- 5<sup>th</sup> S. S. Superior & S. Thora Mary judged the House Singing Competitions in School. 'bockrell' Cup won by Key House. 1<sup>st</sup> Performance of Nativity Tableaux in Church @ 5 pm for General congregation.
- 6<sup>th</sup> Mrs. Stewart came down from Ncaumbu. Hockear horry left at 10 a.m. 2<sup>nd</sup> performance of Tableaux at 7.15 for boarders & Mission Staff. very devotional & reverent.
- 7<sup>th</sup> Schools closed. 3 hories left for Umkata in course of afternoon.
- 8<sup>th</sup> horry for Tzolo & M. Frene bus - left v. early. All girls left now except E. Gauditi who stays till 16. morrow.
- 9<sup>th</sup> Workers meeting di. Mass in Chapel at which 3 Sisters communicated. Other Sisters communicated at workers mass. Meeting ended 12.40. S. Superior approached Sr. Superior as to the desirability of having an early low mass in Chapel for Communion - & being present only at the workers mass. on the grounds that we miss our prayer time 4 times a year. as well as on the grounds of fatigue & strain. He values the existing custom so highly that he will be v. sorry if it is given up.
- 11<sup>th</sup> Abapati Kazi & Amagoso began to arrive for Conference preparatory to M.V. Retreat. 8 slept - some went to Kraals.
- 12<sup>th</sup> 10 a.m. Conference with the above - about 25 present. Retreat began at 5 p.m. Only 12 present - we think due to rain - its plunging season. 3 new girls for school came to be looked <sup>at</sup> up.
- 13 M.V. Retreat. bet weather.
- 14<sup>th</sup> Very wet day - Some of the Mothers stayed on for food & sleeping.
- 15<sup>th</sup> C.M.B. Corporate Advent Retreat. uncondacted.
- 17-16<sup>th</sup> S. Superior & S. Dorothea went into Tzolo in the evening for Confirmation. Two Payer grandchildren were confirmed.
- 19<sup>th</sup> The Bishop called in the morning.
- 20<sup>th</sup> The Bishop, Sr. Provincial, Sr. Superior, S. Euphemia, Sr. Superior - had a meeting in Fr. Provincial's hut in Hospital re <sup>some</sup> future <sup>plans</sup> of C.S.J.B. It was decided that the proposed plans were to be a beyaance pro: Tem: a Private Confirmation was held in our Chapel at 3.30. Candidates Mrs. Dances Payer, Rawlhi Mary Payer. All had tea in the Parlour afterwards - also Bishop Sr. Hartley. S. Ed. S.N.M & S.D. went to the Bush in the morning. Mission Boxes can't.

21<sup>st</sup>. Ordination in Church at 8.30 am. Aaron Munkki to the Priesthood - & two strangers, not from his Parish to the Mission. Mission Boxes unpacked.

Xmas Day. 25<sup>th</sup>. Mass in Chapel 6.15. All the Europeans on the Mission came. High Mass in Church 8.30. Talking Dinners in Refectory. All the Mission Staff to tea in parlour - 4. C.M.V. all went to party at C.S.I.B. 6.30 - 8 pm.

27<sup>th</sup>. Tea party on S. Lucy's Hospital Steps for Europeans of Mission. Piano Recital & Singing by S. Faith's cousin Miss Roberts. Presents for Europeans.

28<sup>th</sup>. Christmas Tree @ 7.30. in Dining Hall. The Sr. Superior had been down previously, & had asked that public individual presents to the Communities might stop. "Party" opened with greetings & a few words from Sr. Superior & also the recitation of Xmas presents - & once in royal David's city was sung. Then distribution of presents - & talk - then "White Shepherd's watch" was sung, afterwards given the party dispersed about 8.45.

29<sup>th</sup>. Sr. Dorothea, Sr. Norah Mary & Miss Sheppard went away about 1.30 - the two former to London, the latter to Grahamstown.

11<sup>th</sup>. C.S.I.B. retreat ended. Sr. Faith's cousin went for picnic.

12<sup>th</sup>. Heard by mail that Shucy Stope would probably come in July to relieve. S.M.V. at S. Augustines.

16<sup>th</sup>. S.M.G. & S.M.V. went for picnic. S.E. party. Spent night in Hospital.

The Buckley's, Mr. Molydin called about 4 p.m. Sr. Eu. letter.
- 19<sup>th</sup> Detachments all came again before leaving for S. Barnabas. They are very grateful to us for releasing Moly from her engagement with us. She is to begin industrial work at Holy + Pondoland. S. Dorothea, Sr. Christiana Misses Sherrard arrived about 11 a.m. Sr. C. who is to work at S. Augustines will sleep here till after retreat. Telegram from Mother Provincial came warning on a cable from home saying that S. Dorothy Hoken is to go straight to Transvaal on landing. Sr. Enid to come here for 6 months then to England in July. S.S. + S.C. to Sr. Augustines in the p.m.
- 21<sup>st</sup> Our Annual Retreat - Conductor Fr. Key began after supper. Superior poorly with tonsils.
- 22<sup>nd</sup> S. Superior not able to join in Retreat: laced after breakfast. Dr. L. saw her + Sr. Euphemia.
- 23<sup>rd</sup> S.S. in bed.
- 24<sup>th</sup> S.S. up for few hours. The Visitor, (Bishop of Kmi Ru) Mr. Gibson + 2 little girls ship Botkwell called.
- 25<sup>th</sup> S.S. in retreat. Viraudah being hatched under the oven by K. Simlahlo
- 26<sup>th</sup> Retreat ended. Sr. Enid arrived about noon - + Mrs. H. Horse, an unexpected visitor, an hour later. Viraudah + other works done by Kivet Simlahlo finished.
- 28<sup>th</sup> Children returned - 42 present at roll call unless possible to be. Weather v. bad.
- 30<sup>th</sup> S.M.G. to see W. School with other visitors.

FEBRUARY 1934.

- 1<sup>st</sup> Mrs. Sherrard returned to Transvaal.
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Community morning + afternoon tea. Brief meeting from Transvaal.
- 3<sup>rd</sup> S.M.G. + Sr. Edulka arrived + stayed in afternoon. Children to 'teza'!
- 4<sup>th</sup> Father Parsons called in morning + saw Chapels - talked with Sr. Superior + Sr. Euphemia. S.M.G. to Sr. Augustines to morning tea.
- 5<sup>th</sup> S.M.G. + S.S. to S. Augustines to afternoon tea. Fr. Parsons saw round I.S. + Hospital in morning.

- 7<sup>th</sup> Sr. Marjorie Gabriel in retreat.  
 8<sup>th</sup> S.S. to S. Augustine's to tea to Executive Committee meeting.  
 9<sup>th</sup> S.M. Gabriel left for Tansuul at 2 pm. She has been here 5 weeks.  
 10<sup>th</sup> Sr. Editha in Retreat - Chapel walls (inside) mudded. It was found when Sanctuary curtains were taken down that there was a bad crack running all round approx. probably due to sinking of foundations.

- Quinquagesima 11<sup>th</sup> Deaconess Joró, a friend of Sr. Rachel's arrived after High Mass. She is travelling with the Moses Pilkington until Sat 11<sup>th</sup> to-morrow. They are with Mr. Scott: he came to tea with us.  
 12<sup>th</sup> Mrs. Hothouse left for Matatiele 6.50 am. Car ordered for 6.15 did not come (Sheppard) Herbert took her in in lorry. She just caught the Kokstad bus.

Ask Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> Mass in Church at 5.30 am for Hothouse. Imposition of ashes before Ch. Mass at 6.20 am.

15<sup>th</sup> Lent address by Fr. Key in Chapel @ 5.30 pm. Bulbs planted.

17<sup>th</sup> S. M. Baptista & S. D. in Retreat. Regina Ndeliyana died in Hospital @ 5 pm.

18<sup>th</sup> Regina's funeral at 2.30 pm from S. Lucy's - [at her cottage @ 3.45 pm]

19<sup>th</sup> Sr. Erid in retreat. Frederica to Totano for a few days - Charity Relief Committee

20<sup>th</sup> Mr. Thurbuck visited the Mission - gave helpful advice up at S. Augustine's.

21<sup>st</sup> Miss Rowe visited the Mission - saw all the schools. Had lunch here, went to Bathing pool in afternoon.

22<sup>nd</sup> Amelia Mngwali died in Hospital while we were at dinner.

Fr. Key's Lent address at 5.30 pm. Sr. Faith not so well.

23<sup>rd</sup> Amelia's funeral @ 2.30 pm. New candlesticks for S. A. Chapel arrived - very nice. Meeting of S. Augustine's Committee in S. Superior's Office @ 6.30. Frederica returned 9.30 pm.

