# Purchase Of Land By Africans 

## Leaders Demand Freehold Title In Released Areas

The National Executive of the All African Convention which met at the Bantu Men's Social Centre, Johannesburg, on Wednesday January 20, dealt at length with the question of the purchase of land by the Government for Africans under the Trust and Land Act, and pointed out that under section 18, (2) of the Act it is competent for the Trust to grant, sell, lease or otherwise dispose of land belonging to the Trust to Africans

## Policy Of Non-Sale

But the Union Government in the administration of the Act "has adopted a policy of non - sale of Trust land to Africans and has laid it down that a rental would be charged.

## Urbanised Africans

It was further pointed out that the Minister of Native Affairs had repeatedly and publicly announced the intention of the Government to so amend the Urban Areas act as to obtain powers for the removal of a number of African families from urban areas in order that they might be available for labour on the farms and on the mines.

## Right To Bargain

The meeting then strongly snd vigorously protested against any policy which sought to deprive the Africans(a)of an opportunity of aequiring landed property in freehold and in their owa namee so as to create the inland and to srrest the drift into urban areas, (b) of sell. ing and bargaining with their labour to the best advantage.
And also resolved to give evidence on the Native Law Amendment Bill before the Select Conmittee of both Huoses of Parliament add to state the view of the African people thereon.

She supplied clothes to prisoners and formed the Associafion for the improvement o female prisoners.
This society devoted itself to the establishment of prison disci pliae, sэparation of sexes and fe-
male supervision for female prisoners. She visited verious prisons in England and Scotlan and the publication of her notes on this tour gained the svmpa-
thetic att ontion of the House of Commons in England and also the prison committees in foreign coun tries. It is not too much to eay persistence that prisonsafor an persistence that prison reform and
relief for the destitute would reliel for lie destitute would many years throughout Europe. Criminals in England were sent
to New South Wales and'Elizabeth Fry pleaded with the Government to make regulations
