Under and by virtue of the powers in him vested by sections *twenty-two* and *twenty-three* of the Medical, Dental and Pharmacy Act, No. 13 of 1928, and after considering the recommendations of the South African Medical Council, His Excellency the Governor-General has been pleased to approve of the Regulations promulgated under Government Notice No. 107 of the 16th January, 1931, as subsequently amended, being further amended as follows:—

*Regulations 1 and 2.*

In the case of each regulation after the word "midwifery" (to be followed by a: instead of a:—) add—

Provided further that such degrees, diplomas or certificates shall only be recognised for registration if the course of study in professional subjects covered a period of at least five academic years and, in addition, the last three years of professional study for admission to the examination for such degree, diploma or certificate were taken at a university or medical school in the country or state in which the degree, diploma or certificate was granted:—

*Regulations 3 and 4.*

In the case of each regulation after the word "dentist" (to be followed by a: instead of a:—) add—

Provided that such degrees, diplomas or certificates shall only be recognised for registration if the course of study in professional subjects covered a period of at least four academic years and, in addition, the last two years of professional study for admission to the examination for such degree, diploma or certificate were taken at a university or dental school in the country or state in which the degree, diploma or certificate was granted:—

# The Christian Council of South Africa.

An Association of Churches and Missionary Societies of South Africa  
for the Extension of the Kingdom of God.

---

## A STATEMENT.

Following upon the Edinburgh Conference of 1910, Dr. John R. Mott initiated the formation in the orient of National Christian Councils which have functioned with increasing usefulness ever since. These Christian Councils in the various mission fields of the world act as a bond of fellowship between the different churches and missionary agencies, and accomplish important results in the coordination of christian work. Each of them is affiliated to the International Missionary Council, which cultivates and expresses the unity of the whole world-wide enterprise of christian missions. Similar Councils have since been set up for the Near East and for certain parts of Africa. South Africa is the latest, if not the last country to set up such a Christian Council.

The first definite steps were taken in the General Missionary Conference of 1928, when an invitation was extended to Dr. Mott to visit South Africa for the purpose. After a series of conferences under Dr. Mott's leadership in 1934 a Continuation Committee was chosen to do the preparatory work, and at Bloemfontein on June 24th—25th, 1936, the Christian Council of South Africa was established, and already 27 churches and missionary societies have become affiliated. A copy of the Constitution may be had upon application to the Secretary.

The Council now desires to present to the constituent bodies and to the churches generally a brief summary of its activities and purposes, together with the budget for 1937. This statement is issued by the Advisory Committee.

1. The first major undertaking of the Council was the bringing to South Africa of Dr. E. Stanley Jones. All general matter pertaining to Dr. Jones' visit, including all the details of travel bookings and all general programme arrangements, correspondence with local committees, etc., were dealt with through the Council's Secretary. Appreciation of the man and his message has come from every centre visited, with the hope expressed in several instances that the churches of South Africa may do something unitedly to give expression to the great principles which he so eloquently and so graciously set forth. Similar visits by great servants of God from other lands should be possible from time to time under the auspices

of the Council. It will be gratifying to know that it will be possible from the offerings taken at Dr. Jones' meetings, to send a substantial contribution to the work of his Ashram at Lucknow. This will be a token of our appreciation and a gesture of fellowship with our fellow christians in India.

2. The Committees provided for at Bloemfontein are being formed and are shaping their programmes for report at the first meeting of the Executive to be held in Pretoria on Oct. 14th. The membership of these committees was not nominated off-hand, but a convener was appointed in each instance, with instructions to associate with himself a group of persons especially competent for the work of his committee. The Committees will deal with Education, Evangelism, Literature, Medical Work, Native Welfare, Women's Work and Youth Movements. (The names of the Conveners are appended to this Statement.) Strong groups are being formed which may be expected to accomplish much in the coordination of effort in each of these aspects of christian work.

3. The Secretary has begun a series of visits to different parts of the country in the interest of the Council. He has addressed, inter alia, the Transvaal Missionary Association, the Transvaal Presbytery, and the Commission of the Congregational Union of South Africa in Durban, and has visited certain missionary centres in Natal to become familiar at first hand with some of the problems of missionary work. He plans other visits in the near future to other areas, and will present the cause of the Council at several church conferences and synods during the next few months. He has been provided with an office in Pretoria, which should gradually become a clearing house for cooperative missionary activity and a store-house of important missionary information on every aspect of the missionary enterprise in South Africa.

4. Plans are in hand for the compilation of a Directory of South African Missions, through the cooperation of the World Dominion Press, whose representative, Mr. Kenneth Grubb, who visited South Africa during 1936 to initiate activity in this direction, will probably return during 1937 in connection with this undertaking.

5. It is expected that after the annual assemblies of the churches, most of which meet during the next two months, those churches which have not already intimated their acceptance of membership in the Council will do so, and that the Council will then become a united front of all the churches for the purposes so well set forth in the Chairman's address at Bloemfontein, viz. the establishment of a bureau of information on the missionary enterprise in South Africa; the maintenance of close relations with the International Missionary Council; the coordination of missionary effort, so far as is possible, in all lines of service; the development of a common view point on important matters pertaining to the welfare of the non-European races of South Africa, so that the churches may speak with one voice and thus make their weight felt in the directing of the country's policies and the

formation of its attitudes in such matters; in short, " united thinking, planning, intercession and action for the Kingdom of God and of His Christ."

