The manager of Lewis (one of them) a Mr. Williams kindly came back with Mary in his car. He fixed up the stove very satisfactorily & it is a great joy. Elaine came to see Mary but as she was out she condescended to play with Sr. Rosemary & eat a few chocolates.

Aug 17 Mary shopped in West Bank - went to town in afternoon to get a new handle put onto the electric kettle. A hurricane blew all night, but the wind dropped during the day - also the temperature & it became very cold. Hot soup for supper & early bed.

Aug 18 Mass - Fr. Campbell took us to Kidd's Beach or left us on the sands while he visited in the Parish. He had a call while there to visit a dying woman 20 miles away, so he arranged with a Mr. Mark, whose husband had been the school master (Principal) at Keiskama Hoek for 25 years, to give us lunch as he could not call for us till after 2 pm. The Mark's were very pleasant.

cleaned & packed spasmodically - finished off odd ends - put down Rater for a mouse which foolishly ^{by} ~~it~~ showed itself - listened - in to a R.C. Evensong with a $\frac{1}{2}$ hour Sermon by a Passionist Father, & had the joy of hearing Benediction relayed from the Cathedral of Christ the King - T'burg - rather late going to bed in consequence -

Aug 21 Finished off everything - swept up - covered the beds! - watched the mailboat come in, well lighted up - Mr. v. d. Merwe kindly took (will take!) us to the Station at 9.30 am - a lovely sunny day but a rough wind & choppy sea -

Sept 24th Mother Beatrice Rose + S. Margaret Anthony arrived by car from St. Cuthberts at 4.30 pm opened the cottage - drank soup & butter and went to bed.

30th Rose at St. Sawcons. Went to the airport at 10 am as Mother had started to tell the time of her arrival! (2 planes) Mother P. arrived 11.45 instead

and we later went for a picnic to

7th Mass at St. Saviour's - We had
dinner at home and in the afternoon
S. Sgt. Anthony fetched two C.R. sisters
to tea. Nabel came to clean
floors etc.

8th Mass at 7:45 am. A grey windy
day. We went up to the light house

9th Mass at Notre P. & Notre B. R. Shopped had
lunch - Garlicks went by bus to the
aquarium and back later to collect
car from garage. Early supper & BED.

10th Kruger Day. We had lunch at home
Mass at and then went to Hickman's River. There
S. Peters were quite a number of people - even

Fr. Christie and Fr. Joan Augustine came
down to collect Green White from the
Sisters of S. Savio - and shopped in

town. Spent the night here - everything looking
very nice after painting - left. Young &
one did Market for washing by the hotel when
we'd be come - saw the Transvaal
Castle in dock - lovely day - left at
10-10 am.

April 28 St Hilda Kathleen St Gertrude Constance arrived
a good journey (2 in a compartment for 6!)
and in good time. Opened the house and
did some shopping. As Miss Cane had been
here for some weeks everything was
ready. Mr Clavidge brought us some soup.

April 29 Mass at Church 7.45. Fr Campbell told us
there would be no masses this week because
of Synod. After morning tea walked up
by lighthouse. In the afternoon we went
up on the bank above the road and
had a picnic tea. Lovely day.

April 30th No Mass - had breakfast about 8 am.
Did some chores and then went to
Shelly Beach - had picnic. Back in time

to welcome Sister Victoria Mary who arrived at about 2.45. S.H.K. & S.G.C. went to try & nip up ^{the} Grahamstown Sisters to find out about a Mass. After trying 3 Telephone kiosks in turn (Non European much the best! - no pages missing from the Directories). Eventually, called at the Rectory where Mrs Campbell found the number & allowed us to telephone. After we got back went down to shore to give S.V.M. a good look at the sea for the first time for over 8 years

May 1st

S. Philip & S. James. No Mass at S. Peter's S.V.M. rested and had breakfast in bed S.H.K. & S.G.C. had breakfast then went to S. Saviour's for the 9. am Service. We were surprised to find they were keeping S. Mark's Day. We had Morning Tea with the Sisters C.R. and then a lady who was visiting them took us to the Station where we got our reservations for the return journey. After waiting

over an hour for a bus to West Bank we returned home & had lunch. It rained most of the day so we rested in the afternoon & went for a walk after tea but only along the streets. There was heavy rain & thunder lightning after supper.

Then we had a very good tea of scotch pancakes with cream & jam. We went back to the town by bus and did some shopping. We found we had to wait over half an hour for a bus to West Bank.

May 3rd Invention of the Cross - went to Mass at S. Saviour's but they were keeping the Ferie. We waited hopefully for a bus which we eventually discovered did not exist so missed the 7.55. We decided to do some shopping and eventually arrived

back by 8.45 - feeling quite ready for breakfast. We had a late morning Tea and then set off for a picnic. We were given a lift to Shelly Beach. After our lunch S.H.K. & S.G.C. walked nearly to Leach's Bay but S.V.M. walked back home and got a short lift. S.H.K. & S.G.C. walked back against a strong wind and also got a lift home. S.H.K. made an Irish Stew for supper but it took a long time to cook so we had supper at 8.0'clock.

May 14th We rested and after breakfast S.H.K. & S.G.C. went to the shops then had prayer time at S. Peter's. S.V.M. was not feeling well - had caught a chill and retired to bed. S.H.K. & S.G.C. took a picnic lunch & walked as far as Nun's Cove (?) We enjoyed ourselves on the rocks watching the tide come in & also looking at little crabs which popped in and out of the sand. We stayed there till nearly 4 pm. Perfect day - not much wind.

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
