Mary Evans - Promised we should know definitely in a few days
- 25th S^r G. went to see S^r H. about M^{rs} Smith - It was decided
by the S^r in Charge that unless she came in that day, she
could not be received at all - She did not come -
- 26th M^{rs} Wilkins said Mass - & came at 5 to hear 2 Confessions
& took Evening & gave an address - Matron & Catharine
went out shopping - Father Urquhart called to ask
if a girl M^{rs} Foley (Roman) could be taken in -

- 27th Sr Stella Grand went to the school to see Sr Hilda. Sr Alice came to sleep instead of Sr Rose.
- 28th F of SS. Simon & Jude. XXth Sun. after Trinity
Sr Grace & S. S. Lu. took Matron & ten girls Mass⁷. Two girls making their Communions. Sr Alice took charge of mass & went to 8 o'clock Mass. then came again to sleep at night. Matron & Katharine to Cathedral evening - Sr Superior did not come down, so usual Margaret & Clara came.
- 29th The Rector came to hear Sisters' confessions. Matron from Dayzelto hospital came about washing.
- 30th Sr Grace went up to the school to see Sr Hilda.
- 31st The Rector said Mass. Sr Grace went up to the school to see Sr Hilda. Captain Trotter called to ask about a servant. Sr G. went to ask Mr. Godepe if he knew Captain Trotter, then on to interview the Trotter again about a girl. As Mr. Trotter had already engaged a servant it was decided to leave the matter for the present.
- 1st Feast of All Saints. Sr Stella Grand & Miss Tompkins went to six o'clock Mass. Sr Grace & Matron at 7. Matron was said

after breakfast - S^r Stella's maid went to school to see S^r Hilda - S^r Grace took Mary Kiddlech (Agatha) unexpectedly to Hospital - a boy was born within half an hour of her arrival there.

2^o M^r Wilkin's maid came for All Souls & came to take Confirmation class at 5 - then Evening & Adoration - S^r Henry called to see two small babies - Miss G. R. called - A gentleman, whose name we know not yet called to ask if we do his washing as well as his three batchelor friends - S^r Henry called.

3^o S^r Grace went to the school after Mass to see S^r Hilda who was going to Schaumburg the same afternoon - S^r Henry called to see Rosa & Violet who have not been well in the last three weeks.

4^o XXI. Sunday after Trinity - S^r S. M. went with girls to 7 o'clock Mass. S^r G. at 8 - S^r Henry called to see the two babies - S^r Grace went to Hospital to see Agatha - Matron & three girls to Evening at the Cathedral - Superior & S^r C. Emma came down at 5 & stayed to Vespers - Another baby ill.

5th Mr^s Shelling called to ask about a maid & brought some washing to the laundry. Dr Henry called to see the three sick babies.

6th Mr^s Chamberlain called to pay laundry account. Dr^s Laska called to ask if he might give his address & telephone on Wednesdays instead of Fridays, for the future. Dr Henry called to see the babies - John today ill with diarrhoea & sickness. Dr Grace took two, Walter & Nora, to the Hospital. Matron went to the Bigel for the usual weekly gift of groceries & then on to Dr^s Messum for a present of baby clothes - Olga not well.

7th Mr^s Chamberlain said Miss Baby Olga seemed much worse. Dr Grace took her up to see Dr Henry who said she was evidently very ill & advised taking her at once to Hospital. Telephoned at 6 to Hospital to ask how children were message came back Olga had passed away at 3 o'clock - Dr Grace went up to Hospital at once to make arrangements - then on to the school to see Superior.

8th The Rector said Mass. Dr Grace took Lillian to Hosp: to

November. see her baby before she was laid to rest. Nancy & Mary
also went to see their babies who were very ill - The
usual little funeral service was said in Chapel by
the girls at 11-45 - S^r Grace went to the Cemetery
with the little body which was laid to rest at 12-30.

