MINUTES OF THE 28TH SESSION OF THE PROVINCIAL SYNOD OF THE CHURCH OF THE PROVINCE OF SOUTHERN AFRICA, HELD AT THE CHRISTIAN BROTHERS' COLLEGE, KIMBERLEY, SOUTH AFRICA FROM 22 - 30 SEPTEMBER 1995.

FRIDAY 22 SEPTEMBER 1995:

- Synod assembled for a celebration of the Holy Eucharist at the Cathedral Church of St Cyprian the Martyr at 18h00.
 - 1.1. After the Gospel the President, the Most Revd D M Tutu delivered his charge. Synod received the charge with acclaim.
 - 1.2. After the Creed, the Provincial Registrar, having declared that a quorum was present, the President declared the 28th Session of Provincial Synod to be duly constituted.
 - 1.3. Preliminary Business: (2nd Agenda Book)

1.3.1. Election of Synod Secretaries (Standing Rule 11)

MEASURE TO AMEND CANON 4 (Of The Election Of Bishops)

THE PRINCIPLES

Whereas:

- A. It has been found necessary to review the present method of electing Bishops as set out in the Constitution and Canons of the CPSA, taking into account that:
 - A.1 God calls his people to various ministries and that he guides His church in the selection of suitable candidates for such ministries;
 - A.2 the election of a bishop is not simply to a ministry of the local church but of the whole church of God. This necessitates a partnership between a diocese and the Province in discerning God's will in the election of a bishop;
 - A.3 in order to engage the people of God prayerfully and responsibly in such elections, there should be openness and transparency;

A.4 it is necessary to handle with care and loving support all the candidates who have allowed their names to go forward for consideration by an Elective Assembly.

THE PROPOSALS

Be it Enacted:

DEFINITIONS

- 1.1 The term "vacancy" or "vacant diocese" shall refer to a diocese where a bishop has died, or retired, or where a bishop's irrevocable notice of resignation has been accepted in terms of Canon 14, "of Resignation of Diocesan Bishops", or of Canon 10 section 16 (a) dealing with resignation of Bishops-Suffragan, or where a new diocese has been established;
- 1.2 A Vicar General shall mean a Dean, or Senior Priest, or a person so designated as such by the Metropolitan;

VACANCIES

- 2.1 On the death of any Diocesan Bishop, the Dean or Senior Priest shall at once notify the vacancy in writing to the Metropolitan.
- In the event of the resignation of a Diocesan Bishop, when such resignation has been duly accepted, or his translation, compulsory retirement, or deprivation, the Metropolitan shall at once notify the Dean or Senior Priest in writing.
- 2.3 In the case of a vacancy in the office of a Bishop Suffragan, the provisions of Canon 10 section 4 shall apply.

PERSONS ELIGIBLE FOR ELECTION

A Bishop of this Province may be elected from this Church or from any Church in full communion with the Church of this Province.

METHOD OF ELECTION

- 4.1 In a diocese of this Province where there are more than ten licensed priests, a Bishop shall be elected by an Elective Assembly;
- 4.2 In a diocese of this Province where there are less than ten licensed priests, a Bishop shall be elected by the Bishops of the Province.

5. ELECTION OF THE METROPOLITAN

In the election of the Metropolitan, the provisions of Canon 5 shall apply, and, where relevant, supersede those of this Canon.

6. ELECTION OF BISHOPS SUFFRAGAN

In the election of Bishops Suffragan, the provisions of Canon 10 shall apply, and, where relevant, supersede those of this Canon.

ELECTIVE ASSEMBLY

7.1 Membership

- 7.1.1 The Metropolitan or his deputy who shall be President. Should the Metropolitan or his deputy be unable to preside at the Assembly, a senior cleric present by virtue of Section 8.1.1 shall preside.
- 7.1.2 Members elected by Provincial Synod to the Advisory Committee in terms of section 8.1.1.1 with a right to speak but not to vote.
- 7.1.3 All Bishops Suffragan commissioned in the vacant Diocese, and all Assistant Bishops licensed therein.
- 7.1.4 All Clergy licensed in the vacant Diocese other than retired Clergy who are not licensed to a Pastoral Charge.
- 7.1.5 Lay Representatives, who are confirmed communicants and who are ordinarily resident in the vacant Diocese and who are elected in such manner and according to such Rules as are provided for the election of Lay Representatives to Diocesan Synod of such Diocese.
- 7.1.6 Lay Persons elected by the Synod of the Diocese to serve on the Advisory Committee.

7.2 Summoning of Elective Assembly

Upon receiving or giving notice of the vacancy of a see:-

- 7.2.1 The Metropolitan shall issue a mandate to the Vicar-General of the vacant diocese to summon the Elective Assembly to meet at such a place as the Vicar-General may decide;
- 7.2.2 The Metropolitan shall instruct the Provincial Executive Officer, in consultation with the Provincial Registrar or his Deputy to oversee the process of the Election of a Bishop;
- 7.2.3 The Vicar-General, in consultation with the Metropolitan and the Chairperson of the Advisory Committee shall determine the date on which the Elective Assembly shall meet. It shall not be less than ten weeks nor more than four months from the date of the mandate;
- 7.2.4 Within eight days after receipt of the mandate from the Metropolitan, the Vicar-General shall:-
 - 7.2.4.1 Summon the members of the Elective Assembly in accordance with the provisions of section 7.2.1 of this Canon;
 - 7.2.4.2 Notify the Chairperson of the Advisory Committee;
 - 7.2.4.3 Cause a profile of the Diocese to be prepared for presentation at the first meeting of the Advisory Committee.

8. ADVISORY COMMITTEE

8.1 Membership

8.1.1 Provincial Members

- 8.1.1.1 (a) At each ordinary session of the Provincial Synod shall be elected by their respective orders seven bishops, seven priests, and seven lay persons of this Province who have been Confirmed. They shall constitute a panel from which shall be chosen, one bishop, one priest and one lay person to serve in the event of the vacancy of a See, other than the Metropolitan See, as additional members of the Advisory Committee.
 - (b) In the case of the Election of the Metropolitan, there shall be two bishops, two priests and two lay persons to serve as additional members of the Advisory Committee.
 - (c) The members of the panel shall remain as such until the next ordinary Session of the Provincial Synod, when they shall retire but shall be eligible for re-election.
- 8.1.1.2 Priests licensed and Lay persons ordinarily resident in the vacant Diocese shall be excluded from membership of the Advisory Committe elected in terms of this section.

8.1.2 Diocesan Members

- 8.1.2.1 At each session of every Diocesan Synod, the following shall be elected to serve as members of the Advisory Committee of the Diocese, and to hold office until the next session of Diocesan Synod, when they shall retire, but shall be eligible for re-election;
 - 8.1.2.1.1 A lay Chairperson with an alternate, by all houses sitting as one together;
 - 8.1.2.1.2 Three Priests licensed in the Diocese with alternates, elected by the House of Clergy;
 - 8.1.2.1.3 Three Lay Persons ordinarily resident in the Diocese, being confirmed communicants of this Province with alternates elected by the House of Laity;
- 8.1.2.2 The Vicar-General who shall be an ex officio member of the Advisory Committee;
- 8.1.2.3 In the event of the lay Chairperson of the Advisory Committee being unable to act prior to the first meeting of the Advisory Committee, the alternate lay Chairperson shall act as Chairperson. In the event of the Chairperson being unable to act during or after the first meeting, the Advisory Committee may either call on the alternte lay Chairperson to act as Chairperson or may elect a Chairperson from among its lay members.

8.2 Summoning of the Advisory Committee

- 8.2.1 The Metropolitan shall himself, or through the Provincial Executive Officer, as he may decide, notify all eligible members of the panel elected in terms of section 8.1.1.1 of this Canon when the Elective Assembly will meet. He shall request them to inform him within ten (10) days whether or not they will be available to serve on the Advisory Committee if called upon to do so by the Chairperson of the Advisory Committee of the vacant Diocese.
- 8.2.2 On receipt of this information the Metropolitan or the Provincial Executive Officer, as the case may be, shall inform the Chairperson of the Advisory Committee of the names of the members of the panel chosen by him who should be called upon to serve on the Advisory Committee in addition to those members of the Diocese elected in terms of section 8.1.2 of this Canon.

8.3 Functions of the Advisory Committee

- 8.3.1 The Chairperson, upon receiving notification from the Vicar-General in terms of Section 7.2.4.2, shall:
 - 8.3.1.1 Write to every pastoral charge of the vacant Diocese inviting clergy or confirmed communicants of the vacant diocese to submit names of candidates, within thirty (30) days, to fill the vacancy.
 - 8.3.1.2 Instruct the Proposers to provide in writing;
 - 8.3.1.2.1 the consent of the Candidate:
 - 8.3.1.2.2 names of two other persons who support the nomination;
 - 8.3.1.2.3 motivation for the nomination of the candidate.
 - 8.3.1.3 Summon the Advisory Committee, consisting of both Diocesan and Provincial representatives, to meet within ten (10) days after the deadline for the submission of nominations.
 - 8.3.1.4 report on the names submitted at the first meeting of the Advisory Committee.
 - 8.3.1.5 write to all candidates asking for:
 - a Personal Profile, stating among other things why a candidate should be considered for Election,
 - a Curriculam Vitae
 - a Medical Certificate

Referees

- 8.3.1.6 Invite any member of the Advisory Committee to submit one or more names in writing either before or at the first meeting of the Advisory Committee.
- 8.3.1.7 Ask any member of the Advisory Committee who has been nominated to recuse him/herself from attending meetings and shall invite his/her alternate to take his/her place.
- 8.3.2 At it's first meeting, the Advisory Committee shall:
 - 8.3.2.1 obtain confidential testimonials from independent referees as well as those suggested by candidates.
 - 8.3.2.2 inform the Metropolitan and the Diocese of names of the candidates.
- 8.3.3 At it's second meeting which shall take place the day before the Elective Assembly, the Advisory Committee shall:
 - 8.3.3.1 Prepare reports on all the candidates.
 - 8.3.3.2 Invite proposers to attend the meeting for a briefing.
 - 8.3.3.3 Submit a list of all candidates together with reports to the President of the Elective Assembly.

9. THE ELECTION OF A BISHOP

- 9.1 On the day appointed and on each succeeding day on which the Assembly meets, Holy Communion shall be celebrated before the Assembly proceeds to business.
- 9.2 The Registrar of the Diocese or a deputy appointed by the President shall be in attendance at the meeting.
- 9.3 The President shall cause the roll to be determined by the Diocesan Registrar or the Deputy Registrar. He shall call upon the Registrar or the Deputy Registrar to certify that only those persons eligible to attend are present and that no person eligible to attend has been excluded. Any informalities, and objections to the attendance of a member shall be considered and determined by the Assembly. The President shall then ask the Registrar to declare that a quorum is present; this done, the President shall constitute the Assembly.
- 9.4 A quorum shall be not less than one half of the total number of the Bishops and the Clergy together and one half of the Laity.
- 9.5 Once the Elective Assembly has been constituted its proceedings shall be deemed to be confidential.
- 9.6 The Assembly shall then proceed to elect one or more secretaries and two or more scrutineers from its members, and a Proctor who shall appear if necessary in the Court of Confirmation.
- 9.7 The Assembly shall determine its times of meeting.

- 9.8 The President shall address the Assembly setting out the purpose and procedures of the Assembly and may at any time address the Assembly.
- 9.9 The Elective Assembly may at any time delegate the choice of a Bishop to the Bishops of the Province, if it so determines by a two-thirds majority.
- 9.10 The President shall furnish the Assembly with a list of the names of all persons considered by the Advisory Committee, after which proposers so designated by the Advisory Committee, may nominate to the vacancy only from the list so furnished, except in so far as is allowed by section 9.22 of this Canon. Every nomination shall be seconded by any member of the Elective Assembly.
- 9.11 All candidates so nominated shall be excluded from the Assembly, but shall be at hand for any consultation that might be deemed necessary. They shall be entitled to vote and the provisions of section 9.16 shall not apply then in respect of such absence.
- 9.12 When nominations have ceased, each nominee shall be considered by the Assembly in alphabetical order.
- 9.13 As each nominee is considered, the President shall call upon a Provincial member of the Advisory Committee so designated to give the Committee's report on the nominee.
- 9.14 The President shall then invite
 - 9.14.1 members of the Assembly to ask for clarification of any point in the Advisory Committee's report, and
 - 9.14.2 the proposer and seconder of the nominee being considered to speak if they so wish and thereafter other members of the Assembly to speak on the nominee.
- 9.15 The President shall have control of the proceedings of the assembly and may interrupt a speaker should the speaker make statements of a derogatory or libellous nature and may call upon him/her to retract such statements and/or may terminate a speaker's address to the Assembly or otherwise make such rules or give such directions in regard to the conduct of the Assembly as seems appropriate to the President in his sole and absolute discretion.
- 9.16 No member who has been absent from the Session or Sessions of the Elective Assembly or any portion thereof during which the reports of the Advisory Committee were presented or when the nominees were discussed, shall be eligible to attend a subsequent Session of the Assembly except for good cause shown, in the discretion of the President.
- 9.17 When discussion has ceased, the members shall record their votes. The voting shall be by secret ballot and the President shall have a deliberative vote only. The members shall record their votes by writing on their voting paper either the name of the person for whom they vote or if they desire to vote for none of the candidates to write the word "none" or make a cross on the voting paper.
- 9.18 No person shall be deemed to be elected unless he/she shall have received not less than two-thirds of the total number of votes of the Bishops and Clergy present and

voting together, and two-thirds of the votes of the House of Laity, voting at the same time.

- 9.19 If after the first taking of the vote no person has received the necessary majority, successive votes shall be taken in like manner. After the result of any of the first four ballots is announced and no election has been made, the Assembly may on the proposal of any member, which is duly seconded, resolve by a simple majority to reopen discussion on the nominees.
- 9.20 If after five ballots no election has been made, the candidate with the least votes shall withdraw. This procedure shall be followed at each succeeding ballot up to the ninth ballot, or until a Bishop is elected at an earlier ballot.
- 9.21 If after nine ballots no election has been made, the Assembly shall adjourn for a period determined upon by a simple majority of members.
- 9.22 Upon the Assembly reconvening and unless a delegation is made under section 9.9 of this Canon, the President shall call for fresh nominations. All those whose names were furnished to the Assembly by the President in terms of section 9.10 of this Canon shall then be eligible for nomination. If the Elective Assembly so determine, it may consider names which have not previously been submitted to the Advisory Committee.
- 9.23 If within two consecutive days after the date fixed, in terms of section 7.2.3 of this Canon for the Assembly to meet for the main business of the election no election is made, or if a quorum cannot be found within such period, then the Advisory Committee shall meet and forward to the Metropolitan the names of at least two persons considered by the Committee to be suitable for appointment as Bishop. The Synod of Bishops of the Province shall then choose from the names so submitted a Bishop for the vacant See. If, within twenty eight (28) days, or such longer period as the Metropolitan may allow, none of those elected has accepted, or if no election is confirmed, the Elective Assembly shall be re-convened.
- 9.24 When an election is made, the declaration of such act shall be signed in duplicate by the President, and one of these declarations shall be transmitted to the Provincial Archives and the other kept in the Registry of the Diocese.
- 9.25 The failure of a member to attend the Elective Assembly shall not proclude the Assembly from proceeding to election so long as a quorum is present.
- 9.26 When a nominee shall have received the requisite majority, but refuses to accept office, shall continue.
- 9.27 If the election is not confirmed in accordance with provisions of Canon 7 "Of Confirmation of Bishops", a fresh Elective Assembly shall be convened.