24<sup>th</sup> S. Christ<sup>ina</sup> <sup>S. Superior's</sup> in retreat. Mrs. Hothouse in retreat all day.

25<sup>th</sup> Sr. Rachel in retreat - S. Superior went with Annual Retreat in the evening.

26<sup>th</sup> Mrs. Ngankusa came to say goodbye. Relief Committee in P. Office met.

March 2<sup>nd</sup> S. Superior came out of retreat. Fr. Key came to say that there was a v. grave charge against Mendu, He was called to meeting in the evening but behaved badly, refused to answer, was sent out.

March 3<sup>d</sup> Meudu came early, then absented himself from work. - so could not go to St. Superior when called.

March 5<sup>th</sup> Meudu discharged by the Father Superior. Washington Tanda engaged in his place: James to do Meudu's work, & Washington James'. Nau also called to do girl's garden. Relief Committee in the afternoon. Children now being fed daily on the Mission = 70. Over 30 kraals are receiving a daily ration of grain.

8<sup>th</sup> Sister Sobuzo began to work at cleaning the garden.

10<sup>th</sup> First Communion retreat from 2-3 pm. We have 6 girls here - 10 St. Cuthbert's girls are to sleep & feed here also.

11<sup>th</sup> Refreshment Sunday. First Communion @ 7 am Mass. S. D. went up to put on veils. He with our children. The children had cakes given to them after they had greeted St. Superior. Mrs. Scott + Mrs. St. Croix Miss Agan came to tea.

13<sup>th</sup> Hospital Committee meeting 4.15 pm - 6.30 pm.

Richard Daines returned from England.

17. Corporate heart retreat (unconducted.) Miss Agan also in retreat. Philgat (Kautsu) fell down & either broke or dislocated her elbow.

18. St. Christian in retreat.

19. Philgat's arm fractured & dislocated. Dr. L. gave anæsthetic & set it to-day.

20. St. Callaway came to see Superior St. Euphemia for a few minutes. It came down on shore. he was v. frail. Miss Beameshed bed here all day. went to house.

21<sup>st</sup> "Chance" very ill - died in the afternoon - cause unknown - probably horse-sickness. Rehearsal of St. Anne's Crucifixion. pm. with lantern.

22<sup>nd</sup> L.C. Call from home. "Some" arrives July 9. Don't October - Paschal tide greetings.

23<sup>rd</sup> Girls sang selections from St. Anne's Crucifixion with lantern slides in the D. Hall at 7.15 pm. Europeans & a certain no. from St. Augustine's (The Hostels) were present. Music sung Chorus 'Jesu, hard Jesu - (by 11) + vv. of Cross of Jesus. 2 of King under the Gate, 2 vv. Jesus he crucified. 3 vv. All for Jesus. 1 Gramophone Record (2 sides) was also played.

25<sup>th</sup> PALMSUNDAY. The Bishop called in the afternoon, also Miss Joseph

who also came to tea. In the evening Fr. Key showed lantern slides "Story of Holy Week" (Holes' pictures) to Rev. S. Augustine's children & Mrs.

- 26<sup>th</sup> Bishops said & preached at European Evensong 7:15 pm. each day in Holy week.
- 27<sup>th</sup> After Evensong - Mr. Timin told us that "Mhlobo" was in the river by the dipping tank either dead or dying - Washington sick.
- 28<sup>th</sup> Irindena James went early to see about Mhlobo. He was dead: Mrs. got men to help & dragged the body to a more suitable spot. Washington absent.
- 29<sup>th</sup> MAUNDY THURSDAY. Sisters went up to Church for Evensong during the watch - otherwise all as usual.
- 30<sup>th</sup> GOOD FRIDAY. Three Home Devotion in Church conducted by the Bishop. otherwise all as usual.