6. South Africa will now be officially represented for the first time at a world meeting of the International Missionary Council, and the Christian Council of South Africa is entitled to send nine delegates to the next world meeting which will be held during 1938 at Hangchow, near Shanghai, in China. It is suggested that churches and other bodies nominate persons and find their expenses. In addition to the nine official delegates it is hoped that others interested in this work will find it possible to attend the Hangchow Conference.

### THE BUDGET.

In presenting the budget for 1937 we would remind the churches that it provides on a minimum basis for the expenses of the Secretariat and the Executive. Any curtailment of expected income means curtailment of activities. Certain friends have assisted in tiding us over the period of organization, but the churches should assume from the beginning responsibility for the Council's expenses.

It will be seen that estimated expenses exceed estimated income by £20. For 1937 this need cause no concern, as the Council has assistance from certain friends to make good such a deficit.

The budget must be on an experimental basis to start with, and expenditure will be carefully watched by the Executive to keep it within available income.

- (1) By acquainting yourself with its activities and purposes ;
- (2) By realising that it is an association of churches and missionary societies of South Africa **for the extension of the Kingdom of God ;**
- (3) By upholding it in your prayers ;

- (4) By sending to the office any information, books, newspaper cuttings (state source and date), current issues of magazines, etc., calculated to assist the Secretary or the Committees ;
- (5) By affording the Secretary the opportunity of visiting places and attending meetings of interest, addressing bodies or conducting services ;
- (6) By remembering that the Secretary does not rely on the machinery of organisation to do the work, but looks for its progress to God-guided personalities.

The Advisory Committee commends the Council to your interest and prayers.

POPULATIONS SERVED BY MISSION HOSPITALS.

At the request of the Chairman of the National Health Services Commission, an enquiry was addressed by this Council to Mission Hospitals in the following terms :-

"Will you be kind enough to indicate what you estimate to be the population of the area in which your hospital provides the only medical services available to the African people."

The following information has been received in answer to the enquiry.

1. The total population served by these 22 hospitals exceeds 1,400,000, exclusive of the populations of Cape Town and Johannesburg.

In Cape Town, three Mission Hospitals meet special needs of the non-European population; and in the Johannesburg area most of the maternity work among non-Europeans is done by one Mission Hospital.

2. It is regretted that figures from three Mission Hospitals in Zululand, one in Natal, and one in the Transkei, are not available.

RESOLUTIONS OF CONFERENCE ON CRIPPLE CARE

June 6th 1939

1. That the Nuffield Gift should in no way be used to relieve the Union Government or Provincial Administrations of their ordinary responsibilities.
2. That funds be found for the work of the National Council either by the setting aside from the Nuffield Gift of a fund for endowment or by an annual grant of certain monies for this purpose.
3. That the development of the national service for cripple care can begin with the existing units which should be assisted to develop their work and organisation in accordance with the national policy.

That in view of the fact that Cape Town and Johannesburg have medical schools, the national scheme should aim at the establishment of complete orthopaedic units at these centres, but the four Provincial Administrations be urged to co-operate in ensuring that these two centres are able to provide facilities for all Provinces and to arrange that patients are sent to such centres from other Provinces until such time as the other Provinces can institute orthopaedic units of their own.

4. That whilst the general principle is accepted that adult cripples are best treated in general hospitals in conjunction with all other specialised facilities, and that children be treated as far as possible in special departments and institutions apart from adults, this Conference recommends that a few beds be provided for adult cases of surgical tuberculosis in open air institutions.
5. That the principle of financial responsibility which has been accepted by the State in the case of Blind Persons should also apply in the case of crippled persons in need of education and vocational training.
6. Orthopaedic cases, to secure the maximum benefit from treatment, require surgical supervision for many years. This must therefore involve the development of an after-care surgical service directed from an orthopaedic centre which, in South Africa, must cover widely scattered populations.

This Conference feels that this part of the national service will require special attention in the future, and that the needs of the rural areas must be met in this regard by the authorities responsible for orthopaedic treatment in co-operation with the District Medical and Nursing Services.

The after-care service should include provision for co-operation with employers of labour, the Department of Labour, and voluntary organisations to ensure the measure of occupation or employment considered practicable and desirable by the clinic surgeon.

7. In order to provide post graduate training in orthopaedic nursing for bilingual South African nurses, it will be necessary to import a matron, a sister-tutor, and an after-care sister, specially qualified in orthopaedic work.

8. Scholarships for medical men to be considered at a later date only if a position of extreme urgency arises.
9. Orthopaedic cases are recognised, like tuberculosis, as belonging particularly to the poverty stricken group. It is therefore necessary that this service be partly salaried by the State and the Nuffield Gift, as far as surgical attention is concerned. The number of orthopaedic surgeons required at each centre would depend on the size of the unit.
10. That all the recommendations of this Conference apply to non-Europeans as well as to Europeans.
