Germany 1933, South Africa 1954, the same idealogy, the same methods, the similar group of desparate radmen waging a desparate battle to perpatuate all the evil terror that acompanies fascism.

But if events in our country are to run true to the patern of Germany 1933, then there are also the glorious pages from the history books of the peoples' struggle that should hearten and instil confidence in our oppressed masses. The fate of tyranny in Nazi Germany invariably awaits the tyrants of our land. Make no Mistake about it. The increasing oppression in South Africa are the sols of frightened little men, the objective condition existing in South Africa weigh far more heavily on the side of the people than they did in Germany. Whereas Hitler could boast of some peasure of super-





"I am not interested in politics;" " hy should I join the Youth Congress?" "I'd rather go to a match or to.a dance or cinema than attend a meeting."

These are the attitudes we constantly come up against when we meet young people and try to interest them in the Youth Congress.

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Coming so soon, when the tasks of the heroic befiance Voluntters are still fresh in the minds of the people there is bound to be an amount of misunderstanding as to the tasks of the Freedom Volunteers. And, if their desparate attempts to discredit and disrupt the movement, the enemies of the Congress of the people will deliberately spread lies and distort the real meaning of this great movement.

Firstly it must be made quite clear that while the Congress of the People might have come about as a result of the radically changed political situation caused by the Defiance Campaign the present compaign is NOT the continuation of the Defiance Campaign.

WOMEN IN OUR ORG. MISATION.

TIME and again it has been emphasised from our official platform and also from the general membership the need for embracing young women into the ranks of our Youth Congress. So far the results of our drives show a complete failure on this aspect of our work. The causes of our failures are threefold:-

- 1. The Youth Congress has taken decisions on this question that have never gone further than the resolution stage.
- 2. Many of our homes are still run on the strict Indian orthodox pattern which allow very little freed m to the womenf lk.
- 3. The more westernised Indian w men have developed 'other interests'. I wish to make a few comments on the last point.

To many of these young ladies have become inericanised. They spend most of their time memorising the sentimental thrashy songs that once out if the Opringbok radie all day long. There reading consists of a thing but droopy love stories out of 'Oracles', and 'Miracles'. Then there are others who have been edicted to rubber - they call it chewing gum. Today, we oppressed people salute this gallant young lady who contributed mire than her share to stop the French imperialists in Indo-China. > " "Tis better to die fighting on your feet than to live on your knees!"