- APRIL 1<sup>st</sup> EASTER DAY. Children went home for week's holiday after the High Mass. 12 remain here, including 5 from Nyika whom we are keeping here because of the typhus. Bishop to tea in the afternoon.
- 2<sup>nd</sup> EASTER MONDAY. Cloudy day. Fr. Enid joined S. Augustine's picnic.
- 3<sup>rd</sup> Six Sisters went for picnic - v. enjoyable - taking 12 holiday children with them.
- 4<sup>th</sup> Workers meeting in the morning
- 5<sup>th</sup> Fr. Enid S.R. of took children for picnic.
- 6<sup>th</sup> Sr. Editha took 6 children to Jenuca. Fr. Bull arrived on Mission. Mrs van Hellick came to stay for few days.
- 7<sup>th</sup> Fr. Bull visited S.S. in the morning. In afternoon S.S. went to meet Mother Provincial - the bus was 2 hours late - so Mother did not reach here till nearly 8 pm. C.M.B. C.S.B. holiday children were out to welcome her. Mother & S.S. had supper in the Community Rooms, a brief visit to Chapel then to bed.
- Low Sunday 8<sup>th</sup> Mother to High Mass - then all except Sr. Euphemia went up to S. Augustine's to tea. Fr. Bull came to talk to the Sisters about the present position of the Church of the Province & the Church of England party.
- 9<sup>th</sup> Mother visited - then went round premises - H. School in the morning.
- 10<sup>th</sup> F. of the Annunciation. Talking morning & afternoon tea. Mother found Hospital. Fr. Bull the Bishop called in the morning. M.V. Tea-party in the afternoon.



- 11<sup>th</sup> Mother to School Prayers & Carpentry @ 9 a.m. Fr. Provincial called  
also - He goes to Secon<sup>o</sup> beach to morning tea - Mother to Key College  
to morning tea - on to weaving School.
- 12<sup>th</sup> Mother, S.S., S.B., S.E. went by car to Leuca leaving at 9.30 returning @ 1 pm.  
They visited school & church. Fr. Provincial left for Secon<sup>o</sup> Beach at  
7 am.
- 14<sup>th</sup> Mother, S.B., S.M.B., S.E. & S.F. for picnic from 9.30 - 2.30 to 2<sup>nd</sup> beach  
on Red Hill. S.S. to St. Augustines in the morning.

- 24<sup>th</sup> Mother, S.S., S.B. & S.F. went at 9 am to Mrs. Taha returning at  
4.30 p.m. The talks were very fine after Sunday's hundredth.  
Mother & S.S. to talking supper with C.S.D.P.
- 25<sup>th</sup> Mother & S.R.M. set off directly after 7 am to climb Kuanoa - They returned  
just after 3 pm. Talking tea on slope (St. Mark).
- 26<sup>th</sup> Father Superior sent a party to Inua Station. Mother, S.S., S.E., S.J.  
They much enjoyed it. The school children sang. The teacher gave a bowl  
of Maloia from the school garden. S.S. sent back a scotch sweets from  
the store for the children.
- 27<sup>th</sup> Mother & S.S. to St. Augustines to tea & entertainment -  
In the evening the individuals gave another concert. Bernardine calved but  
calf hidden by her.

2<sup>nd</sup> Hospital Committee meeting in the afternoon.

9<sup>th</sup> ASCENSION EVE. Very busy with preparations for the Mother's Union Annual Meeting. A young cow (who calved but did not give milk) was slaughtered. The Industrial School prepared meat + vegetables + the hospital kindly undertook the making of the bread. All preparations + arrangements were v. satisfactory: about 110 sat down to supper @ 7.45.

10<sup>th</sup> ASCENSION DAY. As both Masses in Church were in Xosa the Europeans all came to Mass in our Chapel. After 8.30 Mass children went for picnic to Belle Beach, with Sr. Egid, Dorothea Rachel. Sr. Faith joined S. Aug.'s picnic.

12<sup>th</sup> S. Dorothea in retreat.

14<sup>th</sup> Meeting in S.S. Office - called by Ft. Superior - Present the afore-mentioned + Sr. T. + Mrs. Huskisson + Mrs. Wallace. Travelling arrangements for S.C.'s children were discussed. Sr. T. took in charge of my arrangements - helped by Mrs. Egidwa.

16<sup>th</sup> S. Egid in retreat - whole day - also S.C. + S.A.C. for afternoon.

17<sup>th</sup> S. Robert S. Faith in retreat. S.S. in afternoon.

19<sup>th</sup> S. Mrs. S. Ed in retreat - S.S. for the afternoon.

20<sup>th</sup> Mass in Chapel. Boarders made their Communion at 8.30 - Winkie caps <sup>worn</sup> for the first time. D. Keshie, M<sup>rs</sup>, Shekie came to tea on the stoep. Mrs. Beaman left for her holiday with the Keshies -

21<sup>st</sup> Sr. Faith left @ 6.20 am. for her rest. She is quite to stay with friends in Durban -
