1. NAME: Whambia & Co.

The name of the body shall be known as :

The Pimville/Klipsruit Residents' Committee,
herein referred to as the Committee.

2. AIMS & OBJECTS :

The aims and objects of the Committee shall be :-

- 2(i) To pursue on behalf of the residents of Pimville/ Klipsruit their legal rights to all the facilities, amenities and relevant matters for the well being of an orderly society.
- 2(ii) To bring to the attention of the authorities the requirements, demands and/or requests of the residents for the common good of both residents and the authorities.
- 2(iii) To appeal and demand the electrification of the Township as a matter of urgency.
- 2(iv) To demand for the electrification of the residents houses.
- 2(v) The improvement of medical, dental, ante-natal and post-natal clinics for the residents.
- 2(vi) The erection and establishment of educational institutions - from creches to high schools.
- 2(vii) To demand and appeal for improvement to roads in the Township.
- 2 (viii) To demand the erection of libraries and the supply of books therein.
- 2(ix) To establish, encourage and develop social, cultural and sporting clubs and/or organisations.
- 2(x) To demand for the erection of swimming pools, tennis courts, bowling greens and the completion of the Pimville Stadium to international standards.
- 2(xi) To encourage residents to buy the houses they occupy.
- 2(xii) To provide a means whereby the West Rand Administration may explain its policy to residents.
- 2(xiii) No unmarried child of a registered tenant should be removed from the permit.

3. CO-OPERATION

- 3(i) The Committee will co-operate with any committee, society of body with similar aims and objects.
- 3(ii) Will not encourage its members to use the Committee as a platform for Urban Bantu Council elections.
- 3(iii) Will not allow any of its members to use the Committee's constitution as a manifesto for the Urban Bantu Council elections.

4. MEMBERSHIP

Membership of the Committee shall be open to ALL registered tenants of the Pimville/Klipsruit complex.

5. ELECTIONS

- 5(i) Members of the executive Committee shall be elected by show of hands.
 - (ii) The executive Committee shall consist of a Chairman and Vice-Chairman, the Secretary and Assistant Secretary and five members.
 - (iii) The executive Committee shall be in office for a period of one year.
 - (iv) Should a member of the executive Committee resign, die or absent himself on three consecutive executive meetings without an acceptable reason, such member shall be deemed to have resigned.
 - (v) Should there be a vacancy in the executive Committee there shall be a bye-election.

6. DUTIES AND FUNCTIONS OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE:

- 6(i)a) The executive Committee shall handle the day to day affairs of the Committee.
 - b) Be vigilant by collecting any information that may affect the residents.
 - c) Keep the residents informed of the latest developments.
 - d) To make representations where necessary and also authorised by the members for the residents.
 - e) Enquire from the right channels any matter within the constitution for the benefit of the residents.
- 6(ii)a) The executive Committee shall meet at least once a quarter, i.e. once in every three months, unless it decides to meet more frequently due to its business.

- 6(ii)b) The executive Committee shall decide at its meeting when to call a general members meeting and the agenda for that meeting.
 - c) The executive Committee shall invite members of the Urban Bantu Council to its general members meetings as speakers.
 - d) The general meeting shall be called by the executive at least once a year or at any time the executive may decide.

7. AMENDMENTS:

Amendements to the Constitution shall be decided by a majority vote of residents at a meeting - after the residents have discussed the requisition for an amendment.



Late TREVOR DAN MWELI-SKOTA - BORN 23rd FEBRUARY, 1893.

EDUCATION:

He attended school at the Perseverance High School in Kimberley.

He was very proficient in the languages: English, Afrikaans, Xhosa and Sotho.

FAMILY LIFE:

Late T.D. Mweli-Skota was married to Miss Frances Xiniwe of King Williamstown.

The couple bore two sons Pixley and Paul who are both late. Mrs Frances Skota passed away in 1925 in Johannesburg. In 1938 late Mweli-skota married Miss Zelpah Shupinyane daughter of the late Rev. Shupinyane of the A.M.E. Church in Pimville.

The couple bore two sons, Both are late.

OCCUPATION:

The late was appointed interpreter of the Supreme Court in Kimberley.

He was the first reporter of an African Newspaper known as the Abantu-Batho in Kimberley.

He came to Johannesburg in 1910 taking up residence in Pim-ville.

He was emloyed by a firm of solicitors in the city.

In Johannesburg he served Imvo Zabantsundu as a reporter.

he set up his own press known as the YEARLY AFRICAN PRINTING PRESS. It was here that he worked on his major opus the first edition of the African Who's Who, a biographical sketch of African leaders in all walks of life and black personalities of eminence on the continent. At the time of his death, he had completed a third edition of this work.

SOCIAL ACTIVITIES:

Early in his life late T.D. Mweli-Skota became active in national politics and was the first Secretary of the African National Congress.

He was a member of the delegation to the United Kingdom in the company of the late Dr P.Seme, L.T. Mvabaza and others.

Locally he took active part in civic affairs as meber of the then Advisory Board.

In the more recent times he served as member of the delegation that met the Deputy Minister of Bantu Administration and Development, Dr. de Wet Nel on the issue of the removal of Pimville.

As a result of this delegation, Pimville has sice remained and extended into an expandinging Klipspruit.

HIS LAST PUBLIC APPEARANCE:

Perhaps one of the crowning momemnts of his life was the 66casion are celebration attended by Dr de Wet Nel and other dignitaries on a site where the Sithuthile H.P.School now satnds.

on the rostrum were white officials only with a loudspeaker specially installed for their use. Below the rostrum were two speakers one for the Africans and a special one for the interpreter. When the turn came for late T.D. Mweli Skota to deliver his speech, he ascended to the rostrum specially reserved for the wije whites and said;

"The children of Pimville are grateful to you, Dr de Wet Nel for allowing them to remain in one place, and I hope that their progeny at some future time shall not call this place Klipspruit or Pimville but a De Wet NelletjieStam in which they shall enjoy the rights we had in Pimville of a Minety-nineYear Lease.