PROCEDURE NOT PROVIDED FOR

In all matters not specifically provided for in this Canon the procedure to be followed shall be determined by the Model Rules for an Elective Assembly made from time to time by the Provincial Synod, and by the Acts of the Diocese; failing these, by the President, subject to any direction which may be given by the Assembly; but no direction by the Assembly shall invalidate any action previously taken upon a ruling given by the President.

THE PRINCIPLES

- A. In order to ensure effective episcopal oversight in the larger dioceses of this Province, it has been necessary to allocate specific geographical regions in those dioceses to Bishops Suffragan;
- B. the September 1994 meeting of Provincial Standing Committee authorised the Commission on the Election of Bishops to prepare Legislation governing the respective Roles of Diocesan, Regional and Bishops Suffragan.

THE PROPOSALS

Be it Enacted:

1. The following clauses be inserted after clause 4 of article XXIV of Constitution and Canons with consequential re-numbering of existing clauses.

5 BISHOP SUFFRAGAN

By Bishop Suffragan is meant a bishop, duly elected, consecrated and licensed as provided for in the Constitution and Canons of the CPSA whose ministry is exercised within a specific diocese at the direction of the Bishop of the Diocese in accordance with the provision of the Commission approved by the Synod of Bishops in accordance with the provisions of the Canons.

6 REGIONAL OR AREA BISHOP

By Regional or Area bishops is meant a Bishop Suffragan, duly elected, consecrated and licensed as provided for in the Constitution and Canons of the CPSA with specific episcopal responsibility for a designated geographical region or area within a diocese of the CPSA under the authority of the Bishop of the Diocese, whose Commission has been approved by the Synod of Bishops in accordance with the provisions of the Canons.

7 ASSISTANT BISHOP

By Assistant Bishop is meant a Bishop holding special Letters of Appointment issued by the Bishop of the Diocese.

8 MISSIONARY BISHOP

By Missionary Bishop is meant a Bishop duly elected, consecrated and licensed as provided for in the Constitution and Canons of the CPSA for ministry in a specific geographical area either within or beyond the present borders of the CPSA."

- 2. The following changes be made to Canon 10:
 - 1. The heading be amended to read:
 - "Of Bishops Suffragan, Regional bishops and Assistant Bishops".
 - The existing section 9 be numbered (a) and a new sub-section be added as follows:
 - "(b) A Bishop Suffragan holding a Commission Regional With episcopal responsibility for a designated geographical region or area within a Diocese under the authority of the Diocesan Bishop shall be known a Regional Bishop. However, as a Bishop Suffragan he or she shall have all the right and obligations of a Bishop Suffragan in terms of this and the other Canons, and any withdrawal or alteration of the Commission shall be effected in accordance with the provisions of sub-section (a) of this section."
 - 3. In section 18 the word "retired" shall be deleted before the word "bishop" in the second line.
 - 9.1. Debate was entered into.
 - 9.2. The Bishop of St Helena proposed the words "and Canon 10" be included in the title of the measure. The movers of the Measure agreed to this amendment.

- (i) The definition of a "Dependant" be deleted and replaced with the definition contained in section 1 of the Pension Funds Act No 24 of 1956 (as amended).
- (ii) The Definition of "Normal Retirement Age" be moved to its logical position in the alphabetical order after the definition of "Member".
- (iii) A definition be inserted for "Commencement Date" listed in alphabetical order immediately after "Cleric in Suspense" and reading as follows:

 "Commencement Date" shall mean the first day of January 1967."
- 28.1.1. No debate was entered into.
- 28.1.2. The Principles of Agendum 26.1 were put and carried.
- 28.1.3. Agendum 26.1 was referred to Committee of Synod for Monday night's business.

28.2. RETIREMENT AGE OF BISHOPS

THE PRINCIPLES

Whereas:

- A. The Board has considered the implications of a reduction in the normal retirement age of bishops and agrees that a reduction in the retiring age, by 1 year, from 65 to 64 (without loss of benefits) is acceptable in principle.
- B. The Pension Fund Actuary has certified that "while the relative change for the bishops would be significant, the change for the Fund as a whole would be slight."

THE PROPOSAL

Be it enacted that:

CANON 46 (SECTION 3) be amended so that the definition of "normal retirement age" in paragraph (b) thereof shall read as follows:

- "(b) In the case of a Bishop of the Province, sixty four years."
- 28.2.1. Debate was entered into.
- 28.2.2. The Principle of Agendum 26.2 was put and carried.

28.2.3. Agendum 28.2 was referred to the Committee of Synod for Monday night's business.

28.3. INVESTMENT POLICY

THE PRINCIPLES

Whereas:

- A. The Trustees of the Fund are the Provincial Trusts Board whose powers of investment are defined in Canon 42(8).
- B. It is desirable that there should be no conflict between the aforesaid powers and the powers currently defined in Canon 46(8).

THE PROPOSALS

Be it enacted that:

CANON 46 (SECTION (8)) be amended as follows:

- (i) By the deletion of all the words following the word "Fund" at the end of line 2 and preceding the words "All assets" in line 15 of the Section.
- (ii) By the insertion, in substitution for the deleted words, the words:
 "The investment powers of the Provincial Trusts Board shall be those defined in Canon 42 (8) of these Canons and Constitution".
- 28.3.1. No debate was entered into.
- 28.3.2. The principles of Agendum 26.3. were put and carried.
- 28.3.3. Agendum 26.3. and all subsequent Principles of this Agenda, if passed by Synod, were referred to the Committee of Synod.

28.4. ANNUAL REPORT

THE PRINCIPLES

Whereas:

- A. The Board considers that the requirement that an annual report "be sent to all members of the Fund and other interested parties" is not only extremely expensive but also of little realistic value to most members.
- B. The only requirements stipulated in the Pension Funds Act are (in terms of Section 16(1)) that a copy of the actuarial report be sent to all <u>employers</u> participating in the Fund and (in terms of Section 35) that certain documents must be available at the registered office for inspection by members.

THE PROPOSAL

BE IT ENACTED THAT:

Canon 46 (Section 11) be amended to read as follows:

"The Board shall report annually to Provincial Synod or Provincial Standing Committee on the actuarial valuation of the Fund as at the close of the preceding financial year and this report, together with the audited financial statements in respect of the previous financial year, shall be sent to all Dioceses."

- 28.4.1. Debate was entered into.
- 28.4.2. The Principles of Agendum 26.3 were put and carried with one dissenting voice.

28.5. SAFE CUSTODY OF SECURITIES

THE PRINCIPLES

Whereas:

- A. In practice the securities relating to most of the investments held by the Fund are kept in safe custody by the investment advisers appointed by the Provincial Trusts Board.
- B. The "Secretary" is in fact the Principal Officer of the Fund.

THE PROPOSAL

Be it enacted that:

CANON 46 (SECTION 14) be amended to read as follows:

- " The Principal Officer and/or the Investment Advisers appointed by the Provincial Trusts Board shall be responsible for the safe custody of all securities belonging to or held by the Fund."
- 28.5.1. No debate was entered into.
- 28.5.2. The Principles of Agendum 26. were put and carried.

28.6. MEMBERS OF THE FUND

THE PRINCIPLES

Whereas:

The Board accepts the opinion of the Actuary that the need for protection of benefits as implied in Section 17(a) no longer applies.

THE PROPOSAL

Be it enacted that:

CANON 46(SECTION 17(a)) be amended by the deletion of all the words following the word "Fund" in line 3.

- 28.6.1. Debate was entered into.
- 28.6.2. The Principles of Agendum 26.6, were put and carried.

28.7. ASSETS AND LIABILITIES OF THE EXISTING FUND, OLD FUND AND WIDOWS FUND

THE PRINCIPLES

Whereas:

The Board and the Actuary agree that retention in the rules of Sub-section 17(b) and Sub-section 25(m) is an anachronism.

THE PROPOSAL

Be it enacted that:

SUB-SECTIONS 17(b) and 25(m) of CANON 46 be deleted.

- 28.7.1. No Debate was entered into.
- 28.7.2. The Principles of Agendum 26.7 were put and carried.

28.8. PURCHASE OF PAST SERVICE BENEFITS

THE PRINCIPLES

Whereas:

- A. Canon 46 (17)(d) provides in part for the purchase of backservice by payment in instalments, which in essence means the granting of a loan.
- B. The Pension Funds Act No. 24 of 1956 (as amended) precludes loans to members for any purpose other than housing (per section 19(5) of the Act).

THE PROPOSAL

Be it enacted that:

CANON 46 (SECTION 17(d)) be amended by the deletion of all the words following the words and numeral "age of 48" at the beginning of line 14 of the section.

- 28.8.1. No debate was entered into.
- 28.8.2. The Principles of Agendum 26.8. were put and carried.

28.9. PAYMENT OF CONTRIBUTIONS

THE PRINCIPLES

Whereas:

- A. The Pension Funds Act No 24 of 1956 (as amended) Section 13A requires all contributions to the Fund to be paid "within a period of seven days after the expiration of the period in respect of which the contribution is being paid".
- B. The personal contributions of members are deducted from their monthly stipends and should therefore be paid to the Fund, in respect of each month, before the seventh day of the following month.
- C. The Board considers it to be desirable that diocesan contributions also be paid monthly.

THE PROPOSALS

Be it enacted that:

CANON 46 (SECTIONS 20 (d) (e) and (g)) be amended as follows:

- (i) The word "annual" in line 1 of Sub-section (d) be deleted.
- (ii) All the words following the word "Board" in line 3 and preceding the word "and" in line 4 of Sub section (d) be deleted and the following words be substituted therefor:
 - " in monthly instalments payable within seven days of the month following the month for which the contributions are due".
- (iii) The words contained in Sub-section (e) be deleted in their entirety and the following words be substituted therefore:
 - "In any case where the monthly contribution shall not have been fully paid within the period prescribed in Sub-section (d) above, the amount unpaid shall bear interest at a rate to be determined from time to time by the Board, from the last day of the month for which the contribution was due until the date of payment, and the amount of such interest shall be payable by the Diocese in addition to the annual contributions due in terms of Sub-sections (a) and (b) of this Section."
- (iv) The words following the word "Diocese" in line 3 and ending with the word and comma "later," in line 6 of Sub-section (g) be deleted.
- (v) Sub-section (g) be ended with a new paragraph reading as follows:

 "The proportionate annual contribution thus calculated shall be payable in monthly instalments subject to the same terms and conditions as set out in subsections (d) and (e) above."
- 28.9.1. Debate was entered into.
- 28.9.2. The Principles of Agendum 26.9 were put and carried.

28.10. PENSION BENEFITS UPON NORMAL RETIREMENT

THE PRINCIPLES

Whereas:

If the reduction in the retiring age of bishops from 65 to 64 years, without loss of benefits, is approved by Provincial Synod, the formula for calculation of pension benefits as contained in Section 22(a)(i)(2) of Canon 46 requires to be corrected.

THE PROPOSAL

Be it enacted that:

CANON 46 (SECTION 22(a)(i)(2)) be amended by the extension of the existing sentence with a comma and the words ", plus an additional four and two - sevenths per cent of the pensionable emolument in the year of retirement."

- 28.10.1. No debate was entered into.
- 28.10.2. The Principles of Agendum 28.10 were put and carried.

28.11. SURVIVORSHIP PENSION

THE PRINCIPLES

Whereas:

The Board deems it advisable to clarify that a survivorship pension ceases on the death of the surviving spouse.

THE PROPOSAL

Be it enacted that:

CANON 46 (SECTION 22(C)) be amended as follows:

The full stop at the end of the last sentence be deleted and the sentence be continued with the words "and payment shall cease on the death of the surviving spouse."

- 28.11.1. No Debate was entered into.
- 28.11.2. The Principles of Agendum 28.11. were put and carried.

28.12. DEATH BENEFITS

THE PRINCIPLES

Whereas:

The Board considers it essential that, in the matter of payment of death benefits, the rules of the Provincial Pension Fund should in no respect be in conflict with the Pension Funds Act.

THE PROPOSALS

Be it enacted that:

CANON 46 (SECTION 24) be amended as follows:

- (i) Section 24 be deleted in its entirety.
- (ii) The entire content of Section 37C of the Pension Funds Act No 24 of 1956 (as amended) be inserted as the new content of Section 24 of Canon 46; reading as set out in Annexure A hereto.

28.12.1.

Disposition of pension benefits upon death of member.-

- (a) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in any law or in the rules of a registered fund, any benefit payable by such a fund upon the death of a member, shall, subject to a pledge in accordance with section 19 (5) (b) (i) and subject to the provisions of section 37A (3) and 37D of the Pension Funds Act, No.24 of 1956 of the Statutes of the Republic of South Africa, not form part of the assets in the estate of such a member, but shall be dealt with in the following manner:
- (i) If the fund within twelve months of the death of the member becomes aware of or traces a dependant or dependants of the member, the benefit shall be paid to such dependant or, in such proportions as may be deemed equitable by the person managing the business of the fund, to such dependants.
- (ii) If the fund does not become aware of or cannot trace any dependant of the member within twelve months of the death of the member, and the member has designated in writing to the fund a nominee who is not a dependant of the member, to receive the benefit or such portion of the benefit as is specified by the member in writing to the fund, the benefit or such portion of the benefit shall be paid to such nominee: Provided that where the aggregate amount of the debts in the estate of the member exceeds the aggregate amount of the assets of his estate, so much of the benefit as is equal to the difference between such aggregate amount of debts and such aggregate amount of assets shall be paid into the estate and the balance of such benefit or the balance of such portion of the benefit as specified by the member in writing to the fund shall be paid to the nominee.
- (iii) If a member has a dependant and the member has also designated in writing to the fund a nominee to receive benefit or such portion of the benefit as is specified by the member in writing to the fund, the fund shall within twelve months of the death of such member pay the benefit or such portion thereof to such dependent or nominee in such proportions as the person managing the business of the fund may deem equitable: Provided that this paragraph shall only apply to the designation of a nominee after the coming into operation of this paragraph.
- (iv) If the fund does not become aware of or cannot trace any dependant of the member within twelve months of the death of the member and if the member has not designated a nominee or if the member has designated a nominee to receive a portion of the benefit in writing to the fund, the benefit or remaining portion of the benefit after payment to the designated nominee, shall be paid into the estate of the member or, if no inventory in respect of the member has been received by the Master of the Supreme Court in terms of section 9 of the Estates Act, 1965 (Act No.66 of 1965), into the Guardian's Fund.
- (v) For the purpose of this section, a payment by a registered fund to a trustee contemplated in the Trust Property Control Act, 1988 (Act No, 57 of 1988), for the benefit of a dependant or nominee contemplated in this section shall be deemed to be a payment to such a dependant or nominee.
- 28.12.2. No debate was entered into.
- 28.12.3. The Principles of Agendum 26.12 were put and carried.

