GIVE OUR MEN A CHOICE

We, as women of South Africa, condemn the call-up.

For women around the country - mothers, wives, partners, sisters, friends - the call-up highlights the moral dilemmas of men who face conscription into the SADF. We deplore the effects of conscription on the personal and professional lives of thousands of men and their families.

We feel that it is inexcusable to send teenagers just out of school into areas of conflict in the townships and occupied Namibia.

We are deeply aware of the traumatic effect military service has on men for whom the choice of alternatives is severely limited.

Our families suffer as we watch our men who object to taking up arms be sentenced to six years in prison or go into exile or face the insecurity of constantly having to avoid the military police. Religious objectors are punished by a mandatory period of so-called community service. In reality, this means six years of clerical work in State departments with little opportunity of making a meaningful contribution to the community.

These are terrible choices and we think there must be better alternatives. We call for alternatives to military service which would enable men to serve South Africa in constructive ways such as: true community service in religious and welfare organisations for the same length of time as national service.

We particularly share the anguish of mothers whose sons face this dilemma. We call on all families and friends of conscripts who share our concerns at the emotional and psychological effects of the call-up to join us in our call for alternative service.
