Friday May 19<sup>th</sup> St Dunstan Mass.

Very windy & wet - poured during Mass.

Sr. J.A. in Retreat - spent the morning in Church

Sr. D & Sr. Christina had a Glorious Time

with MORE WRESTLING with the Jip-Saw - and

went down to see The Residence Castle at her

birth - we all saw her later going out at 6p.

fully lit - beautiful - as she went past. Sr. J.A.

had trays for meals - all beautiful served.

Sr. J.A. made some toffee in the p.m. while the

other two were out

Saturday May 20 Vigil Very cold - No Mass

cloudy - until after 9 a.m. Sr. J.A. & Sr. D

went out to church for prayer - time & to

shop - and by 10.20 a.m. Sun out. quite

warm. - so when they returned - put together

picnic & all went off to the rocks just

before Shelley Beach - Read & wrote letters

Laughed a good deal - Came home about  
4p - getting cold - So J.A. fetched another  
bottle of milk - all had a cup of tea -  
Tip-saw claimed attention the result -  
together with difficulty of boiling eggs  
on a stove that might get hotter!  
High tea was 6.30p - So Christine  
to bed early - a little late! Found all  
night & stormy.

WHITSUNDAY May 21. Poring with rain -  
managed to keep off a little to of from. Mass  
Saw Fr Campbell about Mass on Thursday  
as we would not go on Friday, owing to So  
D's early start at 6.30am. He offered to take  
the train party at 9.45am in his car. A  
full cooperation. The Tip-saw took up most  
of the morning & part of the afternoon until  
FINISHES - 3 pieces missing. So G.A. wrote  
letter & the other letters. So J.A. used to fetch  
some milk as we do not want to run  
short of "Tallies" before Thursday - just as we

opened ~~to~~ door - So Dorothy: Av-5 - The Strangler  
arrived in her car with her sister - she brought w/.  
1/2 Bacon - 1/2 tea, 2 lbs Honey - 1 lb Juice Jan - some  
Spinach & pumpkin. She invited us all for tea  
on Tuesday, will collect us in her car & if fine  
take us for a drive - we had 1/2 the Spinach &  
the Bacon for High tea - Still pouring with rain  
& more than Pouring at times. Not cold but  
quite mild. So D. to bed early. - She had  
rinsed out two stained hand towels that had  
been soaking in Nonacid for a couple of days  
as they were very badly stained - from the  
damp in the linen cupboard - this was to  
save any black habits getting spotted with  
it!!!

Monday, May 22 A perfect day with clear blue  
sky - after all THAT RAIN. No MASS. S. J. A  
went to P.O. & collect mail-pier - eggs etc.  
& all went out to Shelley Beach at 10 a. - about  
12.30 it began to "sand-storm" and cloud -  
2 pm SAND UNBEARABLE and Big clouds so

we came home - to find the Postman had been leaving letters for all three. Had a cup of tea & then the S.A. & S.D. met off the library - the D. brought some news on the way back for S.E.'s by request - began to rain - Telegram came about 5:30 from Rev: Mother Princes interest in cable votes home for councillor. Had the rest of the speech for Miss Lee. S.A. to bed early. S.D. produced sketches of "incidents" during an stay of E.D.!!!

Tuesday, May 23 Mail at 7:30. Not a nice day at regard weather - soon began to rain. S.A. met to the P.O. to send votes by cable to Warsaw. collected Sanyal & Smed Pot: had prayer-time in Church. S. Chi. & S.D. dealt with the dinner S.A. cleaned silver. Mrs Standee - S.D.'s Aunt came & fetched us in her car to tea with her - Mr Shaw brought us back at 5:45pm. S. Chi. to bed early - terrific rain this afternoon - avalanching down the road.

Wednesday, May 24 R. J.A. & I went to the G. an  
mass but not to communicate on the way  
back R. J.A. collected fish when I went - I  
to phone re taxi for Friday. A sunny day, but  
? going to be unsettled - some clouds "tossed"  
as to whether Marina Glen which would shelter us  
in case of rain & give us a dry seat - or only  
a walk to Pelley Beach - the sand would be  
wet - Heads for Marina Glen - just got the picnic  
packed when the 'bus came - just got the Acqua  
'bus - as our driver hooted to the other driver  
to wait for us - found 5 "to 5" of young boys  
in their being drilled !!! found a seal  
sway, not a soul about - later moved to a  
little sheltered nook & got roasted by the sun -  
moved again! then just after 2p - having written  
letters & read - went had a pot of tea 2 1/2  
cups each & an ice - I & I walked into  
town to shop of O.K. R. J.A. & B. Ch. to  
Acqua 'bus stop & saw seal & penguin!!  
all met at Coliseum 'bus stop - home just.

after Sp. very hungry!! Tidied art  
now empty time & prepared for Nabel coming  
in the a.m! So D to bed early.

