In raply to your letter of the 24th September, I wise to submit the following information:-

1. At Conference of the A.N.C. Touth league delegates have in the part gone as ordinary members of the Congress, is which case they have had the same voting rights as any other center of the A.N.C. Touth League branches were in localities where there was a Branch of Congress.
