostel residents, including those "refugees" who were not employed by Iscor. Please could you let us have a copy of those records for the period 1 January 1992 to 18 June 1992.

It is common cause that Prince Vanana Zulu was employed by Iscor as at 17 June 1992. It is also common cause that he was a resident at Kwa-Madala Hostel at the time. Please would you let us have copies of all documents relating to the period during which Prince Zulu was on leave during 1992. Such documents should include applications for leave, approval thereof and appropriate wage register documents.

It has been further stated that Mr Nosenga was indeed paraded before the leadership of the IFP at the conference on the grounds that he had allegedly stated that he had been sent by the ANC to reconnoitre Kwa-Madala Hostel for the purpose of planting bombs at the Hostel.

We have also responded to the letter of Nicolls and Cambanis and Associates dated 26th April 1999 and attach a copy herewith for your attention.



We have this morning been notified by Ms. Faeza Brown that -

- You have informed her that you and your colleagues shall all be withdrawing from the matter on Monday, 3 May 1999.
- 2. That you regard the non-payment of Adv. Malindi as being racist.

On the first point, we strongly advise you not to take this course of action and encourage you to remain in the matter.

You obviously are aware of the enormous cost involved in setting up the hearings for a three week period and that your withdrawal as attorneys for the victims could result in the possible cancellation of the hearings.

The Amnesty Committee views your intention to withdraw at this very late stage (29 April 1999 by Adv. Malindi and 30 April 1999 by yourself on behalf of Adv. Berg and Adv. Malindi), in a most serious light and the TRC shall reserve its rights in regard to any wasted costs incurred herein.

We must also point out to you that Judge Ngcobo has made special arrangements to attend to this matter during the allocated period at great sacrifice to his official duties in the Labour Appeal Court.

Secondly, we take serious offence at this remark. The correspondence in this matter will indicate the great efforts made by the TRC to assist and effect payment to Adv. Malindi. However, if you have proof that non-payment was due to racism on anybody's part we shall be glad to receive it and refer the matter to The Minister of Justice for proper investigation.

We trust that common sense will prevail and that you reconsider your position.



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