28.13. DEFERMENT OF BENEFITS

THE PRINCIPLES

Whereas:

A. Bishops have the right to defer payment of pension benefits until age 70.

- B. Clergy have requested that they be allowed the same right which has distinct tax benefits.
- C. The Actuary finds no difficulty from the point of view of the Fund or its administration in implementing such a proposal.
- D. The rules of the Fund do not currently make reference to any such right of deferment.

THE PROPOSALS

Be it enacted that:

CANON 46 (SECTION 25(a)) be amended as follows:

- (i) The words "shall be obliged to" in line 2 of Sub-section (a) be deleted and replaced with the word "may."
- (ii) The words "provided that a Bishop of the Province may defer his or her own retirement" in lines 4 and 5 of Sub-section (a) be deleted and replaced with the words "but may, if he or she so desires, defer receipt of such benefit until age 70 at the latest."
- (iii) The final sentence of Sub-section (a) be deleted in its entirety and replaced by the following final sentence: "In the case of a member who so defers the receipt of his or her benefits, the pension and death benefits applicable at retirement as well as the pension and death benefits applicable during the period of deferment shall be determined by the Actuary; provided that the death benefit during the period of deferment shall not be less than the death benefit applicable immediately prior to his or her reaching normal retirement age."
- 28.13.1. No debate was entered into.
- 28.13.2. The Principles of Agendum 26.13 were put and carried.

28.14. EARLY RETIREMENT

THE PRINCIPLES

Whereas:

- A. It has become normal practice in the rules of most pension funds to allow voluntary retirement within 10 years of normal retirement age.
- B. The inclusion of such a provision would have no adverse financial effect upon the Fund.

THE PROPOSALS

Be it enacted that:

CANON 46 (SECTION 25(b)) be amended as follows:

- (i) The words "of not less than 60 years" in lines 2 and 3 be deleted.
- (ii) After the word "age" in line 2 the sentence be completed by insertion of the words "within 10 years of normal retirement age."

- 28.14.1. No debate was entered into.
- 28.14.2. The Principles of Agendum 26.14 were put and carried.

28.15. UNCLAIMED MONIES

THE PRINCIPLES

Whereas:

- A. In legal terms a debit unclaimed for more than 3 years becomes prescribed.
- B. To avoid complications of administration it is not current practice to allow periods as long as 20 years during which unclaimed monies must be held in reserve.

THE PROPOSAL

Be it enacted that:

CANON 46 (SECTION 25(j)) be amended as follows:

The word "twenty" in line 1 be deleted and the word "five' be substituted therefor.

- 28.15.1. No debate was entered into.
- 28.15.2. The Principles of Agendum 26.15 were put and carried.

28.16. BENEFITS NOT SUBJECT TO HYPOTHECATION

THE PRINCIPLES

Whereas:

It is permissible in terms of the Pension Funds Act for a loan to a member of the Fund to be secured by a pledge of the benefits to which the member is entitled.

THE PROPOSALS

Be it enacted that:

CANON 46 (SECTION 27(e)) be amended by:

- (i) Beginning the Sub-section with the words "Save for the purpose of providing security for a loan from the Fund,"
- (ii) Continuing with the existing words "no member" (et al to the end of the Subsection).
- 28.16.1. No debate was entered into.
- 28.16.2. The Principles of Agendum 26.16. were put and carried.

28.17. THE RULES AS BYE - LAWS

THE PRINCIPLES

Whereas:

- A. The Board considers that the changing circumstances in which the Church and the clergy have to work are likely to require more flexibility in the ability to change the rules under which the Pension Fund operates, both to ensure that conflicts do not arise with amendments to the Pension Funds Act and to provide for more regular review of benefits available to members.
- B. Amendments to the rules as set out in Canon 46 can only be made by Provincial Synod at three year intervals.

THE PROPOSALS

Be it enacted that:

CANON 46 be amended as follows:

- (i) Deletion of all the Sections and Sub-sections following the existing Section 2.
- (ii) The inclusion of a new Section 3 reading as follows: "The rules governing the administration of the Fund shall be those contained in the "Bye-Laws of the Church of the Province of Southern Africa: Provincial Pension Fund."
- (iii) All the existing Sections and Sub-sections of Canon 46 from Section 3 to Section 37 thereof (as amended by this Provincial Synod) become the bye-laws referred to in paragraph (ii) above and hence the rules under which the Fund will in future be administered save that:
 - (a) Wherever reference is made to "this Canon" it shall be changed to "these Bye-Laws."
 - (b) Section 34 be deleted as no longer of effect and all the subsequent sections be renumbered.
 - (c) The references to "Provincial Synod" and "Sessions of Synod" contained in existing Sections 5 and 35, 36 and 37 (the latter three being renumbered 34 to 36 in terms of paragraph (b) above) shall be changed to "Provincial Standing Committee" or "meeting of the Committee" as shall be appropriate.
- 28.17.1. No debate was entered into.
- 28.17.2. The Principles of Agendum 26.17 were put and carried.

- B. It is sometimes desirable that they be allowed to live in their own homes while serving in the parish which is not where their home is located;
- C. Canon 26 does not allow for this flexibility.

- 1. It is usual for the clergy to live within the parish boundaries, in a house provided by the parish.

ROAD SAFETY

Whereas the road accident rate, which results in the death and maiming of thousands of people in Southern Africa, is unacceptably high (In 1994, there were 426,000 accidents reported, in which 8,900 people were killed);

and whereas sober and safe driving practices are necessary to reduce the carnage on our roads, and are a mark of responsible citizenship required by Christ;

This Synod

calls on and encourages the Governments of the Southern African countries represented by the CPSA (Lesotho, Mozambique, Namibia, South Africa and Swaziland) to implement a rigorous campaign of road safety with severe punishment for those who drive under the influence of alcohol, or who drive without valid drivers' licences, or where public utility vehicles are unroadworthy.

MEASURE REGARDING INVESTMENT IN OPTIONS AND FUTURES, BANKS AND BUILDING SOCIETIES (Canons 42 and 46)

THE PRINCIPLES

Whereas:

- A. The Provincial Trusts" Board has become aware that current investment strategies now involve instruments such as futures, options and other derivative investments;
- B. The Board considers that due caution should be exercised when considering an investment in such instruments, and that Diocesan Trustees should obtain the consent of the Provincial Trusts' Board first before making such investments, so as to ensure that the aggregate exposure of the CPSA over all its dioceses remain within prudent limits;

C. The amendment to Section 8(b)(iv) dealing with investments in Banks and Building Societies needs to be carried into Canon 46(8) as well as the amendments referred to in Preambles A and B, in order that the Pension Fund investments should be similarly capable of expansion;

THE PROPOSALS

Be it enacted as follows:

- 1. Add a new sub-clause (ii) to sub-section (b) of section 8 of Canon 42, with subsequent renumbering, to read as follows:
- (ii) in futures, options or other derivative investment instruments, but not in writing options, provided that the extent of such investments in relation to each portfolio are within the limits established from time to time by the Provincial Trusts Board".
- 2. Insert a new second proviso before the existing second proviso in line 5 of section 11(b) reading as follows:
- "....provided further that Diocesan Trustees obtain prior approval of the Provincial Trusts' Board to investing in futures, options and other derivative investment instruments referred to in section 8(b)(ii); and......"
- 3. Add a new sub-section (b) to section 8 of Canon 46, renumbering existing sub-section (b) as (c), to read as follows:
- "(b) in futures, options or other derivative investment instruments, but not in writing options, provided that the extent of such investments in relation to each portfolio are within the limits established from time to time by the Provincial Trusts Board".
- 4. Add a new sub-section (d) to section 8 of Canon 46, reading as follows:
- "(d) in Banks and Building Societies".
- 5. Delete the proviso in sub-section (a) of section 8 of Canon 46 and insert a new proviso immediately following sub-section (d) reading as follows:
- "No investment under sub-section (a) to (d) inclusive shall be made unless it shall be approved by the Investment Adviser to the Provincial Trusts' Board".

MEASURE REGARDING THE APPLICATION OF THE PROCEEDS OF THE DISPOSAL OF LAND(SCHEDULE A TO THE CONSTITUTION, SECTION 5)

THE PRINCIPLES

Whereas:

- A. Section 3 of Schedule A to the Constitution treats all property owned by the Church in exactly the same way regardless of the type or use of the property;
- B. Whilst in the past this rigid rule may have had the benefit of putting a brake on the implementation of schemes which later experience would have shown to have been illadvised, it is now proving too inflexible for the growth and development of the Church in a rapidly changing world;
- C. It is therefore necessary to re-work the provisions of sections 5 to create the possibility of greater flexibility, while at the same time establishing a process to try to ensure due and proper consideration before this flexibility is employed.

THE PROPOSALS

Be it enacted as follows:

- 1. Section 5 of the Schedule A to the Constitution to be deleted and substituted with the following:
- "5 Notwithstanding the provisions of sections 3 and 4, but subject to any provisions of a Trust (if applicable) to the contrary, in the case of property controlled by the Provincial Trusts' Board, that Board, and in the case of property controlled by Diocesan Trustees, those Trustees with the consent of Diocesan Synod or Diocesan Council (or such other body in the Diocesa acting on behalf of Diocesan Synod between sessions of Synod) may in respect to the peculiar circumstances of any case authorise the use of the moneys referred to the in the said two sections for such other purposes as may, after due and proper consideration by the said bodies, be considered to be in the best interest of the Church of this Province".
- 2. Section 3 of Schedule A to the Constitution is to be consequentially amended by the insertion of the following words after the word "property" in the sixth line of the section:
- "3....., subject to the provisions of section 5;.....

SECOND CONSIDERATION OF AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION PASSED AT THE PREVIOUS SESSION OF SYNOD

A. In terms of Article XXIII of the Constitution, the same may only be amended by Resolutions passed at two sessions of Synod, the one immediately following the other;

B. At the previous session of Synod certain amendments to the Constitution were passed for the first time, and accordingly need to be considered by this session of Synod;

THE PROPOSALS

Be in enacted that:

The Measure passed at the last session of Synod is hereby agreed to by this session of Synod in terms of Article XXIII read with Standing Rule 47, the amendment in question being as follows:

In Article XXIV section 5, the words "male or female" be inserted after the words "all persons" in line 2, with commas before and after the words inserted.

The words to be added to section 5 of Article XXIV are to be:

- "..... and all references to clergy, priests, and clerical or priestly offices in the Constitution and Canons of this Church, the Book of Common Prayer (including the Rubrics) the Ordering of Bishops, Priests and Deacons and other Formularies of the Church shall be interpreted inclusively to mean men and women".
- 62.1. On behalf of the Metropolitan, Mr H Bennett moved the confirmation of the alterations to Article XXIV.
- 62.2. The Measure was put and carried nem con. The decision of Provincial Synod 1992 to amend the Constitution was thus ratified.

- A. It is desirable that the contribution of womens' organisations be more adequately recognized in the decision making structures of the Province;
- B. The September 1993 meeting of Provincial Standing Committee resolved that legislation be prepared to allow representatives from the Anglican Womens Fellowship and the Mothers' Union membership of Provincial Synod and Provincial Standing Committee;

THE PROPOSALS

Be it enacted that:

1. A new sub-section be added to Canon 1 section 2 to read as follows:

"In addition to the representatives mentioned in sub-sections (a) and (b) of Canon 1 section 2, each Diocese may send to Provincial Synod one member of the Provincial Executive of the Mothers' Union to represent the Mothers' Union and one member of the Provincial Executive of the Anglican Women's Fellowship to represent the Anglican Women's Fellowship. Each such member shall be a Communicant over the age of 18 (eighteen) years and, at the time of the election, a Provincial office bearer respectively of the Mothers' Union and the Anglican Women's Fellowship. Furthermore each such member must reside ordinarily in the Diocese in which she is elected, and shall be elected in that Diocese and no other. The Bishop of the Diocese in giving his certificate in terms of Section 6 of this Canon 1 shall certify that such representatives of the Mothers' Union and the Anglican Women's Fellowship comply with the requirements set out above."

- 2. That there be added to Canon 43 Section 3 (a) a new sub-section (iii) to read as follows:
- "The Mothers' Union and the Anglican Women's Fellowship shall each be entitled to send one representative to Provincial Standing Committee. Each such representative shall be a Communicant over the age of 18 (eighteen) years and an office bearer of the Provincial Executive in her organisation and she must ordinarily reside in one of the Dioceses of the Church of the Province of Southern Africa. Each such representative shall have all the rights and privileges of elected representatives including the power to vote."
- 3. That upon the passing of the above proposals the Resolutions of Permanent Force of the Provincial Synod numbered " 2 Mothers' Union" and "3 Anglican Women's Fellowship" passed in 1976 and 1979 respectively, shall be repealed.

It is desirable, in view of the important tasks ascribed by the church to the renewed Permanent Diaconate, including that of highlighting the needs of the world within the church community and of encouraging and enabling its effective response, to recognise in the structures of the Province the Permanent Diaconate, and to make provision for members of that body to have a voice in the mission and decision-making processes of the church;

B. It is desirable, as the church renews the diaconate, to distinguish between permanent deacons, whose individual vocation, as far as may be presently discerned, is to a permanent diaconal ministry in the church, and transitional deacons, who are such in terms of the Canons pending their ordination to the priesthood;

THE PROPOSALS

Be it enacted that:

1. A new subsection be added to section 2 of Canon 1, to read as follows:

"In addition to the representatives provided for in (a) and (b) of this section, each Diocese shall procure that its permanent diaconate meet to elect one or more representatives to Provincial Synod in proportion to their number, according to the following scale:

No of	Representatives to	
Permanent Deacons	Provincial Synod	
1 - 10	1	
11 - 50	2	
51 and over	3	

For this purpose such representatives are to be members of the Permanent Diaconate in that Diocese, save only that if there is no Permanent Diaconate in that Diocese, then no additional representatives shall be sent. The Bishop of the Diocese in giving his certificate in terms of Canon 1 section 6 shall certify that such representatives (or absence thereof) complies with the requirements as set out above".

- 2. Section 3 of Canon 18 is to be amplified by the addition of the following:
- "A Deacon, whose vocation, as far as may presently be discerned, is to the permanent diaconate, shall be a permanent deacon, and a deacon intending to seek admission as a Priest shall be a transitional deacon, subject to written notice of such intention in each case having been given to the Diocesan Bishop concerned and the Bishop consenting thereto."

THE PROPOSAL

Be it enacted:

That a third new paragraph be added to Article VI in the Constitution, as follows:

Provided further that Provincial Synod may make provision for additional persons representing significant organisations, bodies, institutions, commissions, or categories of persons to be full members of Provincial Synod. The number of such representatives and the rules for their election or appointment, shall be determined from time to time by the Provincial Synod.

