Dear Matthew,

I thought the ANC may be interested in having a look at this paper. It is produced by "Veterans for Victory" a right wing organisation with close links to the SADF that campaigns for the support of the "security forces". Although it has no cover the declaration on the front is the "Veterans for Victory" declaration.

The paper was picked up by a conscript at "the sick bay of a South African Navy establishment in the western Cape within the last 5 weeks". The person wishes to remain strictly anonymous as he is at present doing his national service and is worried about victimisation. This is why the information is not more specific.

The document was clearly produced after the 2/2/90 as there is reference to Nelson Mandela being Deputy President of the ANC.

What the document does is continue with the ongoing smear of the ANC, ECC and other organisations. Of particular concern is the "cold war" language used against the ANC. If this was just a loony fringe group's publication it would be easy to ignore. However, it appears as if the SADF is either distributing this document or condoning its distribution and other "Veterans for Victory" material. Surely this is evidence of the SADF still maintaining an antagonistic attitude to the ANC.

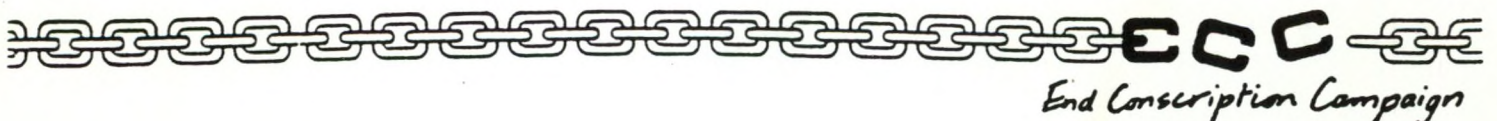
I hope the ANC will be able to make use this paper as it sees fit.