& Olga did with violet's sickness & diarrhoea - S^r Henry
advised her being taken to Hospital at once - Katharine

9th Mr^s Wilkins said Mass. Katharine took Mary to
Hospital to see her baby who was pronounced in very
weak state. Other children in Hospital much the same

with notice about the Novena which began today
with intention for funds for Diocese - House of Mercy
D. S. G. & covered work. The Bishop gave an
address in the School Chapel on the subject. S^r S^r in
went - Mr^s Carter called -

10th A man called to ask if we would take in a boy
of 12 years old! Mr^s MacLachlan called to say

November - Goodbye before leaving for England - Miss Murray called to say washing - Mr Campbell called about washing. S. S. In. went up to Hospital to see babies Walter, Nora & Violet & found them no worse -

17th XXII. Sunday after Trinity - S. Stella Inand went to T. O'Clair Mass. It was pouring with rain so none of the girls could go to Mass. S. G. went at 8. It cleared sufficiently for S. Stella Inand to take six girls to Matins - Superior did not come clear probably owing to the rain - It was too wet for anybody to venture to Evensong -

12th Mr Pollock came about washing - Matron from the Military Hospital to ask about the Military Nurses - washing being done at the House of Mercy & Mr Richardson called & brought some baby clothes - Kaltharis went up to the Hospital to see the sick babies & found them much the same -

13th Mr Clairmonte said Mass. The Rector came at 10.30 & heard the Sisters' Confessions - S. Grace went out chopping & looked in at the School to see Superior - Mr Shilling called to see Khona joining

November.

- to engaging her as housemaid - A nurse from the Military Hospital called with Miss Duckworth the day for the babies - Margaret came -
- 14th Mr Chamberlain said Mass - Mr Wilkins came for his Confirmation Class at 5. & stayed to evening & gave an address - The report of the three babies in Hospital 'slightly better'
- 15th S-S Q. to Cathedral to Mass - S Grace went to Hospital to see the babies & father, all were better - Miss Starling called - Mr Jeffries called - Katherine went out shopping -
- 16th Mr Wilkins said Mass - Miss Fowler brought a dress she washed - Babies at Hospital slightly better - Margaret Selver brought a note to say that S-Hill was not to return tonight from Phoenicia - but to sleep at the school - Mr Peacey called at 8-45 p.m. for his washing! The Laundry was locked up so he could not have it -
- 17th Mr Collins called with money. S. H. returned. Mr Shilling called to see about engaging

Alone. settled to engage her.

18th:

XXIII Sunday after Trinity S.G. & S.S. in took girls to 7⁰⁰ mass. S.H. went to S.O.C.

S.S. in. took girls to Malini & Miss T. S.H. went up to the Hospital to fetch Agallia & her baby. The three babes were better. Margaret & Clara came down in the afternoon. B^g Superiori did not come down. Malini went with Louisa & Katharine to Eulucoug.

19th:

W. Rev^d Leed (parish), came to see S.H. Miss Murray brought a girl from Miss Gore-Brown's. Mary Selborn. who was in a condition to come in to the house as usual. The girl said she would come in the evening but never turned up. W^r. Adamson & W^r. Baker called. W^r. A. engaged Katharine as cook. Miss Reed brought some work from Malina Hospital.

- 20th The Rector said Mass. S.G. went up to cold storage to fetch some meat etc. (a weekly gift) just begun. In the aftⁿ S.G. went up to Alexander Hotel to see if she could find out anything about Mary Sellon. returned without her. went up again. but only got the girl to promise to come next day.
- 21st Mr. Clairmonte said Mass. S.H. went to see D^r. Sanders. Mr. Wilkins came to give Confirmation Class & said Eusemy gave address.
- 22nd Margaret Powers brought a note from D^r. Henry. S.H. went up to see D^r. Henry. S.S. Lu went up to Recreation at the Home.
- 23rd Mr. Wilkins said Mass. Mr. Thomas called. Mr. Marsh called to see as Miss Starling brought Miss Marais ^(Dale Pen: matron) to see the House. Matron left in the evening for Balconfontain for a holiday.

24th Rhona left at 8 o'clock to go to services with Mr. Shelling. S.S. Lu. went to the hospital with Cramp.

25th XXIV Sunday after Trinity. S.G. + S.S. Lu. went to 7 o'clock Mass with girls. S.H. went to 8 o'clock. S.S. Lu. + Miss T. took girls to Malvern. S. G. C. came to lunch + stopped the afternoon. Margaret, Clara + Rhona came down in the afternoon. No one went to Eolungary.

26th Mr. Adamson called. Mary Lewis an invalid came to ask about being taken in - but did not come. Mr. Jefferys called. S.H. went to the dentist then D? then looked in at the School. Telegram just arrived there to say Sister had arrived in Cape Town. S.G. went to meet Ellen Youngman + her baby.

27th Mr. Clairmonte said Mass. Thunder hail storm in the aftⁿ. Mr. Wilkins came to hear Sister's Confessions 5 o'clock.

28th Mr. Body said Mass. S.H. took Dora + Duncan with their mother to be baptized. Mr. Wilkins