The normal academic and other requrements for ordination shall be the possession of a recognised qualification in theology of a University, or Theological College or Institution, recognised by the Synod of Bishops, together with suitable pastoral training and spiritual formation as required by the particular diocese.

- Act VI nevertheless intended as a guide to the Bishop as to the required training needed for ordination;
- C. Fewer than 20% (twenty per cent) of the clergy within the Church of the Province of Southern Africa fulfil the requirements of Act VI.

THE PROPOSAL

Be it enacted that:

The whole of Act VI be replaced by:

the normal academic and other requirements for ordination shall be the possession of a recognised qualification in theology of a University, Theological College or Institution recognised by the Synod of Bishops, together with suitable pastoral training and spiritual formation as required by the particular diocese.

- 138.1. Synod now had this amended version of Agendum 12, as above, in their hands, and the debate on Agendum 12 was resumed.
- 138.2. The Bishop of St Helena proposed, and the Bishop of George seconded an amendment to the Proposal which was accepted by the movers of Agendum 12.

Be it enacted that:

That the normal academic and other requirements for ordination shall be:

The Amendment became part of the substantive motion.

138.3. The Revd J E Trisk proposed and the Bishop of Natal seconded a further amendment which

was accepted by the movers of Agendum 12:

- 138.5. The Motion was put and carried nem con.
- 139. Agenda 71 and 66
- 139.1. The Bishop of Christ the King proposed and The Revd C J Gregoroswki seconded the reception of the report of the Provincial Structures Commission (Agendum 71). Synod received the Report.
- 139.1.1. Discussion on the Report followed.

PROVINCIAL FINANCE STANDING COMMITTEE ON TAXATION

This Synod

- 1. Adopts the report on Taxation of the Finance Committee of Provincial Standing Committee.
- 2. Instructs all Dioceses in the Republic of South Africa to comply with the recommendations of the report.
- 140.1. Before addressing Agendum 64 the movers moved the reception of the report of the Provincial Finance Sub Committee Standing Committee on Taxation. Synod received the Report.
- 140.2. Debate was entered into.
- 140.3. The President obtained Synod's consent to delay the tea break so that Agendum 64 could be completed.
- 140.4. Debate on Agendum 64 continued.
- 140.5. The Recommendations of the PFC Standing Committee on Taxation were revised as follows:
 - That every Diocese of the C.P.S.A. in the Republic of South Africa is required to continue to comply with the Tax Laws of the Income Tax Act No. 58 of 1962 as amended.
 - That each Diocese is deemed to be the Employer and must centralise all the benefits received by Clergy. This is to be done by the individual Diocesan Offices by sending out a Return of Information for Income Tax Purposes to each Parish with effect from 1 March 1995 (similar to the one that has been used by the Diocese of Pretoria which is attached). (It is noted that form IRP2 has been withdrawn by the Income Tax Act. 1995).
 - That all Salaries/Stipends Committees (at Diocesan level) look at the financial packages of Bishops, Administrators and Clergy with the aim of working out the most effective package taxwise.
 - 4. That consultations be held at Diocesan level for all Dioceses in the Republic of South Africa. Dioceses that do not fall within the R.S.A. to look at their own Income Tax Laws.
 - That representations be made by the Standing Committee on Taxation, through the Taxation Committee of the South African Institute of Chartered Accountants (SAICA), to the Minister of Finance and the Commissioner of Taxes for a reduction of the tax burden of clergy resulting from the application of section 8(1)(a) and (b) and of the seventh schedule of the Income Tax Act 1962, as amended. Including Inter-alia:
 - (I) Residential accommodation (seventh schedule para 9)
 Raising the abatement from R20000 to R50000 and thereafter adjusting tax annually in accordance with the inflation rate

- (II) Section 8(1(b) and seventh schedule para 7 (right of use of motor vehicle).
 - (a) That it be accepted that travel between the Rectors/Bishops houses and the Parish/Diocesan Office is business travel.
 - (b) That the use of a motor vehicle by Clergy/Bishops is accepted as being a business vehicle subject to a record of private usage being maintained.
- 140.6. Agendum 64 was put and carried nem con.
- 140.7. The President thanked the Bishop of South Eastern Transvaal and his standing committee. Synod applauded.
- 141. The Provincial Executive Officer gave notices of a domestic nature.
- 142. Synod retired for tea at 15h45.

The Committee reported on the Measures referred to it by Synod for consideration at the second (committee) stage, as follows (the items deleted being shown as struck out, and the new material being shaded):

144.1. Agendum 1: By the Bishop of Kimberley & Kuruman

MEASURE TO AMEND CANON 4 (Of The Election Of Bishops)

THE PROPOSALS

Be it Enacted that:

1.

DEFINITIONS

- (a) The term "vacancy" or "vacant diocese" shall refer to a diocese where a bishop has died, or retired, or where a bishop's irrevocable notice of resignation has been accepted in terms of Canon 14, "of Resignation of Diocesan Bishops", or of Canon 10 section 16 (a) dealing with resignation of Bishops-Suffragan, or where a new diocese has been established:
- (b) A "Vicar General" shall mean a Dean, or Senior Priest, or a person so designated as-such by the Metropolitan;

2. VACANCIES

- (a) On the death of any Diocesan Bishop, the Dean or Senior Priest shall at once notify the vacancy in writing to the Metropolitan.
- (b) In the event of the resignation of a Diocesan Bishop, when such resignation has been duly accepted, or of such Bishop's translation, compulsory retirement, or deprivation, the Metropolitan shall at once notify the Dean or Senior Priest in writing.
- (c) In the case of a vacancy in the office of a Bishop Suffragan, the provisions of Canon 10 section 4 shall apply.

3. PERSONS ELIGIBLE FOR ELECTION

A Bishop of this Province may be elected from this Church or from any Church in full communion with the Church of this Province.

4. METHOD OF ELECTION

- (a) In a diocese of this Province where there are ten or more than-ten licensed clergy, a Bishop shall be elected by an Elective Assembly;
- (b) In a diocese of this Province where there are less than ten licensed

clergy, a Bishop shall be elected by the Bishops of the Province.

5. ELECTION OF THE METROPOLITAN

In the election of the Metropolitan, the provisions of Canon 5 shall apply, and, where relevant, supersede those of this Canon.

6. ELECTION OF BISHOPS SUFFRAGAN

In the election of Bishops Suffragan, the provisions of Canon 10 shall apply, and, where relevant, supersede those of this Canon.

7.
MEMBERSHIP OF
ELECTIVE ASSEMBLY

Membership of the Elective Assembly shall be:

- (i) The Metropolitan or a deputy, who shall be President: Should the Metropolitan or the deputy be unable to preside at the Assembly, the a senior cleric present by virtue of Section 9(a)(i) or (ii) shall preside;
- (ii) Members elected by Provincial Synod to the Advisory Committee in terms of section 9(a)(i) or (ii) with the right to speak but not to vote;
- (iii) All Bishops Suffragan commissioned in the vacant Diocese, and all Assistant Bishops licensed therein;
- (iv) All Clergy licensed in the vacant Diocese other than retired Clergy who are not licensed to a Pastoral Charge;
- (v) Lay Representatives, who are Parishioners of a Pastoral Charge (as contemplated in Canon 27.2) confirmed communicants and who are ordinarily-resident in the vacant Diocese and who are elected in such manner and according to such Rules as are provided for the election of Lay Representatives to Diocesan Synod of such Diocese; and
- (vi) Lay Persons elected by the Synod of the Diocese to serve on the Advisory Committee, provided that if any such person be also a Lay Representative in terms of sub-section (v) then that person shall have only one vota.

8. SUMMONING OF ELECTIVE ASSEMBLY:

Upon receiving or giving notice of the vacancy of a see:

- (a) The Metropolitan shall issue a mandate to the Vicar-General of the vacant diocese to summon the Elective Assembly to meet at such a place as the Vicar-General may decide;
- (b) The Metropolitan shall instruct the Provincial Executive Officer, in consultation with the Provincial Registrar or the Deputy to oversee

the process of the Election of a Bishop.

- (c) The Vicar-General, in consultation with the Metropolitan and the Chairperson of the Advisory Committee, shall determine the date on which the Elective Assembly shall meet. It shall not be less than ten weeks nor more than four months from the date of the mandate;
- (d) Within eight days after receipt of the mandate from the Metropolitan, the Vicar-General shall:-
 - (i) Summon the members of the Elective Assembly in accordance with the provisions of section 8(a) of this Canon;
 - (ii) Notify the Chairperson of the Advisory Committee;
 - (iii) Cause a profile of the Diocese to be prepared for presentation at the first meeting of the Advisory Committee.

9. MEMBERSHIP OF ADVISORY COMMITTEE

Membership of the Advisory Committee shall consist of Provincial and Diocesan members.

PROVINCIAL MEMBERS

- (a) The Provincial Members shall be chosen as follows:
 - (i) At each ordinary session of the Provincial Synod, ten bishops, ten clergy seven-priests, and ten seven confirmed lay persons of this Province shall be elected by their respective orders. They shall constitute a panel from which shall be chosen, one bishop, one cleric priest and one lay person to serve on the Advisory Committee in the event of the vacancy of a See, other than the Metropolitan See. as additional members of the Advisory-Committee.
 - (ii) In the case of the Election of the Metropolitan, two bishops, two clergy priests and two lay persons shall be chosen to serve on the Advisory Committee as-additional-members of the Advisory Committee.
 - (iii) The members of the panel shall remain as such until the next ordinary Session of the Provincial Synod, when they shall retire but shall be eligible for re-election.
 - (iv) Licenced Clergy Priests licensed and Lay persons who are Parishioners of a Pastoral Charge (as contemplated in Canon 27.2) in persons-ordinarily resident-in the vacant Diocese shall be excluded from the panel chosen in terms of this section. membership-of-the-Advisory-Committe-elected-in terms-of-this section.

DIOCESAN MEMBERS (b) The Diocesan Members shall be chosen as follows:

- (i) At each session of every Diocesan Synod, the following shall be elected to serve as members of the Advisory Committee of the Diocese, and to hold office until the next session of Diocesan Synod, when they shall retire, but shall be eligible for re-election;
 - (aa) A lay Chairperson with a lay deputy, an alternate, by all houses sitting as one together (the deputy Chairperson being entitled to attend all meetings of the Advisory Committee with the right to speak but not to vote should the Chairperson be present);
 - (bb) Four Clergy, who are-Three-Priests licensed in the vacant Diocese, with alternates, elected by the House of Clergy;
 - (cc) Four Lay Parishioners Three Lay Persons ordinarily resident in the vacant Diocese, being confirmed communicants of this Province, with alternates, elected by the House of Laity;
- (ii) The Vicar-General, who shall be an ex officio member of the Advisory Committee;
- (iii) In the event of the lay Chairperson of the Advisory Committee being unable to act prior to the first meeting of the Advisory Committee, the deputy alternate—lay Chairperson shall act as Chairperson. Should in the event of the Chairperson be unable to act during or after the first meeting, the Advisory Committee may either call on the deputy elternate—lay-Chairperson to act as Chairperson or may elect a Chairperson from among its lay members.

10. SUMMONING THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE

- (a) The Metropolitan shall personally himself, or through the Provincial Executive Officer, as the Metropolitan may decide, notify all eligible members of the panel elected in terms of section 9 (a) of this Canon when the Elective Assembly will meet. The Metropolitan or the Provincial Executive Officer (as the case may be) shall request them to inform the office of the Metropolitan within ten (10) days whether or not they will be available to serve on the Advisory Committee, if called upon to do so by the Chairperson of the Advisory Committee of the vacant Diocese.
- (b) On receipt of this information the Metropolitan or the Provincial Executive Officer, as the case may be, shall inform the Chairperson of the Advisory Committee of the names of the members of the panel so chosen who should be called upon to serve on the Advisory Committee in addition to those members of the Diocese elected in terms of section 9 (b)(i) of this Canon.

11. FUNCTIONS OF ADVISORY COMMITTEE

- (a) The Chairperson, upon receiving notification from the Vicar-General in terms of Section 8(d)(ii), shall:
 - (i) Write to every pastoral charge of the vacant Diocese inviting clergy or confirmed communicants of the vacant diocese to submit names of candidates, within thirty (30) days, to fill the vacancy.
 - (ii) Instruct each the Proposer of a candidate to provide in writing;
 - (aa) the consent of the candidate:
 - (bb) the names of two other persons who support the nomination and who have been requested to provide supporting motivation for the said nomination;
 - (cc) motivation for the nomination of the candidate, and a personal profile of the candidate.
 - (iii) Summon the Advisory Committee, consisting of both Diocesan and Provincial representatives, to meet within ten (10) days after the deadline for the submission of nominations.
 - (iv) Report-on-the-names-submitted At the first meeting of the Advisory Committee report on the names submitted.
 - (v) Write to all candidates providing a profile of the Diocese and asking for:
 - a Personal Profile, stating among other things - why a candidate should be considered for Election -
 - a Curriculum Vitae
 - a recent medical certificate
 Referees and their addresses
 - (vi) Invite any member of the Advisory Committee to submit in terms of sub-section 11(a)(ii)(aa) and (cc) within ten days one or more names of candidates in writing either-before or at the first meeting of the Advisory Committee.
 - (vii) Ask for the recusal of any member of the Advisory Committee who has been nominated, and request the alternate of that member to take such member's place. -Ask any-member-of-the-Advisory-Committee-who-has-been nominated to recuse-him/herself-from-attending-meetings and-shall-invite his/her-alternate-to take his/her-place.)
- (b) At its first meeting, the Advisory Committee shall
 - (i) may obtain confidential testimonials from independent

referees as well as those suggested by candidates, provided that should serious adverse information be received in this way from an independent referee, such information shall not be incorporated in a report on the candidate unless the candidate has been afforded an opportunity to reply thereto, after the independent referee has consented to such disclosure (whether on an anonymous basis or not);

- (ii) shall inform the Metropolitan and the Diocese of names of the candidates.
- (c) At its second meeting, which shall take place not later than the day before the Elective Assembly, the Advisory Committee shall:
 - (i) Prepare reports on all the candidates.
 - (ii) Invite persons who are to propose candidates at Elective Assembly proposers to attend a the meeting for a briefing.
 - (iii) Submit a list of all candidates together with reports to the President of the Elective Assembly.

12. THE ELECTION OF A BISHOP

- (a) On the day appointed and on each succeeding day on which the Assembly meets, Holy Communion shall be celebrated before the Assembly proceeds to business.
- (b) The Registrar of the Diocese or a deputy appointed by the President shall be in attendance at the meeting.
- (c) The President shall cause the roll to be determined by the Diocesan Registrar or the deputy Registrar. The President He shall call upon the Registrar or the deputy Registrar to certify that only those persons eligible to attend are present and that no person eligible to attend has been excluded. Any informalities, and objections to the attendance of a member, shall be considered and determined by the Assembly. The President shall then ask the Registrar or deputy to declare that a quorum is present; this done, the President shall constitute the Assembly.
- (d) A quorum shall be not less than one half of the total number of the Bishops and the Clergy together and one half of the <u>Lay members</u> Laity.
- (e) Once the Elective Assembly has been constituted its proceedings shall be deemed to be confidential.
- (f) The Assembly shall then proceed to elect one or more secretaries and two or more scrutineers from its members, and a Proctor who shall appear, if necessary, in the Court of Confirmation.
- (g) The Assembly shall determine its times of meeting.
- (h) The President shall address the Assembly setting out the purpose

- and procedures of the Assembly, refer to the matter in sub-section (a) of this Canon, and may at any time address the Assembly.
- (i) The Elective Assembly may at any time delegate the choice of a Bishop to the Bishops of the Province, if it so determines by a twothirds majority.
- (j) The President shall furnish the Assembly with a list of the names of all persons considered by the Advisory Committee, after which proposers so designated by the Advisory Committee, if available, or any member of the Assembly, may nominate to the vacancy only from the list so furnished, except insofar as is allowed by subsection 12(v).-of-this-Ganon. Every nomination shall be seconded by any member of the Elective Assembly.
- (k) All candidates so nominated who are present shall withdraw from the Assembly while the debate takes place, but shall be at hand for any consultation that might be deemed necessary. They shall be entitled to vote and the provisions of sub-section 12(p) shall not apply then in respect of such absence.
- (I) When nominations have ceased, each nominee shall be considered by the Assembly in alphabetical order.
- (m) As each nominee is considered, the President shall call upon a Provincial member of the Advisory Committee so designated to give the Committee's report on the nominee.
- (n) The President shall then invite
 - (i) members of the Assembly to ask for clarification of any point in the Advisory Committee's report, and
 - (ii) the proposer and seconder of the nominee being considered to speak if they so wish and thereafter other members of the Assembly to speak on the nominee.
- (o) The President shall have control of the proceedings of the Assembly and may interrupt a speaker should the speaker make statements of a derogatory or defamatory libellous nature and may call for a retraction of such statements and/or may terminate a speaker's address to the Assembly or otherwise make such rules or give such directions in regard to the conduct of the Assembly as seems appropriate to the President in the President's his sole and absolute discretion.
- (p) No member who has been absent from the Session or Sessions of the Elective Assembly or any portion thereof during which the reports of the Advisory Committee were presented or when the nominees were discussed, shall be eligible to attend a subsequent Session of the Assembly except for good cause shown, in the discretion of the President. The failure of a member to attend the Elective Assembly shall not preclude the Assembly from proceeding to election so long as a quorum is present.

- (q) When discussion has ceased, the members shall record their votes. The voting shall be by secret ballot and the President shall have a deliberative vote only. The members shall record their votes by writing on their voting paper either the name of the person for whom they vote or, if they desire to vote for none of the candidates, to write the word "none", or make a cross on the voting paper.
- (r) No person shall be deemed to be elected unless that person he/she shall have received not less than two-thirds of the total number of votes of the Bishops and Clergy present and voting together, and two-thirds of the votes of the House of Laity, voting at the same time.
- (s) If after the first ballot taking of the vote no person has received the necessary majority, successive votes shall be taken in like manner. After the result of any of the first four ballots is announced and no election has been made, the Assembly may on the proposal of any member, which is duly seconded, resolve by a simple majority to reopen discussion on the nominees.
- (t) If after five ballots no election has been made, the candidate with the least votes shall withdraw. This procedure shall be followed at each succeeding ballot up to the seventh ninth ballot, or until only two candidates are left, or until a Bishop is elected at an earlier ballot.
- (u) If after seven nine ballots no election has been made, the Assembly shall adjourn for a period determined upon by a simple majority of members.
- (v) Upon the Assembly reconvening and unless a delegation is made under sub-section 12(i) 9-9-of-this Canon, the President shall call for fresh nominations. All those whose names were furnished to the Assembly by the President in terms of sub-section 12(j) 9-10-of-this Ganon shall then be eligible for nomination. If the Elective Assembly so determines, it may consider names which have not previously been submitted to the Advisory Committee.
- (w) If within two consecutive days of the constitution of the Assembly after the date fixed, in terms of section 7.2.3 of this Canon for the Assembly to meet for the main business of the election no election is made, or if a quorum cannot be found within such period, then the Advisory Committee shall meet and forward to the Metropolitan the names of at least two persons considered by the Committee to be suitable for appointment as Bishop. The Synod of Bishops of the Province may shall then choose from the names so submitted a Bishop for the vacant See. If, within twenty eight (28) days or such longer period as the Metropolitan may allow, none of those so chosen elected has accepted, or if no election is confirmed, the Elective Assembly shall be re-convened.
- (x) When an election is made, the declaration of such act shall be signed in duplicate by the President, and one of these declarations shall be transmitted to the Provincial Archives and the other kept in

the Registry of the Diocese.

- (y) When a nominee shall have received the requisite majority, but refuses to accept office, balloting shall continue.
- (z) If the election is not confirmed in accordance with provisions of Canon 7 "Of Confirmation of Bishops", a fresh Elective Assembly shall be convened.

13. PROCEDURE NOT PROVIDED FOR

In all matters not specifically provided for in this Canon the procedure to be followed shall be determined by the President who shall be guided by the Model Rules for an Elective Assembly made from time to time by the Provincial Synod, and by the Acts of the Diocese, failing these, by the President, subject to any direction which may be given by the Assembly; but no direction by the Assembly shall invalidate any action previously taken upon a ruling given by the President.

144.1.1. The Metropolitan moved, and Sir R Bromley seconded, the reception of Committee's report on Agendum 1.

Synod agreed with slight dissent.

144.2. Agendum 2 By the Bishop of Kimberley & Kuruman

MEASURE TO AMEND ARTICLE XXIV OF THE CONSTITUTION AND CANON 10

THE PROPOSALS

Be it Enacted that:

- 1. The following clauses be inserted after clause 3 of article XXIV of Constitution with consequential re-numbering of existing clauses.
 - 4. By "Bishop Suffragan" is and shall be meant a bishop, duly elected, consecrated and licensed as provided for in the Constitution and Canons of the CPSA whose ministry is exercised within a specific diocese at the direction of the Bishop of the Diocese in accordance with the provision of the Commission approved by the Synod of Bishops in accordance with the provisions of the Canons.
 - 5. By "Regional or Area Bishop" is **and shall be** meant a bishop suffragan, duly elected, consecrated and licensed as provided for in the Constitution and Canons of the CPSA with specific episcopal responsibility for a designated geographical region or area within a diocese of the CPSA under the authority of the Bishop of the Diocese, whose Commission has been approved by the Synod of Bishops in accordance with the provisions of the Canons.
 - 6. By "Missionary Bishop" is and shall be meant a bishop duly elected, consecrated and licensed as provided for in the Constitution and Canons of the CPSA for ministry in a specific geographical area either within or beyond the present borders of the CPSA."
 - 7. By "Assistant Bishop" is and shall be meant a bishop holding special Letters of Appointment issued by the Bishop of the Diocese.

NOTE: THIS IS A CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT WHICH WILL HAVE TO BE APPROVED AT THE NEXT SESSION OF SYNOD

- 2. The following changes be made to Canon 10:
 - 1. The heading be amended to read:
 - "Of Bishops Suffragan, Regional or Area Bishops and Assistant Bishops".
 - 2. The existing section 9 be numbered (a) and a new sub-section be added as follows:
 - "(b A Bishop Suffragan holding a Commission with episcopal responsibility for a designated geographical region or area within a Diocese under the authority of the Diocesan Bishop shall be known a Regional or area Bishop. However, as a Bishop Suffragan he or she shall have all the rights and obligations of a Bishop Suffragan in terms of this and the other Canons, and any withdrawal or alteration of the Commission shall be effected in accordance with the provisions of sub-section (a) of this section."
 - 3. In section 18 the word "retired" shall be deleted before the word "bishop" in the second line, and the words: "....already in episcopal orders who holds...." shall be substituted for the word "holding" in the same line.
- 144.2.1. The Metropolitan, seconded by The Bishop of Johannesburg moved the adoption of the Report of Committee of Synod on Agendum 2. Synod agreed.
- 144.3. Agendum 3 By the Bishop of Kimberley and Kuruman

MEASURE TO AMEND CANON 21 (Of Formation of Dioceses)

THE PROPOSALS

Be it enacted that:

- 1. The words "... within or ..." are to be inserted before the word "beyond" A fullstop be inserted-after the-word-"Bishops" in line 6 of Canon 21 section 1 of Constitution and Canons. and-delete all the words that follow:

The Bishop of the Diocese in giving a his certificate in terms of Section 6 of this Canon 1 shall certify that such representatives of the Mothers' Union and the Anglican Women's Fellowship comply with the requirements set out above."

3. That there be added to Canon 43 Section 3 (a) a new sub-section (iii) to read as follows:

"The Mother's Union and the Anglican Women's Fellowship shall each be entitled to send one representative to Provincial Standing Committee. Each such representative shall be a Communicant over the age of 18 (eighteen) years and an office bearer of the Provincial Executive in the her organisation concerned and she must ordinarily reside in one of the Dioceses of the Church of the Province of Southern Africa. Each such representative shall have all the rights and privileges of elected representatives including the power to speak but not to vote."

The Bishop of the Diocese in giving a his certificate in terms of Canon 1 section 6 shall certify that such representatives (or absence thereof) comply with the requirements as set out above"

- (a) The heading to Canon 18 is to be amended by deleting the words: "The age at which persons may be admitted ..." and replacing them with the word: "Admission".
- (b) Section 3 of Canon 18 is to be amplified by the addition of the following:
- "A Deacon, whose vocation, as far as may presently be discerned, is to the permanent diaconate, shall be a permanent deacon, and a deacon intending to seek admission as a priest shall be a transitional deacon, subject to written notice of such intention in each case having been given to the Diocesan Bishop concerned and the Bishop consenting thereto."

- "3...., subject to the provisions of section 5 hereof.

Delete all the words from "or failing such purchase..." in line six of section 3 of Schedule A to the end of the section.

- 1. The Conference divided into 19 groups to discuss different issues under the heading of the 3 foci of the Mission and Ministry Report.
- 2. Resolutions formulated by the groups and amendments to resolutions contained in the Second Agenda book have been forwarded to the Synod Advisory Committee and will be placed on the agenda on Thursday and Friday.
- 3. The reports of Group 8 and Group 16 will be tabled for the information of Synod and should thereafter be forwarded to the new Transformation Commission.
- 4. Some of the groups focused on resolutions already in the Agenda book and members of these groups will be able to contribute to the debates in Synod session so their comments are not repeated here.
- 5. Strong emphasis was placed by several groups on:
 - 5.1 the language of our liturgy and our communications in relation to gender, simplicity, and concepts which sometimes make sense in english but do not translate at all in other languages;
 - 5.2 our need to improve our internal communication systems and to develop in each of us a commitment to disseminating information and discussion documents rather than just filing them away;
 - 5.3 the ministry of the baptized: "The basis for ministry is baptism not ordination."
 - 5.4 enthusiasm for the affirmation of African culture in worship and church life and the new understanding of community this brings to the CPSA as well as the need to respond to the challenges that this presents to us.
 - the understanding that "human rights" is not just about legislated rights but about the responsibility we have towards every person and especially to the poor and powerless with regard to the socio-economic rights which are still denied to them.
- 6. Some of the groups really struggled with the issues of racism, representation of women in church structures, lay ministry, and the very difficult issues encompassed under the heading of "human sexuality".

It seems that much of the work of the theological commission, various conferences and consultations, and the Mission and Ministry Report and process has not been disseminated for discussion at parish level in many of the dioceses.

We urge the Synod of Bishops to give serious attention to having these reports discussed, reflected on and acted on at parish level. Sermon outlines need to be provided. In addition the importance of verbal communication needs to be stressed.

- 7. Group 17 which discussed polygamy asked that the question be referred to the Commission on Christianity and African Culture. It is regretted that no report from that Commission was available to Synod.
- 8. Another gap identified was information from the dioceses about progress in work on HIV/AIDS. Group 11 has placed a resolution on the Agenda on this subject but, in the absence of information on work already being done, was unable to formulate a resolution which would suggest practical steps to take the ministry forward.
- 9. The conference facilitators are concerned that important resolutions are put before Synod but implementation is inevitably delayed. It is suggested that future Provincial Synods should allow an extra day for an implementation committee consisting of the liaison Bishops, Provincial Officers and other relevant persons, to decide on the practical steps to be taken to implement the resolutions as quickly as possible.

We also believe that it would be helpful if in future preparation for Synods proposers of resolutions were to be asked to include a paragraph dealing with suggested implementation beyond requesting the Metropolitan to do something.

- 10. We apologize to the young people of the CPSA that no group was given the task of discussing our ministry with and to the youth. It was a serious error on our part.
- 11. The process employed in preparing for this conference has been a constructive one because it took forward the work of the Mission and Ministry Consultation at Modderpoort and the work of the Mission and Ministry Commission.

During the months of preparatory work for the Conference, Cynthia Botha and Maureen Simons have worked like Trojans with great efficiency and humour. Synod owes them a vote of sincere thanks for all they have put into it with such commitment and dedication.

154.6. Synod, led by the President, gave appreciation for the work of the Revd C Botha and Mrs M Simons in the form of "the Taung Clap".

154.7. Agendum 63.1.

The proposer of agendum 32 on FIREARMS, the Bishop of the South Eastern Transvaal, and the proposer of agendum 59 on LANDMINES, the Bishop of Lebombo, agreed to withdraw their resolutions in favour of the following:

Seconded: The Bishop of South Eastern Transvaal

DISARMING THE MIND OF THE NATION

That this Synod:

Notes with concern the climate of militarization that still exists within the nations of southern Africa and its pervasive influence on all aspects of people's lives, together with the role it plays in promoting the current culture of violence;

- Commends the governments of countries within the geographical boundaries of the CPSA
 for their initiatives to counter this climate of militarization. In particular we commend the
 South African Government of National Unity for the Cameron report and its decision to place
 arms sales under the authority of a special Cabinet committee. We call upon the said
 government to extend this committee by allowing for the active participation in that
 committee of religious leaders.
- 2. Commends the government of Mozambique for its initiative in establishing a demining programme within that country.
- 3. Calls upon all governments throughout the world to ban the manufacturing, storing, exporting, importing, giving and use of landmines, letter bombs and similar devices.
- 4. Calls upon government and donor agencies to contribute more generously towards demining programmes in the various countries affected by landmines.
- 5. Calls upon the South African Government of National Unity to move towards the abolition or drastic curtailment of firearms possessed by civilians through the introduction of such legislation and measures as will make it increasingly difficult for civilians to possess a firearm. Only by reducing the number of firearms and the right of people to own and use them can the spiral of violence by halted.
- 154.7. Debate was entered into.
- 154.7.2. An amendment was proposed by the Rt Revd R C R Briggs;
 - "That a new paragraph 6 be added to read:
 - 6. Notes with appreciation the decision by the South African Government to place a total ban on dealing in landmines and respectfully requests the Metropolitan to convey this to the President of the RSA and the Minister of Defence, while reiterating its view that no landmine whatsoever should be manufactured in the RSA.

