My dear Bulalie,

I left Cape Town in a rush, arriving here last night, As a result, I quite overlooked attending to something for Bob and I wonder whether I could ask you to do it. I put together a carton of books for Bob -- consisting largely of study books -- but left the carton at the RUSAS office in town. Could you perhaps uplift and deliver it to the Robben Island ferry at the docks?

The carton has Bob's name written on it and merely requires a piece of cord around it to bind it. The carton is lying next to the table in the office where I was working last week -- the MUSAS people will be able to find it easily. I also left on the table a batch of about eix other books which I meant to wrap up and deliver at the same time. If this could be done, it would be very nice although it is not essential.

Also, lying on the table where I was morking is a handwritten list of all the books in the box. I would be grateful if this could be sent to me as I want to send it on to Bob.

Sorry to inflict this on you, and I hope you will not mind.

I returned to the Mail this morning and the first letter I opened on my deak was from the Interior Department refusing my passport again. I suppose I should have expected this, but hope springs etrenal and I feel rather downcast about it.

It was nice to see you again.