Thursday, May 25 - To mall at 7.30. Nabel  
came to clean traps - So J.A collected journey  
food on way from Church - All had a cup of  
tea at 11.45 & then just after 12. So D & R Chi:  
Set out with food for Shelley Beach - So J.A  
following after when Nabel had finished & closed  
house about 12.40 - Nabel had some bits &  
lots of food & a pumpkin. So J.A got a lift to  
last bit - A perfect day as regards weather.  
Got a lift home at 4pm. & just past Kettle &  
when So D's Aunt (Mrs Sturdee) & her Niece  
arrived - we all had a cup of tea. Mrs S  
brought a packet of oranges for us & a box  
of peppermint creams each from the Colonel.  
They went about 5pm. & then So J.A & So D went  
off to the lecture, I took a doz oranges  
& So J.A to collect milk & So D to library,  
R Chi cooked Baked eggs - Fridge de-

frid - (in the a.m. R D swept the ch: - So Ch:  
polished bed-side table & sideboard -) After this I see  
washing up - R S.A did up the accounts -  
& took "remain" of food plus I arranged to  
buy food for, & laundry money - got food ready  
& finished off cupboards - To bed from 8.50 p.  
onwards. A very lovely rest. Deo Gratias

FRIDAY May. 26 C.I.A. to Mass at 7.30.

So Dorothy 'got-off' at 6.40 am in a nice taxi  
So P.A. & Ch: had a good breakfast - swept  
the living room - and Fr Campbell collected  
them at 9.45 am. \* FATHERS TO TALK UP.  
Mrs Goofrey's father kindly took us in his car.

June 1961.

4<sup>th</sup>. Mrs Wallis & S. Muriel Grace motored down  
from St Cuthbert's. left 1.30 & arrived 6 pm.  
Picnic Supper. Then went to Evesong.  
Straight back to bathe & bed.

5<sup>th</sup>. Early cup of tea at 6 <sup>AM</sup> ~~PM~~ - then at  
7.15 am off to the Docks to meet Sr  
Christina arriving on Carnarvon Castle

with 3 Trunks 2 suitcases some cartons  
& a Ship's Bell for an Oblation Church  
at St. Catharines. We hope for some  
breakfast on board to strengthen us  
for coping with customs & all the luggage!

Aug<sup>th</sup> 5. 1961 5:30 pm - heavy Pilkington & Sr. Rosemary  
came for their Rest - Train very late - Rain &  
bitter wind - Went very early to bed -

Aug 6 - The Transfiguration - Trinity x. Mass 7:45 am -  
Very full Church - Cold & wet - Fr. Campbell  
sent us home in somebody's Car -

Aug 7 - Feast of the Holy Name - No Mass - Went to the  
Library in the afternoon - they had a new sys-  
-tem of tickets but allowed us to take 2 books  
on the old tickets - New tickets to be issued  
on Friday - Mr. Campbell had a baby boy - Jonathan

Aug 8<sup>th</sup> - Mass - only we two - After Breakfast we went  
to Town to Enquire about a new Electric Stove -  
Wrote to mother re Stove - lovely day -

Aug 9<sup>th</sup> - Mass 9 am - Went to Shelly Beach - Had a drift

for part of both ways - Beautiful day & warm -  
returned at 4 pm - Tea - Supper & Early bed -  
At about 7.15. a knock at the front door - We  
opened it carefully after calling out to know  
who was there - A Woman fairly well Educated  
& nicely dressed - but very well up in the Scrip-  
-tures - who warned us that - the Day of Judgement  
was near! - She told us (all standing at the front  
door) that - calling ourselves Christians did  
not make us so - She said if you put a  
label on a Cat - calling it a Dog it did not  
make it one - I asked her if she was a Ben  
Israelite, & she said, "no a Jehovah's Witness -  
She was pleasant - spoken & much in earnest  
but as she said she had a big area to visit  
we gently closed the door & said she must  
not spend any more time with us -

Aug 10<sup>th</sup> A quiet day after the fatigue of our day on  
Shelly Beach -

Aug<sup>PM</sup> 11<sup>th</sup> Mass - Mary went to Town - did good shopping -  
Eclipse (partial) of the Sun 12 to 3 pm - Fine but cold  
Wind -
