REPORT FROM 15TH TO 17TH DECEMBER '55.

G. 808.

WE MET AT 593 ON THE EVENING OF THE 15TH DEC. '55. WE WERE 12 IN NUMBER. WE PAID THE SUM OF £20 TO MR. POLOHLO FOR THE JOURNEY TO AND FROM BLOEMFONTEIN EACH PAID 1/2 FARE. WE LEFT AT 2 A.M. ON FRIDAY. WE ARRIVED IN BLOEMFONTEIN AT 6.45 A.M. WE ARRIVED AT MR. MAFURA PLACE NO 3338 JAMES SCOTT STREET, BOCHABELA LOCATION. THERE WE WERE TOLD WHERE OUR LODGING WAS ARRANGED. THE LODGING WAS 7/6^d PER DAY, AND DELEGATION CARD 5/- . ON THE 16TH AT 10 A.M. WE WENT TO THE ANGLICAN CHURCH FOR AN HALF HOUR SERVICE. AFTER THE SERVICE THE MOTHER OF THE ANGLICAN LUTHERI TOOK THE LEAD WHEN WE MARCHED IN THE STREETS SINGING PROTEST SONGS. MRS LUTHULI LODGED AT NO 3410 MATLABE ROAD, AND CHOPPS AT 3361 KING ROAD. +

AT 12 M.D. I BOARD THE BUS TO TOWN IN VIEW OF SEEING THE C.I.D'S I FOUND THAT THEY ^{WERE} NOT IN THE NOTICE WAS PUNCHED AT THE DOOR THAT THEY WILL BE IN AT 2.30 P.M. I THEN RETURNED TO THE LOCATION, I HAD PAID 6^d BUS FARE.

2.30 P.M. ON 16TH I MET DR. LETELE HE TOLD ME ME THAT THERE IS MAN FROM TUL. HE BANNED FROM A.N.L. BUT, HE HAD COME BLOEMFONTEIN NOW HE IS LOOKING FOR HIS ACCOMMODATION SO THAT THEY SHOULD HIDE HIM. FROM THERE WE PARTED. I BOARD A TAXI TOWN TO REPORT TO C.I.D'S STILL THEY WERE NOT IN IT WAS 3.45 P.M. THE TAXI DEMANDED 6/- FOR A SPECIAL RUN. THE SAME NIGHT I CRYPT AND WENT TO C.I.D. CONSTABLE JOHANNES MOTLOUNG ABOUT I HEARD FROM LETELE. ON THE 17TH THE WOMEN HAD THEY MEETING LILLIAN NGOMI WAS THE CHIEF SPEAKER ON THE PHASES AND B.C.A. AFTER THAT THEY HELD A VOTE FOR THE WOMEN WHO WILL TAKE UP THE LEAD OF THE A.N.L. WOMEN'S LEAGUE, THE RESULTS ARE AS FOLLOWS:
