22 Sr. Superior & Sr. Euphemia left for E. London at 3 p.m. Sr. Rachel went up to Sr. Augustines for her rest after Vespers. Sr. Jane returned from Umata 8 p.m.

23 Workers Quarterly Meeting in the school not the usual place.

24 Mass in C.S.M.V. Chapel, S.J.B. Chapel & Hospital. Tea in the Parlour. Mr. St. Croix invited.

26 Sr. Dorothea, Sr. Rachel & Sr. Christian went out for lunch picnic on Red Hill.

- 19<sup>th</sup> 20<sup>th</sup> S. Superior, S. Rose & S. Euphemia in Retreat. Fr. Callaway & S. Alberta by car to Qaqala on a mission of help to Selina Mthokwiswa, alleged communicant training as a witch doctor.
- S. Euphemia to sleep at S. Augustines. Heavy rain began in night.
- 20<sup>th</sup> All the Sisters went up to S. Augustines for a requiem for S. Ethel Beatrice in her Memorial Chapel. Very cold wet.
- Miss Bernard's traps Gibbons arrived just before 1 pm. Reformers from E. London, the latter from P. Elizabeth. She has come on a week's visit.
- 21<sup>st</sup> S. Euphemia & C.S.I.B. & S.A. joined in a day of prayer & fasting on behalf of Selina Mthokwiswa. Very cold wet.
- 22<sup>nd</sup> Very cold wet. Father Provincial preached at the 9 o'clock Mass. S. Augustines children are due to return to day for 27<sup>th</sup> Esme.
- 23<sup>rd</sup> Only 10 in school at S. Augustines. Rain continues.
- 24<sup>th</sup> Rain in night & early - fine afternoon - thunderstorm & wild gale at Compline & after. New Latrine set up.
- S. James.
- 25<sup>th</sup> Really fine day - S. Rose heard that she was to go to Irene to work.
- 26<sup>th</sup> S. Esme's heavy luggage arrived.
- 27<sup>th</sup> Miss Rowe came to do some preliminary inspecting. Miss Bernard left at 10. am for Neembu. Miss Gibbons @ 4 pm. for Queenstown. S. Superior to Ka at S. Augustines, to take up new candles for Chapel sent by Mother General.
- 28<sup>th</sup> S. Editha in retreat. Children to forest.
- 29<sup>th</sup> Very wet & cold. Tea in refectory - Mrs. Bode, Miss Rutherford & Miss Agari to Ka.



- 30<sup>th</sup> Very wet last thing. Sr. Leshi came out "passed" our latrines but pointed out that the whole system of facts was wrong - the ground was all being contaminated by the "seepage". Pot. S. Johns party unable to go. Mrs Todd (Sec. F.L.W.M.A) called in afternoon.
- 31<sup>st</sup> Mrs Todd to morning tea in parlour but then to see Hostel & Homecraft School of schoolgirls with temperatures. Ill? Hospital accommodated six & were put into kitchen shelter. Parlour repairs resumed.

## AUGUST 1934

- 1<sup>st</sup> Sr. Jane left for Pot S. Johns with F. Provincial. She is going to live in the Rectory there for a time. Parlour repairs in full swing. It is having thatched roof covered with corrugated iron - & beam fillings inside & plastering - spouting inside. Three more children poorly.
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Two more cases. Meeting in Gibson Hut at 5 p.m. to welcome Mrs Todd. Superior had women's meeting at 4 p.m.
- 3<sup>rd</sup> After dinner Sr. Editha set out for Hongxola - to speak to the women there.
- 4<sup>th</sup> Mrs Wabron in retreat. Mrs Agar called to see Sr. Superior in the afternoon. She wishes to live with us. Hever's arranged & she will come on Aug. 15<sup>th</sup>. Sr. Superior P. Key called & made plans about extending boundary fence & planting hedge of Arizona. Sr. Editha returned about 5 p.m. S.D. poorly.
- 6<sup>th</sup> FEAST OF THE TRANSFIGURATION. also whole holiday for King's birthday. After sung mass at 8.30 - 5 Sisters & all the girls went for a picnic returning just after 3 p.m. S.D. to bed early.
- 7<sup>th</sup> F. OF THE HOLY NAME - S.D. up for school. Int to bed after with temperature - also Sr. Faith. New door for C.S. arrived.
- 8<sup>th</sup> S.D. & S.F. in bed all day. New door being fixed - New roses planted.
- 9<sup>th</sup> S.D. up about 11. S.F. in bed all day - Guadilla moved & planted ~~along~~ on the Chapel path fence. S.D. temperature in evening.
- 10<sup>th</sup> S.D. & S.F. in bed all day. Parlour finished & tidied up.
- 11<sup>th</sup> Mrs Woodhouse & Sr. Esome in retreat. A. Wabron in bed all day. S.D. & S.F. up in the middle of the day. Sr. Xian came down for weekend - very severe cold on chest. Parlour new gate in use.
- 12<sup>th</sup> Invalids better. Sr. Xian in bed all day - Tea in parlour.
