Two sisters from Waverley three from Ekka and Charlotte Plaskow were on the station to see Sister off. We returned to Irene - the van stopping at Worcester Rd to have tea with Mrs Scammon and to collect S. Dorothy Raphael. We had a film which made everyone laugh and cheered us on our way!
- 6<sup>th</sup> No Mass - S. Dorothy Raphael went to Retreat at 3pm and S. Dorothy at 4pm. Sister Deborah Ray and S. D.R. went to town in the morning. Mrs Parkes and Mrs Jackson left for East London.
- 7<sup>th</sup> The Vicar (Bp Taylor) installed S. Dorothy Raphael as the Assistant Superior before Vespers. All Transvaal sisters but one were present. We had tea under the trees after the ceremony - community greetings.
- 8<sup>th</sup> Mother & the Assistant went shopping taking two old.

9<sup>th</sup> Mother went in the car and David in the van to meet Sisters Joan, Raymond Gabriel and Charly arriving from Capetown. They were punctual and there was a grand welcoming day. We had tea under the trees at 10.45 am. The Sisters had breakfasted - bathed & rested. After 3 pm. Sisters Violia and Sr. Raymond drove the newly arrived Sisters (not S' Charly) to the school. Mother and the Assistant went in the bus car taking some of the luggage. We all had tea together.

13<sup>th</sup> Mother drove with Mrs. Brown to Waverly - all had a tea & then Mother, the Assistant and Mrs. Brown drove into Johannesburg for shopping etc - a highly successful shopping and most of the Xmas shopping was accomplished. All returned - time for Vespers.

- 22 The Sisters went to the Sloper. Ruthie and the assistant went to St Mary's School (P) prep going
- 23 The Assistant went to 'E' for six days. The Tunnelong Staff brought their Nursery School Venerables for a picnic Janet Smith came <sup>other</sup> S. Clara went to see S. D. G. Mars at 6.30 a.m. We kept Mrs Scott's 80th birth day in the Visitors room with much gaiety
- 24 S Dorothy came to stay - She had supper in her Janet Smith left - Dorie to Bond a new patient
- 25 S Dorothy - Retreat. S Deborah May took a girl to hospital and stopped
- 26 \* S. D. May fetched Desmond for re place of Safety and she and Ruthie took him to St. Vincent de Paul's Boys & Girls school - Rosebank. The Sisters agreed to admit him at 3 yrs but asked if Negrelli House would take him till then. Negrelli House Pretoria agreed to do so

- 28<sup>th</sup> Father went to a G.B meeting at the O.S.G. The assistant returned for Mr. Alan Burke and Irene Jackson returned from East London. S. Agt. Anthony met all three with the Jan as Father had the car.
- 29<sup>th</sup> The Assistant was on leave for 10 am - 4 pm! The car broke down among other things. There were complications with Father Dora having injections and a girl and baby being fetched from the Bond - also shopping. After Masses Father and A. Burke went to see Andrew McColm to see Sister Margot.

- 8<sup>th</sup> Our Server told us after Mass that he was leaving for England that day. The Assistant had visitors but in the evening Father drove her to see Sister Margot.

- 9<sup>th</sup> Sung Mass for the Conception - a lovely day. S. Eugene came down for a time - car serviced -
- 10<sup>th</sup> Mother and S. Agt. Anthony went shopping. Majorie R. Watson gave them lunch.
- 11<sup>th</sup> A busy day - S. Deborah Mary took girls shopping and had a puncture.
- 12<sup>th</sup> Dr. Irwin left - Mother drove her to Pretoria and then came to the dentist.
- 13<sup>th</sup> Several went shopping - Mother drawing Mrs Scott left for a month with her children. Retreatants from Ek - Waverley & Pretoria arrived. The retreat began conducted by Fr. Speight U.
- 14<sup>th</sup> A very peaceful day for retreatants - not too bad for the rest. S. Dorothy Michael ill -
- 15<sup>th</sup> Our sisters and Fr. Speight U. left by 10.15 am Visiting Sunday -
- 16<sup>th</sup> Three sisters from Irene left for the 2<sup>nd</sup> Retreat at Waverley. Mother and S. Dorothy Michael left for Ekinthlene calling at Waverley for her.
- 17<sup>th</sup> Mother at Ek - a busy day here -
- 18<sup>th</sup> Mother returned bringing the retreatants with her. S. Deborah Mary went to court with two girls.