The Movers of Agendum 63.1. accepted this amendment.

- 154.7.3. The Revd J E Trisk proposed and the Revd R J Shorten seconded an amendment to add a new paragraph 7:
 - 7. Declares all churches of the CPSA " A Gun Free Zone"

The movers of Agendum 63.1. accepted this amendment.

154.7.4. Mr G Burton proposed and the Revd Canon M Weeder seconded an amendment to the new paragraph 7 by the addition of:

Calls on its members through diocesan structures and at parochial level to publicise and support the Gun Free Campaign started in 1993, and to promote the Gun-Free Zone Campaign, details of which will be available on CPSANET.

Challenges its members to surrender their guns together with their licences to the police.

- 154.7.4.1. The movers of agendum 63.1. accepted this amendment.
- 154.7.5. The movers also accepted an amendment to replace paragraph 2 with:

Commends the Governments of Mozambique, Namibia and Angola on their initiatives in establishing demining programmes within their countries.

- 154.7.6. The President asked the Bishop of Niassa to pray before Synod voted.
- 154.7.7. Agendum 63.1 as amended, was put and carried with one dissenting voice.
- 154.8. Agendum 63.2

Proposed: The Bishop of Lebombo Seconded: The Ven B Nopece

VIOLENCE AND LAWLESSNESS

That this Synod:

Notes with concern the growing climate of violence and lawlessness which exists throughout the southern African region:

- 1. Is particularly concerned about the continuation of the senseless killings within the KwaZulu/Natal region and the immeasurable pain, suffering and grief caused to families;
- Encourages the initiatives of the SACC with its church leaders to initiate a meeting between the relevant political leaders with a view to restoring a climate whereby national problems could be resolved through negotiations;
- Supports the SACC's proposal that an international group of eminent persons be invited to assist the ecumenical movement's initiatives to bring about a lasting peace with justice in South Africa.
- 154.8.1. Debate was entered into.
- 154.8.2. The Rt Revd M M Makhaye proposed an amendment accepted by the movers of Agendum 63.2. that:

Noting with concern the conspiracy of silence surrounding domestic violence

- Calls upon the church to break the conspiracy of silence surrounding domestic violence and by preaching and teaching to demonstrate that all forms of violence are contrary to the gospel of love;
- Calls upon parishes to promote healthy non-violent relationships and to create such a climate of warmth and caring within the parish that victims of domestic violence may find a place of sanctuary;

Notes the burgeoning populations of all the countries of southern Africa and realizes that, unless the church is increasing at least at the same rate as the overall population, it is in decline.

Desires continuing spiritual and numerical growth by the church through the work of evangelism and discipling particularly among young people; and

- 1. Respectfully requests the Synod of Bishops to review, evaluate and encourage the process of evangelism in the CPSA in the light of the Decade of Evangelism.
- 2. Requests that the brief for the Provincial Commission for Mission and Ministry include:
- 2.1 the provision of training resources in church growth;
- 2.2 the regular analysis of statistical information of the communicant strength of the church with a view to monitoring the effectiveness of the evangelism of the church.
- 3. Encourages each diocese to appoint a committee or officer to liaise with the Director of Mission and Ministry and actively foster church growth.
- 4. Calls on the Synod of Bishops to ensure that ordinands are trained in evangelism.

Definition: by CPSA is meant Parishes, Dioceses and the Province.

- The structures of the CPSA are very prescriptive. To overcome this, a strategy to
 encourage across the board participation in the structures and life of the church, and to
 cultivate "flat" (not hierarchial) structures needs to be developed. In addition all
 decision-making structures and processes should be simplified.
- 2. Exchange programmes within the Province involving clergy, lay people and bishops.
- 3. Implement the process of Africanisation of the liturgy, etc, in the CPSA.
- 4. Promote transparency in employment practices at all levels.
- 5. Promote affirmative action.
- 6. Provide ongoing training and development.
- Identify leaders and their expertise, and so utilize this information as a springboard to transformation. A data bank of Human Resource Skills should be available within the CPSA.
- 8. Examine all relevant public issues, for example capitalism, and act thereon.
- 9. Improve communication at all levels, so that the flow of information becomes much more effective and easy.
- 10. The CPSA should become involved in the RDP, particularly in the following areas:
 - education
 - health
 - family violence
 - youth
 - self-help programmes
- 11. The CPSA should be involved in National Reconciliation (Namibia).
- 12. Much more care needs to be shown to the employees of the CPSA, that is, clergy and laity, not only by improving their financial wellbeing but also by putting support programmes in place and by caring for the widows and widowers of their employees.
- 13. There needs to be a rationalization of all the structures of the CPSA.

COMMISSION FOR TRUTH AND RECONCILIATION

Whereas this Synod:

- 1. Believes that the imminent Truth and Reconciliation Commission provides a God-given opportunity for all the peoples of southern Africa to wrestle with our collective and individual past and to seek for healing:
- Welcomes the Truth and Reconciliation Commission with its particular emphasis on survivors and victims, and on acknowledgement of the grim catalogue of human rights violations which have been perpetrated against, and have dehumanised, the peoples of southern Africa;
- 3. Believes that we as the CPSA need to approach the Truth Commission in a spirit of repentance, recognising our own sins of commission, omission and complicity with the evil of apartheid. At the same time we celebrate the many noble acts of courage and self-sacrifice symbolised in the witness of people such as Archbishop Trevor Huddleston, Canon James Calata and Archbishop Desmond Tutu;
- 4. Calls on all peoples to join in a national spiritual pilgrimage of confession, repentance, amendment of life and reparation;
- 5. Acknowledges that only the stories of gross human rights violations will be heard by the Commission. We believe, however, that all of us in South Africa have stories to tell about what we did, what was done to us and what we failed to do.

Therefore

We respectfully request the Metropolitan to facilitate the setting-up of a sub-committee under the auspices of the Mission and Ministry Standing Committee for a period of 2 years, the purpose of which is to oversee and facilitate a process in every parish of the CPSA which will:-

- (i) give information about the Truth Commission; and
- (ii) provide skills training for facilitators to assist in the process of healing the memories within local communities.

INCULTURATION

Introductory Question: What comes to mind when we think of culture?

- A body of norms, standards and traditions evolved within a group or groupings of people
- A dynamic process
- A sense of belonging and security
- Sharing, identity, challenge
- Behaviour, how and why I behave, as affected by other people
- Passed down, learnt within the family
- Sense of acceptance, dignity, values

- Mixture of positive and negative
- Relationship with cult

Question 1: How can we be both African and Anglican as a church in Africa?

- When talking about inculturation, we are really talking about respect for and preservation of culture
- Use the Bible instead of western culture as a sieve all that is good in a culture will come through
- We have internalised oppression: we need now to unlock the doors which have been locked, which needs courage.
- Every African who goes to church goes with his/her ancestors; compare this with the commemoration of the faithful departed in white churches, putting names of departed in pew leaflets on a weekly basis
- Teaching needed as an immediate and long-term measure to liberate the church
- Research must continue: the process of learning enables one to discover one's own roots
- Important to face things and go about learning about them
- Start with everyday ministry; take ordinary things and help people to grow towards God through them
- Traditional practices can be used to enable people to find Christ in a new way; precedents for this are e.g. Christmas (ancient pagan return of light festival) and Easter (ancient spring celebration of new life)
- Important to enable liturgy to meet people's needs
- Anglicanism is known for diversity, therefore it should be possible to be both Anglican and African
- Transparency: speak the truth and work together

Question 2: Does Inculturation promote Church Unity or is it a threat to it?

- Culture is a gift to enrich others in a process of give-and-take, and should not cut people off from one another
- Exposure to another culture leads to change
- Inculturation is the ongoing dialogue between gospel and culture: the gospel transforms and redeems culture, and people re-express the gospel in their culture
- Culture gives the gospel a home, the gospel gives culture a soul
- Enrichment will not happen if there is no openness
- Fear of difference can encourage cliques to develop and promote division
- 185.6.1. Agendum 63.11 was received by Synod.

- 3. The College of Transfiguration to be an agent of transformation in theological education and ministerial formation.

- b. accepts that if the CPSA Synod adopts Proposal 2 of this CUC Report as it now stands, this will indicate that the CPSA is genuinely interested in the full reconciliation of the ordained ministries of the CUC member Churches.
- c. if the CPSA Synod adopts Proposal 2 of the CUC Report, requests the Synod to appoint 6 bishops to meet, at the earliest mutually convenient time, with an equal number of representatives of the PCSA appointed by the General Assembly, in order to discuss the question of full mutual recognition of ordained ministries; and
- d. appoints the following 6 persons to represent the PCSA at this meeting: the Rt Revd E A Perkins (Moderator), the Revd Dr M J Masango (Moderator Designate), the Revd R J Botsis (Past Moderator), the Revd Prof C W Cook, the Revd A Rodger (General Secretary) and the Revd R McN Samson.

SAVE OUR FUTURE

That this Synod

Realizing that the future of human beings and all life on earth hangs in balance as a consequence of the present unjust economic structures, the injustice existing between the rich and the poor and the continuing exploitation of the natural environment;

And **realizing** that we as Christians have a God-given mandate to care for, look after and protect God's creation:-

- 1. Endorses the "Save our Future" Campaign;
- 2. Requests all Anglicans to study, disseminate and commit themselves to this Campaign and petition;
- 3. Invites all other churches and faith communities to support this Campaign, requesting the SACC to assist in promoting it;
- 4. Endorses the "Save our Future" Petition, calling on all governments, and in particular the governments of the countries of southern Africa:-
- to work for and create a sustainable society in a sustainable world,
- to recognize the dignity and rights of all people and the sanctity of life
- to seek to ensure the responsible use and recycling of natural resources.

In particular, we believe it essential that governments:

- Make environmental education a compulsory part of all school curricula
- Include the cost of repairing environmental damage caused in the production or manufacture of traded goods
- Establish fairer trade practices between North and South
- Ensure that the activities of transnational companies benefit rather than exploit people and the natural environment
- Reduce military expenditure and control ownership of guns
- Prohibit production and use of CFCs
- Develop the use of renewable, non-polluting energy resources, such as sun and wind
- Protect indigenous forests, wetlands, marine environments and other threatened and sensitive ecosystems

- Discourage the use of non-returnable bottles and plastic bags.
- 188.2. The movers accepted the following amendment:

Add to No 1:

After "Endorses the 'Save our Future' campaign"

requesting that as far as possible it be translated into the languages of the CPSA, in order to create awareness of environmental issues and to integrate that awareness at parish, diocesan and Provincial levels.

After No 3 a new No 4:

Respectfully requests the Synod of Bishops to establish an Environmental Network to monitor development programmes and environmental care in southern Africa in order to ensure that "the integrity of creation is safeguarded and sustained and the life of the earth renewed".

The network should be part of the Mission and Ministry Commission and should seek to work with the Advisory Board on Theological Education and with other church and faith groups through the Church Unity Commission (CUC), South African Council of Churches (SACC) and World Conference on Religion and Peace (WCRP).

The present No 4 to become No 5 and under:

"In particular, we believe it essential that governments:"

Replace: "Include the cost of repairing environmental damage....."

With: "Establish and enforce environmental laws in industry."

At end of motion add new words:

"Ensure that the activities of transnational companies benefit rather than exploit <u>THE LOCAL</u> people and <u>THEIR</u> natural environment."

210. FINAL APPROVAL OF ALL MEASURES:

210.1. Agendum 1: The Bishop of Kimberley and Kuruman MEASURE TO AMEND CANON 4 (Of The Election Of Bishops)

Be it Enacted:

1. DEFINITIONS

- (a) The term "vacancy" or "vacant diocese" shall refer to a diocese where a bishop has died, or retired, or where a bishop's irrevocable notice of resignation has been accepted in terms of Canon 14, "of Resignation of Diocesan Bishops", or of Canon 10 section 16 (a) dealing with resignation of Bishops-Suffragan, or where a new diocese has been established;
- (b) A "Vicar General" shall mean a Dean, or Senior Priest, or a person so designated by the Metropolitan;

VACANCIES

- (a) On the death of any Diocesan Bishop, the Dean or Senior Priest shall at once notify the vacancy in writing to the Metropolitan.
- (b) In the event of the resignation of a Diocesan Bishop, when such resignation has been duly accepted, or of such Bishop's translation, compulsory retirement, or deprivation, the Metropolitan shall at once notify the Dean or Senior Priest in writing.
- (c) In the case of a vacancy in the office of a Bishop Suffragan, the provisions of Canon 10 section 4 shall apply.

3. PERSONS ELIGIBLE FOR ELECTION

A Bishop of this Province may be elected from this Church or from any Church in full communion with the Church of this Province.

4. METHOD OF ELECTION

- (a) In a diocese of this Province where there are ten or more licensed clergy, a Bishop shall be elected by an Elective Assembly;
- (b) In a diocese of this Province where there are less than ten licensed clergy, a Bishop shall be elected by the Bishops of the Province.

5. ELECTION OF THE METROPOLITAN

In the election of the Metropolitan, the provisions of Canon 5 shall apply, and, where relevant, supersede those of this Canon.

6. ELECTION OF BISHOPS SUFFRAGAN

In the election of Bishops Suffragan, the provisions of Canon 10 shall apply, and, where relevant, supersede those of this Canon.

7. MEMBERSHIP OF ELECTIVE ASSEMBLY

Membership of the Elective Assembly shall be:

- (a)(i) The Metropolitan or a deputy, who shall be President: should the Metropolitan or the deputy be unable to preside at the Assembly, the senior cleric present by virtue of Section 9(a)(i) or (ii) shall preside;
 - (ii) Members elected by Provincial Synod to the Advisory Committee in terms of section 9(a)(i) or (ii) with the right to speak but not to vote;
 - (iii) All Bishops Suffragan commissioned in the vacant Diocese, and all Assistant Bishops licensed therein;
 - (iv) All Clergy licensed in the vacant Diocese other than retired Clergy who are not licensed to a Pastoral Charge;
 - (v) Lay Representatives, who are Parishioners of a Pastoral Charge (as contemplated in Canon 27.2) in the vacant Diocese and who are elected in such manner and according to such Rules as are provided for the election of Lay Representatives to Diocesan Synod of such Diocese; and

(vi) Lay Persons elected by the Synod of the Diocese to serve on the Advisory Committee, provided that if any such person be also a Lay Representative in terms of sub-section (v) then that person shall have only one vote.

8. SUMMONING OF ELECTIVE ASSEMBLY :

Upon receiving or giving notice of the vacancy of a see:

- (a) The Metropolitan shall issue a mandate to the Vicar-General of the vacant diocese to summon the Elective Assembly to meet at such a place as the Vicar-General may decide;
- (b) The Metropolitan shall instruct the Provincial Executive Officer, in consultation with the Provincial Registrar or Deputy, to oversee the process of the Election of a Bishop.
- (c) The Vicar-General, in consultation with the Metropolitan and the Chairperson of the Advisory Committee shall determine the date on which the Elective Assembly shall meet. It shall not be less than ten weeks nor more than four months from the date of the mandate:
- (d) Within eight days after receipt of the mandate from the Metropolitan, the Vicar-General shall:-
 - (i) Summon the members of the Elective Assembly in accordance with the provisions of section 8(a) of this Canon;
 - (ii) Notify the Chairperson of the Advisory Committee;
 - (iii) Cause a profile of the Diocese to be prepared for presentation at the first meeting of the Advisory Committee.

