13. S. O. I. in Retreat - Mr Bowen came to play with the boys at 5.30 - he is trying to form a Scout patrol.

14 Miss. Exley came with Mrs Athorpe to see the School. V. Dorgan developed members and joined the party in the hut. F. H. D. took services, Preparation for Communion at 7.30

15 For the Assumption of B. & M. Mass at 6.20 - hymns and incense. S. Faith came to morning tea - S. M. B. to afternoon tea. Blackie was set on 13 eggs. Father came for Confession at 3.30. Programme for next day

16 Superior came to tea. P. Thomas came in the evening about the

17 We had a school day in order that we should greet General Smuts. Began school at 8. At 11 we went down to the Park Green where the other schools etc assembled to greet the General. He arrived about 11.45. We then hurried back and lined up on the steps.

He came accompanied by several men - the door girls rang the bells and he stayed a few minutes chatting. At 12.10 we went again to the green and he addressed the meeting for a short time before he left at about 1.

Trinity 19. Again we did not go to Church, had Matins in Chapel at 10.

20. Sister Christian went to sleep at the Cottage. S<sup>r</sup> Olive Irene also went there before leaving for the Transvaal. S<sup>r</sup> Annette came to S. Augustines. Superior came to morning tea. F<sup>r</sup> Horton Smith played games with the boys in the evening.
21. Sister Olive Irene came to say goodbye. Rev: Bowen came to take charge of boys in the evening.
22. Rev: R. Bowen called. F<sup>r</sup> Horton Smith came to talk to the children in Chapel at 7.30.
23. The Principal of the Tsolo Coloured School invited our Boys to play football against his junior team. Unable to do so owing to quarantine for mumps. F<sup>r</sup> Horton Smith and the Rev: R. Bowen called. S. A went to S. Marys to tea.

1935.

- Aug 24. Mass at 6.20. All children present.
- 25<sup>th</sup> S<sup>r</sup> Esmé took the elder girls to Red Hill Bush to get Arum lily roots to plant by the furrow. The boys went to watch football match between S. Cuthberts Native and Tsolo coloured.
- 26<sup>th</sup> Only three children went to Church, others still in quarantine for mumps. S<sup>r</sup> Esmé took the children for a walk. Miss Walbrond came to dinner. Classes as usual. The Chaplain came to talk over arrangements for S. Augustine's Day. Harvest Thanksgiving in Church.
- 27<sup>th</sup> Solemn Evensong at 6.45. F<sup>r</sup> Horton Smith preached also heard childrens confessions.
- 28<sup>th</sup> S. Augustine's Day. Sung Mass at 6.15. Superior Miss Walbrond and M<sup>r</sup> Ewens came. Miss Walbrond took childrens breakfast. Superior gave children jam & oranges. We went for a picnic at 9.30. M<sup>r</sup> Bowen & M<sup>r</sup> Ewens came to amuse the boys. Returned to tea. Sports until 6. Miss Aythorpe Miss Huskisson and Miss Raikes called. Miss Walbrond came to supper.

4<sup>th</sup> Superior and F<sup>th</sup> Thompson came. The former played the piano while children danced. Refreshment-supper at 6.30. S<sup>th</sup> Dorothea came to tea, Sister Superior and S<sup>th</sup> Editha in the evening. The former gave away Sports prizes.

29<sup>th</sup> S. A. in Retreat. Wet day. Miss Walbrond came to take evening charge. Gertrude developed mumps

31<sup>st</sup> S<sup>th</sup> Christian came for the day. Angus and Dorothy, and Eunice went to bed with mumps

Sept 1<sup>st</sup> F<sup>th</sup> Horton Smith came for Mattius & Address. S<sup>th</sup> Faith came to morning tea.

2<sup>nd</sup> Mary, Dorcen, and Gracie went to bed with mumps. Nancy also in bed.

3<sup>rd</sup> Charlie in bed with mumps. F<sup>th</sup> Thompson brought Messrs Moseuthals representatives to see the school.

