Dear Miss Horrell,

Thank you for referring to us your Draft Summary of the Liberal Party policy. I return herewith a revised draft which I suggest you might use.

The third paragraph of your draft, dealing with the African National Congress, has been omitted, because it seems, with respect, that this is somewhat out of place in a statement of policy as it was a resolution on a matter of tactics in the day to day political struggle which is already somewhat out of date.

It would be unfortunate if the impression were created that the Liberal Party sees eye to eye with the Congress on all questions. We do not. For example we have set our face against the boycott of schools, organised by the Congress.

In regard to the Franchise, I think it is important that in addition to stating the Party's long-term objectives, a policy statement should also indicate our immediate aims, and for this reason I have added Mrs. Ballinger's motion of 22.2.55.
