Mass 7.15. Requiem for General Smuts. the day of his Military Funeral in Pretoria. The whole day taken up with this! In the morning all who wished to do so listened in to the funeral service from the Dutch Reformed Church in Pretoria; most moving; + after it the commentators describing the procession in the streets to the station. At 12 o'clock all had a prime dinner in order to get down to Irene Station to pay our last respects to the dear General. The carriage containing the coffin drew up + waited quite 20. mins for the carriage containing the mourners to be hooked on. The station was packed with both Africans + Europeans + both flat forms. Lively flowers were placed all along the edge of the platforms. All returned + the Sisters then went to Fr. Symonds C.R. for their Confessions! At 3.15 p.m. tea + Mother, The Assistant, Sister Hilda Ventry, Sister Charity, Miss Hague + M^m Burke drove into Pretoria for the Memorial Service at the Cathedral

in Pretoria at 4-45 p.m. Eileen Kornac drove Fr. Symonds over or both went down to the station. Miss Snell arrived to stay.

Saturday. 16th. Octave.

Mass 7-15. A windy & cool day. S.T.O. World in Retreat. The new piano arrived; a very nice one. As the girls requested a service in memory of General Smuts, the Chaplain gave them this instead of Evening & he gave a short address about the General. The service was followed by Devotions.

Sung Mass 7 a.m. Everything as usual. Evening + Sermon 6-10 p.m.

Mass 7-15. A very warm day; wind got up in the afternoon blowing up clouds. In the morning the Assistant went into Johannesburg to get cold water. Miss Snell left after breakfast. Film in the evening supper at 6 p.m.

No Mass. Cooler, a shower of rain in the evening. Film in the evening the finishing of the "Boards of Wimpole Street." Supper 6 p.m.

Mass 7-15. At 10-15 Mother went into Pretoria for shopping. David also went in to collect all the food for the picnic. Sister Mildred of the Cross & Sister Theodore of the Cross arrived from "Tune" to keep their long Retreat.

Thursday. Octave Day. St. Matthew. 21st.

Mass 7-15. A fine warm day and the picnic took place, starting off at 11 a.m. as usual. Terce + Sext 9-10. Morning Tea 10-15. Nine after Morning Tea. After the picnic dinner black clouds came up & thunder started, as it grew worse we all packed up at 1-30 p.m. & returned & got back just in time as heavy rain fell &

the storm became worse. The girls went into the Recreation Room for the afternoon + danced; + had tea there. The next thing, there were no lights!! the storm had done damage in Pretoria! Vespers was at 5 p.m. instead of 5-15 p.m. as we were all in the house. The evening dance took place in the Recreation Room in candle light!! very pretty + all seemed to enjoy it. The Holy Rosed Sisters were in Retreat.

Mass 2-15. The Assistant in Retreat also the Holy Rosed Sisters. Sister O'Frances went in in the Van with S^r. H. Verity to see D^r. Casewell about her nose; penicillin injection prescribed. At 3 p.m. Mother drove into the School; for a special Meeting about the Chapel building. Sister Irene + S^r. M. Bride returned with Mother, the latter for Retreat + S^r. Irene to greet S^r. V. Faith. Eileen Kermac came for Retreat.

Saturday, 23rd Mass 2-15. The Holy Rosed Sisters in Retreat, also S^r. M. Bride. After Terce which was after breakfast Mother + S^r. Irene went to the station to meet S^r. Veronica Faith who arrived from England. At 8 a.m. S^r. O'F. went into Pretoria in the Van to have an injection for her nose. M^r. Burke went to Pretoria for the night for the Old girls association Meeting at Hillcrest. Evening + Devotions 6-30.

the Priests' new garden.

in the car for her penicillin treatment &
brought back Fr. Symonds for confessions & address.
He went to dinner at the John Van der Byls.
The Holy Hour, during which a storm got up
with terrific wind; & a howling warm wind
had blown all day. Sister Janet + Sister Hilda
Kathleen came for retreat in the evening.

nicely about the Homes + C.S.M.V.