4<sup>th</sup> Frank Stafford in bed with mumps. All children up except Charlie & Nancy. Day of Intercession in Church for a peaceful settlement of the Italian Abyssinian dispute.

6<sup>th</sup> G. Marillies in bed with mumps. Miss W. to supper

Mass 6.20. Sung.

Sept 7<sup>th</sup>

S. Cuthberts Day Kept. Children out of quarantine went to see the feasting in the morning. All went to the concert in the afternoon. Dance in the evening.

8<sup>th</sup>

7 of the Nativity. Children out of quarantine went to Mass. Miss Walbrond came to dinner S.E. & S.A. took children out for picnic tea. No classes. Mr & Mrs McPherson came to see their children.

9<sup>th</sup>

Miss Raikes called and offered plants for the garden. Sister Mary Baptista came to tea.

10<sup>th</sup>

S<sup>r</sup> Esme went to intercessions.

11<sup>th</sup>

Mass at 6.20. Fr<sup>r</sup> Horton Smith. S<sup>r</sup> Annette went to S. Marys for childrens birthday Mass. S<sup>r</sup> E and S<sup>r</sup> A. went down in the evening.

12<sup>th</sup>

Fr<sup>r</sup> Ley called to give advice about Miss Deavers hut &c. Children danced in the evening.

13<sup>th</sup>

Children went for a walk with S<sup>r</sup> Esme. Fr<sup>r</sup> Ley called to offer his services for Sunday. Sister Superior came to tea.

- Sept. 15<sup>th</sup> F<sup>r</sup> - Day came for Mattius and Sermon.  
Boys went to Tsole without permission. were sent back by M<sup>r</sup> Oliver arrived at 6.30 p.m.
- 16<sup>th</sup> Boys quite good & settled down quietly to work  
Kosie went away to see a D<sup>r</sup>. Lily Jane came to work
- 17<sup>th</sup> S<sup>r</sup> Annette went to see M<sup>r</sup> Davies re-shelves for Vestments &c.
- 18<sup>th</sup> M<sup>r</sup> & M<sup>rs</sup> Davies came to arrange for Richard Harper to come and stay from Oct-2<sup>nd</sup>. F<sup>r</sup> Horton Smith came to take charge of boys
- 19<sup>th</sup> M<sup>r</sup> Davies came to see about Chapel shelves &c. F<sup>r</sup> Horton Smith came for service in Chapel at 7.45.
- 19<sup>th</sup> Mass at 6.15. F<sup>r</sup> Thomson called. Sister Superior came to tea. Children danced to the gramophone. F<sup>r</sup> Horton Smith came.
- 20<sup>th</sup> S<sup>r</sup> Annette in Retreat
- 21<sup>st</sup> S<sup>r</sup> Christian in Retreat. S<sup>r</sup> Doris came to tea.
- 22<sup>nd</sup> S A took 23 children to Mass at 7. for the first time this term. Sister Mary Baptista came to tea. S A. took children for a walk.

1935.

Sept 23<sup>rd</sup> School meeting at 10.30. a. m. F<sup>r</sup> Ley, M<sup>r</sup> Adkins, Sister Superior, S<sup>r</sup> Christian and Sister Annette present.

24<sup>th</sup> F<sup>r</sup> Horton Smith came to see the boys about previous disobedience. The latter were again troublesome before supper.

F<sup>r</sup> Horton Smith came again in the evening and dealt with them. F<sup>r</sup> Ley called.

25<sup>th</sup> F<sup>r</sup> Horton Smith called. Boys quite good.

The Chaplain gave an address in Chapel 7.45

26<sup>th</sup> Mass 6.20. M<sup>r</sup> Ewins came.

Girls danced to the gramophone in the evening. The Chaplain & M<sup>r</sup> Ewins came. Lily Jane left. Edith began work.

27<sup>th</sup> S<sup>r</sup> Dorothea came to stay. Did clay work with boys. The Chaplain called & said M<sup>r</sup> Baines would come with lantern slides on Saturday.

28<sup>th</sup> S<sup>r</sup> Esme' in Retreat. Sister Dorothea, S<sup>r</sup> Christian and S<sup>r</sup> Annette went to Quarterly meeting.

S<sup>r</sup> Dorothea took children to get arum lily's. M<sup>r</sup> Bowers came with the Chaplain to show

Sept: lantern slides in the evening. 7<sup>th</sup> day called.

29<sup>th</sup> 7 of S. Michael and All Angels. Children out of quarantine went to Mass at 9. S<sup>r</sup> Dorothea and S<sup>r</sup> Esme took the children to bathe.

30<sup>th</sup> 7<sup>th</sup> Horton-Smith called.

Oct: 1<sup>st</sup> M<sup>r</sup> Bowen came to take the children out.

S<sup>r</sup> Dorothea gave him a kite to fly, unfortunately it got broken in the fall after the 1<sup>st</sup> flight. S<sup>r</sup> Christian not well.

2<sup>nd</sup> The Chaplain came for Solemn Evensong and Address.

3<sup>rd</sup> Mass 6.20. Children went to bathe

4<sup>th</sup> 7<sup>th</sup> Horton Smith and M<sup>r</sup> Bowen called.

The Rev: Adair and friends came to see the M<sup>r</sup> Persons.

5<sup>th</sup> S<sup>r</sup> Bowen came with magic lantern, in the evening. S. Marys and S. Margarets Holiday girls came. Boys very troublesome and did not come. 7<sup>th</sup> Thompson sent them to bed. The girls did action songs and S<sup>r</sup> Christian told the story of Alice-in-wonderland illustrated by slides

Oct 6<sup>th</sup> Children out of Quauantime. All went to Mass at 9 o'clock except Angus who was not well.

Oct 7<sup>th</sup> Sister Christian & Sr Faith S. of S.J.D. Maritzburg took the children for a picnic, dance in the evening. Sr Esme & S.A. went to S. Marys for dinner & tea. Sr Euphemia & Sr Rachel Mary arrived from England at 12.30.

9<sup>th</sup> Fr Horton Smith came for Evensong and Address.

10<sup>th</sup> No Mass. Canon two of his friends and Mr Wheeler came to see the school.

11<sup>th</sup> Miss Walbrond came to discuss Wayfarers Badges etc. Fr Superior came to offer to take two little boys in the car to football match in Tsolo. S. Augustines played Tsolo coloured boys. The game ended a draw.

12<sup>th</sup> on Saturday. Sr D. came to take charge. Fr Horton Smith came in the evening.

13<sup>th</sup> All children went to Mass at 7. Miss Walbrond came to dinner & class. Fr Ley took charge after Supper.

14<sup>th</sup> Sr Rachel Mary came to take charge after supper.

Oct 15<sup>th</sup> The Chaplain called.

16<sup>th</sup> Miss Raikes and Miss Walrond came for wayfarers meeting. Miss R. taught the girls country dancing. The Chaplain gave an address.

17<sup>th</sup> No Mass. Fr. Horton Smith came to deal with boys in the evening.

18<sup>th</sup> S. Luke's Day. All went to Mass at 8-30.

Three boys ran away from school, a fourth followed later. They were brought back in the evening by Mr. Adkins.

All whipped by Fr. Thompson. Douglas not allowed to return.

19<sup>th</sup> Two boys whipped for disobedience.

20<sup>th</sup> Children went to Mass at 7.

Very troublesome in the afternoon.

Superior came to stay, saw the big girls. Fr. Ley came after supper, children had gramophone.

21<sup>st</sup> Sister Superior took early work and several meals. Sr. Annette went to S. Mary's to sleep and to have a days retreat.

22<sup>nd</sup> Sr. Annette in Retreat, used the Diurnal for the first time.