9. MEMBERSHIP OF ADVISORY COMMITTEE

Membership of the Advisory Committee shall consist of Provincial and Diocesan members.

PROVINCIAL MEMBERS

- (a) The Provincial Members shall be chosen as follows:
 - (i) At each ordinary session of the Provincial Synod, ten bishops, ten clergy, and ten confirmed lay persons of this Province shall be elected by their respective orders. They shall constitute a panel from which shall be chosen, one bishop, one cleric and one lay person to serve on the Advisory Committee in the event of the vacancy of a See, other than the Metropolitan See.
 - (ii) In the case of the Election of the Metropolitan, two bishops, two clergy and two lay persons shall be chosen to serve on the Advisory Committee.

- (iii) The members of the panel shall remain as such until the next ordinary Session of the Provincial Synod, when they shall retire but shall be eligible for re-election.
 - (iv) Licenced Clergy and Lay persons who are Parishioners of a Pastoral Charge (as contemplated in Canon 27.2) in the vacant Diocese shall be excluded from the panel chosen in terms of this section.

DIOCESAN MEMBERS (b) The Diocesan Members shall be chosen as follows:

- (i) At each session of every Diocesan Synod, the following shall be elected to serve as members of the Advisory Committee of the Diocese, and to hold office until the next session of Diocesan Synod, when they shall retire, but shall be eligible for re-election;
 - (aa) A lay Chairperson with a lay deputy, by all houses sitting as one together (the deputy Chairperson being entitled to attend all meetings of the Advisory Committee with the right to speak but not to vote should the Chairperson be present);
 - (bb) Four Clergy, who are licensed in the vacant Diocese, with alternates, elected by the House of Clergy;
 - (cc) Four Lay Parishioners resident in the vacant Diocese, being confirmed communicants of this Province, with alternates, elected by the House of Laity;
- (ii) The Vicar-General, who shall be an ex officio member of the Advisory Committee;
- (iii) Should the lay Chairperson of the Advisory Committee be unable to act prior to the first meeting of the Advisory Committee, the deputy Chairperson shall act as Chairperson. Should the Chairperson be unable to act during or after the first meeting, the Advisory Committee may either call on the deputy Chairperson to act as Chairperson or may elect a Chairperson from among its lay members.

10. SUMMONING THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE

(a) The Metropolitan shall personally, or through the Provincial Executive Officer, as the Metropolitan may decide, notify all eligible members of the panel elected in terms of section 9 (a) of this Canon when the Elective Assembly will meet. The Metropolitan or the Provincial Executive Officer (as the case may be) shall request them to inform the office of the Metropolitan within ten (10) days

whether or not they will be available to serve on the Advisory Committee, if called upon to do so by the Chairperson of the Advisory Committee of the vacant Diocese.

(b) On receipt of this information the Metropolitan or the Provincial Executive Officer, as the case may be, shall inform the Chairperson of the Advisory Committee of the names of the members of the panel so chosen who should be called upon to serve on the Advisory Committee in addition to those members of the Diocese elected in terms of section 9 (b)(i) of this Canon.

11. FUNCTIONS OF ADVISORY COMMITTEE

(a) The Chairperson, upon receiving notification from the Vicar-General in terms of Section 8(d)(ii), shall:

- (i) Write to every pastoral charge of the vacant Diocese inviting clergy or confirmed communicants of the vacant diocese to submit names of candidates, within thirty (30) days, to fill the vacancy.
- (ii) Instruct each Proposer of a candidate to provide in writing;
 - (aa) the consent of the candidate;
 - (bb) the names of two other persons who support the nomination and who have been requested to provide supporting motivation for the said nomination;
 - (cc) motivation for the nomination of the candidate, and a personal profile of the candidate.
- (iii) Summon the Advisory Committee, consisting of both Diocesan and Provincial representatives, to meet within ten (10) days after the deadline for the submission of nominations.
 - (iv) At the first meeting of the Advisory Committee report on the names submitted.
 - (v) Write to all candidates providing a profile of the Diocese and asking for:
 - a Curriculum Vitae a recent medical certificate Referees and their addresses
 - (vi) Invite any member of the Advisory Committee to submit in terms of sub-section 11(a)(ii)(aa) and (cc) within ten days one or more names of candidates.

- (vii) Ask for the recusal of any member of the Advisory Committee who has been nominated, and request the alternate of that member to take such member's place.
- (b) At its first meeting, the Advisory Committee
 - (i) may obtain confidential testimonials from independent referees as well as those suggested by candidates, provided that, should serious adverse information be received in this way from an independent referee, such information shall not be incorporated in a report on the candidate unless the candidate has been afforded an opportunity to reply thereto, after the independent referee has consented to such disclosure (whether on an anonymous basis or not);
 - (ii) shall inform the Metropolitan and the Diocese of names of the candidates.
- (c) At its second meeting which shall take place not later than the day before the Elective Assembly, the Advisory Committee shall:
 - (i) Prepare reports on all the candidates.
 - (ii) Invite persons who are to propose candidates at Elective Assembly to attend a meeting for a briefing.
 - (iii) Submit a list of all candidates together with reports to the President of the Elective Assembly.

12. THE ELECTION OF A BISHOP

- (a) On the day appointed and on each succeeding day on which the Assembly meets, Holy Communion shall be celebrated before the Assembly proceeds to business.
- (b) The Registrar of the Diocese or a deputy appointed by the President shall be in attendance at the meeting.
- (c) The President shall cause the roll to be determined by the Diocesan Registrar or the deputy. The President shall call upon the Registrar or deputy Registrar to certify that only those persons eligible to attend are present and that no person eligible to attend has been excluded. Any informalities, and objections to the attendance of a member, shall be considered and determined by the Assembly. The President shall then ask the Registrar or deputy to declare that a quorum is present; this done, the President shall constitute the Assembly.
- (d) A quorum shall be not less than one half of the total number of the Bishops and the Clergy together and one half of the Lay members.
- (e) Once the Elective Assembly has been constituted its proceedings shall be deemed to be confidential.

- (f) The Assembly shall then proceed to elect one or more secretaries and two or more scrutineers from its members, and a Proctor who shall appear if necessary in the Court of Confirmation.
- (g) The Assembly shall determine its times of meeting.
- (h) The President shall address the Assembly setting out the purpose and procedures of the Assembly, refer to the matter in sub-section (o) of this Canon, and may at any time address the Assembly.
- (i) The Elective Assembly may at any time delegate the choice of a Bishop to the Bishops of the Province, if it so determines by a twothirds majority.
- (j) The President shall furnish the Assembly with a list of the names of all persons considered by the Advisory Committee, after which proposers designated by the Advisory Committee, if available, or any member of the Assembly, may nominate to the vacancy only from the list so furnished, except insofar as is allowed by subsection 12(v). Every nomination shall be seconded by any member of the Elective Assembly.
- (k) All candidates so nominated who are present shall withdraw from the Assembly while the debate takes place, but shall be at hand for any consultation that might be deemed necessary. They shall be entitled to vote and the provisions of sub-section 12(p) shall not apply then in respect of such absence.
- (I) When nominations have ceased, each nominee shall be considered by the Assembly in alphabetical order.
- (m) As each nominee is considered, the President shall call upon a Provincial member of the Advisory Committee so designated to give the Committee's report on the nominee.
- (n) The President shall then invite
 - (i) members of the Assembly to ask for clarification of any point in the Advisory Committee's report, and
 - (ii) the proposer and seconder of the nominee being considered to speak if they so wish and thereafter other members of the Assembly to speak on the nominee.
- (o) The President shall have control of the proceedings of the assembly and may interrupt a speaker should the speaker make statements of a derogatory or defamatory nature and may call for a retraction of such statements or terminate a speaker's address to the Assembly or otherwise make such rules or give such directions in regard to the conduct of the Assembly as seems appropriate to the President in the President's sole and absolute discretion.
- (p) No member who has been absent from the Session or Sessions of the Elective Assembly or any portion thereof during which the reports of the Advisory Committee were presented or when the

nominees were discussed, shall be eligible to attend a subsequent Session of the Assembly except for good cause shown, in the discretion of the President. The failure of a member to attend the Elective Assembly shall not preclude the Assembly from proceeding to election so long as a quorum is present.

- (q) When discussion has ceased, the members shall record their votes. The voting shall be by secret ballot and the President shall have a deliberative vote only. The members shall record their votes by writing on their voting paper either the name of the person for whom they vote, or if they desire to vote for none of the candidates, to write the word "none" or make a cross on the voting paper.
- (r) No nominee shall be deemed to be elected unless that nominee shall have received not less than two-thirds of the total number of votes of the Bishops and Clergy present and voting together, and twothirds of the votes of the House of Laity, voting at the same time.
- (s) If after the first ballot no person has received the necessary majority, successive votes shall be taken in like manner. After the result of any of the first four ballots is announced and no election has been made, the Assembly may on the proposal of any member, which is duly seconded, resolve by a simple majority to reopen discussion on the nominees.
- (t) If after five ballots no election has been made, the candidate with the least votes shall withdraw. This procedure shall be followed at each succeeding ballot up to the seventh ballot, or until only two candidates are left, or until a Bishop is elected at an earlier ballot.
- (u) If after seven ballots no election has been made, the Assembly shall adjourn for a period determined upon by a simple majority of members.
- (v) Upon the Assembly reconvening and unless a delegation is made under sub-section 12(i) the President shall call for fresh nominations. All those whose names were furnished to the Assembly by the President in terms of sub-section 12(j) shall then be eligible for nomination. If the Elective Assembly so determines, it may consider names which have not previously been submitted to the Advisory Committee.
- (w) If within two consecutive days of the constitution of the Assembly no election is made, or if a quorum cannot be found within such period, then the Advisory Committee shall meet and forward to the Metropolitan the names of at least two persons considered by the Committee to be suitable for appointment as Bishop. The Synod of Bishops of the Province may then choose from the names so submitted a Bishop for the vacant See. If, within twenty eight (28) days or such longer period as the Metropolitan may allow, none of those so chosen has accepted, or if no election is confirmed, the Elective Assembly shall be re-convened.

- (x) When an election is made, the declaration of such act shall be signed in duplicate by the President, and one of these declarations shall be transmitted to the Provincial Archives and the other kept in the Registry of the Diocese.
- (y) When a nominee shall have received the requisite majority, but refuses to accept office, balloting shall continue.
- (z) If the election is not confirmed in accordance with provisions of Canon 7 "Of Confirmation of Bishops", a fresh Elective Assembly shall be convened.

13. PROCEDURE NOT PROVIDED FOR

In all matters not specifically provided for in this Canon the procedure to be followed shall be determined by the President who shall be guided by the Model Rules for an Elective Assembly made from time to time by the Provincial Synod, and by the Acts of the Diocese, failing these, by the President, subject to any direction which may be given by the Assembly; but no direction by the Assembly shall invalidate any action previously taken upon a ruling given by the President.

210.2. The Chair of Committee suggested to Synod that it move into Conference to vote on the following two amendments which had been brought to his notice during the previous day when the proposed measures had been published for inspection.

Agendum 1 ELECTION OF BISHOPS CANON 4

Proposed: Mr H Bennett Seconded: Mr K Cremer

Proposed amendment to the final reading namely:

"That the Measure be recommitted" for the Committee to vote upon, without debate, the following additions to avoid ambiguity:

- (i) In section 1(b) the inclusion of the words "... for the purpose of this Canon..." after the word "shall" in line one of the Committee's Report.
- (ii) In section 12(w) the inclusion of the words "... or from any others..." after the word "submitted" in line 9 of the Committee's Report.
- 210.3. Synod resolved itself into Committee.
- 210.4. Committee resolved itself into Synod.
- 210.5. The Chair of Committee reported to Synod that both amendments were accepted by Committee.
- 210.6. The measure (as amended) standing as Agendum 1 was put for final approval.
- 210.7. The measure was put and carried.
- 210.8. Be it so ordered and the rules so altered.

211. Agendum 2: The Bishop of Kimberley and Kuruman

MEASURE TO AMEND ARTICLE XXIV OF THE CONSTITUTION AND CANON 10

Be it Enacted:

- 1. The following clauses be inserted after clause 3 of article XXIV of Constitution with consequential re-numbering of existing clauses.
 - 4. By "Bishop Suffragan" is and shall be meant a bishop, duly elected, consecrated and licensed as provided for in the Constitution and Canons of the CPSA whose ministry is exercised within a specific diocese at the direction of the Bishop of the Diocese in accordance with the provision of the Commission approved by the Synod of Bishops in accordance with the provisions of the Canons.
 - 5. By "Regional or Area Bishop" is and shall be meant a bishop suffragan, duly elected, consecrated and licensed as provided for in the Constitution and Canons of the CPSA with specific episcopal responsibility for a designated geographical region or area within a diocese of the CPSA under the authority of the Bishop of the Diocese, whose Commission has been approved by the Synod of Bishops in accordance with the provisions of the Canons.
 - 6. By "Missionary Bishop" is and shall be meant a bishop duly elected, consecrated and licensed as provided for in the Constitution and Canons of the CPSA for ministry in a specific geographical area either within or beyond the present borders of the CPSA."
 - 7. By "Assistant Bishop" is and shall be meant a bishop holding special Letters of Appointment issued by the Bishop of the Diocese.

NOTE: THIS IS A CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT WHICH WILL HAVE TO BE APPROVED AT THE NEXT SESSION OF SYNOD

- 2. The following changes be made to Canon 10:
 - 1. The heading be amended to read:
 - "Of Bishops Suffragan, Regional or Area Bishops and Assistant Bishops".
 - 2. The existing section 9 be numbered (a) and a new sub-section be added as follows:
 - "(b) A Bishop Suffragan holding a Commission Regional or with episcopal responsibility for a Area Bishops designated geographical region or area within a Diocese under the authority of the Diocesan Bishop shall be known a Regional or area Bishop. However, as a Bishop Suffragan he or she shall have all the rights and obligations of a Bishop Suffragan in terms of this and the other Canons, and any withdrawal or alteration of the Commission shall be effected in accordance with the provisions of sub-section (a) of this section."

- 3. In section 18 the word "retired" shall be deleted before the word "bishop" in the second line, and the words: "....already in episcopal orders who holds...." shall be substituted for the word "holding" in the same line.
- 211.1. The measure, standing as Agendum 2, was put for final approval.
- 211.2. The measure was put and carried.
- 211.3. Be it so ordered and the rules so altered.
- 212. Agendum 3 By the Bishop of Kimberley and Kuruman

MEASURE TO AMEND CANON 21 (Of Formation of Dioceses)

Be it enacted that:

- 1. The words "...within or ..." are to be inserted before the word "beyond" in line 6 of Canon 21 section 1 of Constitution and Canons.
- 2. Section 2 shall be deleted and replaced with the following:

"The Synod of Bishops shall not establish a new Diocese within the Province unless it is satisfied that there is a need for its formation. In addition, it shall be satisfied that any such new Diocese is capable of being governed by synodical government and that its staff and finances are sufficient for it to function as a unit of the Church, save only that this need not apply to a Missionary Diocese."

- 212.1. The measure standing as Agendum 3 was put for final approval.
- 212.2. The measure was put and carried.
- 212.3 Be it so ordered and the rules so altered.
- 213. Agendum. 6. The Bishop of Christ the King

MOTION TO AMEND ARTICLE XX1V.6 OF THE CONSTITUTION OF THE CPSA AND VARIOUS SECTIONS OF THE CANONS IN REGARD TO CONFIRMED COMMUNICANTS

Be it enacted that:

- 1. All the words in Article XXIV.6 of the Constitution be deleted and replaced by:
- "By "Confirmed Communicant of the Church of this Province" is and shall be meant a person who has been confirmed in the Anglican Communion, or in another Church in full communion with it, or who has been formally received into membership of the Church of this Province, and shall have received the Holy Communion three times at least during the preceding year."
- 2. The word "Confirmed" be inserted before the word "Communicant" in Article VI of the Constitution, and in Canons 1.3: 4.5(e); 4.6(a); 4.10(a) 7.3; 27.2(a); 29.1; 36.5(c); 38.3; 39.2.

NOTE: THIS IS A CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT WHICH WILL HAVE TO BE APPROVED AT THE NEXT SESSION OF SYNOD

- 213.1. The measure standing as Agendum 6 was put for final approval at this session of Synod.

214. Agendum. 5. The Bishop of Christ the King

MOTION TO AMEND ARTICLE XX1V.6 OF THE CONSTITUTION OF THE CPSA IN REGARD TO REPRESENTATION OF MEMBERS OF UNITED CHURCHES AT SYNODS ETC

Be it enacted that:

Article XX1V.6 of the Constitution be amended by the addition of the words:

"......; for the purposes of election to Provincial Synod, Provincial Standing Committee, Diocesan Synods and Elective Assemblies, members of United Churches constituted under the auspices of the Church Unity Commission shall be deemed to be confirmed communicants."

Be it Enacted that:

the following Rubric in the Order of Confirmation in the Book of Common Prayer be deleted, viz

"And there shall none be admitted to Holy Communion, until such time as he be confirmed, or be ready and desirous to be confirmed."

NOTE: THIS IS A CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT WHICH WILL HAVE TO BE APPROVED AT THE NEXT SESSION OF SYNOD.

Be it enacted that:

The words "being of the age of eighteen and upwards" in Canon 27 sections 1 and 3 be deleted.

- 216. The measure standing as Agendum 8 was put for final approval.
- 216.2. Debate on the measure followed.
- 216.3. Ms M Sithole proposed that the measure be referred to Committee.
- 216.3.1. This procedural motion was put and lost.
- 216.4. The measure was put.
- 216.4.1. A vote by Houses was called for
- 216.4.2. House of Laity For 26 Against 33
- 216.4.3. The measure was lost.
- 216.5. At 12h00 the President called Synod to prayer. The Ven C Gregorowski led prayers for the children of the church and our nations.

217. Agendum 10: The Bishop of Christ the King

MEASURE TO AMEND CANON 43 (OF THE PROVINCIAL STANDING COMMITTEE)

Be it enacted that:

Canon 43.3 (a) (i) be amended by the insertion after the words "....their respective orders" of a semi-colon and the words "also all Bishops Suffragan, who shall have the right to speak but not to vote."

- 217.1. The measure standing as Agendum 10 was put for final approval.
- 217.2. The measure was put and carried.
- 217.3. Be it so ordered and the rules so altered.
- 218. Agendum 14: By the Bishop of George

MEASURE TO AMEND CANON 1 (OF THE PROVINCIAL SYNOD) AND CANON 43 (OF THE PROVINCIAL STANDING COMMITTEE)

Be it enacted that:

- 1. The words: "In addition to the representatives in (a) and (b) of this section..." in the first line of Section 2 (b) are to be deleted.
- 2. A new sub-section (c) is to be added to Canon 1 section 2 to read as follows:

Each Diocese may send to Provincial Synod a Provincial Office bearer of the Mothers' Union to represent the Mothers' Union and a Provincial Office bearer of the Anglican Women's Fellowship to represent the Anglican Women's Fellowship. Each such member shall be a Communicant over the age of 18 (eighteen) years and at the time of the election shall hold office either as president or vice president of the Mothers' Union or the Anglican Women's Fellowship respectively. Furthermore each such member must reside ordinarily in the Diocese in which the member is elected, and shall be elected in that Diocese and no other. The Bishop of the Diocese in giving a certificate in terms of Section 6 of this Canon 1 shall certify that such representative of the Mothers' Union and the Anglican Women's Fellowship comply with the requirements set out above."

3. That there be added to Canon 43 Section 3 (a) a new sub-section (iii) to read as follows:

"The Mother's Union and the Anglican Women's Fellowship shall each be entitled to send one representative to Provincial Standing Committee. Each such representative shall be a Communicant over the age of 18 (eighteen) years and an office bearer of the Provincial Executive in the organisation concerned and must ordinarily reside in one of the Dioceses of the Church of the Province of Southern Africa. Each such representative shall have all the rights and privileges of elected representatives including the power to vote."

- 4. That upon the passing of the above proposals the Resolutions of Permanent Force of the Provincial Synod numbered " 2 Mothers' Union" and "3 Anglican Women's Fellowship" passed in 1976 and 1979 respectively, shall have added to them in each case the words: "...in cases where there is no representation at any session of Synod in terms of Canon 1.2".
- 218.1. The measure, standing as Agendum 14, was put for final approval.
- 218.2. Debate on the wording of Section 3 of the measure followed.
- 218.3. Synod resolved itself into Committee.
- 218.4. Committee resolved itself into Synod.
- 218.5. The Chair of Committee reported to Synod on the work of Committee on Agendum 14.

Committee had decided the last line of section 3 be deleted and replaced with:

- "the rights and privileges of elected representatives including the right to speak but not to vote."
- 218.6. The measure (as amended) was put and carried.
- 218.7. Be it so ordered and the rules so altered.
- 219. Agendum: 15 The Bishop of Pretoria

MEASURE TO AMEND THE FOLLOWING CANONS - CANON 1 "OF PROVINCIAL SYNOD"- CANON 18 "OF THE AGE AT WHICH PERSONS MAY BE ADMITTED TO THE ORDERS OF BISHOP, PRIEST AND DEACON" - CANON 43 "OF PROVINCIAL STANDING COMMITTEE"

Be it enacted that:

1. A new subsection be added to section 2 of Canon 1, to read as follows:

Each Diocese shall procure that its permanent deacons holding the Bishop's licence meet to elect one or more representatives to Provincial Synod in proportion to their number, according to the following scale:

No of	Representatives to
Permanent Deacons	Provincial Synod
1 - 10	1
11 - 50	2
51 and over	3

For this purpose such representatives are to be members of the Permanent Diaconate in that Diocese, save only that if there is no Permanent Diaconate in that Diocese, then no additional representatives shall be sent. The Bishop of the Diocese in giving a certificate in terms of Canon 1 section 6 shall certify that such representatives (or absence thereof) comply with the requirements as set out above"

- 2. (a) The heading to Canon 18 is to be amended by deleting the words: "The age at which persons may be admitted ..." and replacing them with the word: "Admission".
- (b) Section 3 of Canon 18 is to be amplified by the addition of the following:
- "A Deacon, whose vocation, as far as may presently be discerned, is to the permanent diaconate, shall be a permanent deacon, and a deacon intending to seek admission as a Priest shall be a transitional deacon, subject to written notice of such intention in each case having been given to the Diocesan Bishop concerned and the Bishop consenting thereto."
- 3. Subsection 3 (a) of Canon 43 shall be amplified by the addition of a new part (iii) as follows:
- "(a)(iii) The Metropolitan shall, after due consideration, nominate two representatives of the Permanent Diaconate to Provincial Standing Committee, who shall have been representatives thereof at the previous session of Provincial Synod (or who are permanent deacons in any Diocese of the Province should there have been no such representatives at the said previous session of Provincial Synod). These nominated representatives shall have all the rights and privileges of elected representatives including the power to vote."
- 219.1. The measure, standing as Agendum 15, was put for final approval.
- 219.2. The measure was put and carried.
- 219.3. Be it so ordered and the rules so altered.

220. Agendum: 21 The Metropolitan

MEASURE REGARDING INVESTMENT IN OPTIONS AND FUTURES, BANKS AND BUILDING SOCIETIES (Canons 42 and 46)

Be it enacted as follows:

- 1. Add a new sub-clause (ii) to sub-section (b) of section 8 of Canon 42, with subsequent renumbering, to read as follows:
- (ii) in futures, options or other derivative investment instruments, provided that the extent of such investments in relation to each portfolio are within the limits established from time to time by the Provincial Trusts Board, which limits shall be ratified annually by Provincial Standing Committee."
- 2. Insert a new second proviso before the existing second proviso in line 5 of section 11(b) reading as follows:

Canon 42 (8) of these Canons and Constitution".

SUB-SECTIONS 17(b) and 25(m) of CANON 46 be deleted.

8. PURCHASE OF PAST SERVICE BENEFITS

THE PROPOSAL

Be it enacted that:

CANON 46 (SECTION 17(d)) be amended by the deletion of all the words following the words and numeral "age of 48" at the beginning of line 14 of the section.

9. PAYMENT OF CONTRIBUTIONS

THE PROPOSALS

Be it enacted that:

CANON 46 (SECTIONS 20 (d) (e) and (g)) be amended as follows:

- (i) The word "annual" in line 1 of Sub-section (d) be deleted.
- (ii) All the words following the word "Board" in line 3 and preceding the word "and" in line 4 of Sub section (d) be deleted and the following words be substituted therefor:
 - " in monthly instalments payable within seven days of the month following the month for which the contributions are due".
- (iii) The words contained in Sub-section (e) be deleted in their entirety and the following words be substituted therefore:
 - "In any case where the monthly contribution shall not have been fully paid within the period prescribed in Sub-section (d) above, the amount unpaid shall bear interest at a rate to be determined from time to time by the Board, from the last day of the month for which the contribution was due until the date of payment, and the amount of such interest shall be payable by the Diocese in addition to the annual contributions due in terms of Sub-sections (a) and (b) of this Section."
- (iv) The words following the word "Diocese" in line 3 and ending with the word and comma "later," in line 6 of Sub-section (g) be deleted.
- (v) Sub-section (g) be ended with a new paragraph reading as follows:

 "The proportionate annual contribution thus calculated shall be payable in monthly instalments subject to the same terms and conditions as set out in subsections (d) and (e) above."

10. PENSION BENEFITS UPON NORMAL RETIREMENT

THE PROPOSAL

Be it enacted that:

CANON 46 (SECTION 22(a)(i)(2)) be amended by the extension of the existing sentence with a comma and the words, ", plus an additional four and two - sevenths per cent of the pensionable emolument in the year of retirement."

11. SURVIVORSHIP PENSION

Be it enacted that:

CANON 46 (SECTION 22(C)) be amended as follows:

The full stop at the end of the last sentence be deleted and the sentence be continued with the words "and payment shall cease on the death of the surviving spouse."

13. DEFERMENT OF BENEFITS

THE PROPOSALS

Be it enacted that:

CANON 46 (SECTION 25(a)) be amended as follows:

- (i) The words "shall be obliged to" in line 2 of Sub-section (a) be deleted and replaced with the word "may."
- (ii) The words "provided that a Bishop of the Province may defer his or her own retirement" in lines 4 and 5 of Sub-section (a) be deleted and replaced with the words "but may, if he or she so desires, defer receipt of such benefit until age 70 at the latest."
- (iii) The final sentence of Sub-section (a) be deleted in its entirety and replaced by the following final sentence: "In the case of a member who so defers the receipt of his or her benefits, the pension and death benefits applicable at retirement as well as the pension and death benefits applicable during the period of deferment shall be determined by the Actuary; provided that the death benefit during the period of deferment shall not be less than the death benefit applicable immediately prior to his or her reaching normal retirement age."

14 EARLY RETIREMENT

THE PROPOSALS

Be it enacted that:

CANON 46 (SECTION 25(b)) be amended as follows:

- (i) The words "of not less than 60 years" in lines 2 and 3 be deleted.
- (ii) After the word "age" in line 2 the sentence be completed by insertion of the words "within 10 years of normal retirement age."

15. UNCLAIMED MONIES

THE PROPOSALS

Be it enacted that:

CANON 46 (SECTION 25(j)) be amended as follows:

The word "twenty" in line 1 be deleted and the word "five' be substituted therefor, and the words "there shall......claim against the Fund" shall be deleted.

- 5. Report to each session of the Synod of Bishops, PSC and Provincial Synod until PSC or Provincial Synod decides otherwise.

FAMILY PLANNING:

That this Synod

- 1. Acknowledging that parenthood is one of the most important and joyous responsibilities given to us,
- 2. and aware that we need to improve the quality of life of families, but that this is hindered in many parts of the world where present population growth is placing serious strain on the natural environment. and the natural resources of the world on which all life is dependent, as more and more people are needing to be fed, clothed, housed, educated;
- 3. states that family planning and the use of contraceptives is not only permissible but is necessary and in accordance with God's plan that we should be responsible in caring for our families, one another and God's world.
- 246.1. The Dean of the Province proposed, with Mrs M Nkwe seconding, an amendment to replace "necessary" in 3 with "desirable".
- 246.2. The Amendment was put and carried with one dissenting voice.
- 246.3. Agendum 54, as amended, was put and carried.
- 246.4. Synod **agreed** that the Metropolitan write to the newly-appointed members of the Land Commission.
- 247. Ms M Sithole read a greeting from the ACC.

- 1.1 As at 31 March 1995 10 dioceses were in arrear with CPF assessments to a total of R273 715.
- 1.2 Of these, 6 dioceses owed R258 209 and 1 owed R145 114.

Is anything being done by the CPSA to encourage Anglican employers to improve the lot of their domestic workers?

Answer The Provincial Executive Officer

We are unable to answer this question as each Diocese could not be consulted at Synod.

249.3. Question: The Revd S Makalima

- 1. Where are the academic records, and especially AFTS of FEDSEM stored?
- 2. Would it be possible for all the academic records of St Peter's College, including AFTS, to be placed at the College of the Transfiguration to facilitate the process of obtaining transcripts?

Answer: The Revd Canon L Pato

- 1. The records of the Diploma in Theology offered by the Joint Diploma Board are kept by the Registrar of that Board. We do not know where the records of the AFTS are stored.
- 2. All things are possible under God. The Rector of Transfiguration has it in hand.

250. **MINUTES:**
