Mar 9-15. The practice for Palm Sunday was at 5.30 p.m. followed at 6.30 p.m. by a short service for the girls. The Chaplain was unable to take Evening + Devotions as he had to go to St. John's School to fetch the boys. Distribution of Palms, Procession + Song Mar 6.30 a.m. A lovely service + a perfect morning, which turned into a very hot day. At Evening a storm started with quite heavy rain.

Mar 21 a.m. Mother, Sister Ida, + Sister Isabel Everild, in Retreat. Elizabeth English came to stay. Heavy rain started at 6 p.m. + lasted about an hour.

Special Service at 6:15 p.m.
Mass was started at 2 a.m. but was not finished owing to the Chaplain being taken ill during his reading of the Gospel of the Passion. He had to be taken out of Chapel very faint & breathless. After seeing to the Chaplain in the Vestry Sister Charity drove him & M^{rs} Lewis in the car to the doctor in Irene who said it was heart trouble & ordered him bed for a week & no work for two weeks! Mother immediately phoned the Warden (Fr. Raynes) who happened to be at Proletaria & he came over in the afternoon to see Fr. Treloar-Pross still convalescing & said he had made a plan for us J.C. Fr. Shelley c.s. to come for Maundy Thursday & Good Friday & possibly Fr. Raynes himself for the Easter Eve & Easter Day. The Bishop arranged for St. Martin's. A very long upside mind of day!! Sister Angela, & Sister Charity in Retreat. Fr. Shelley came in the evening. No special service, singing practice instead. Charlotte Plimstone came.

Maundy Thursday
14th

Sunny Mass with the usual ceremonies at 6:45 a.m. Fr. Shelley c.s. as the Chaplain was ill. The usual preparations all day getting ready for the keeping of the Watch. In the afternoon Mother & the Assistant went to the church to try the harmonium as the Three Hours Service was to be held there for the first time as a trial. So few Township people came to the Hours Chapel. The Watch started as usual at 6 p.m. & as the Chaplain was ill Mother took a short service for the Girls.

Good Friday.
15th

The Mass of the Pre-sanctified. 7:30 a.m. Fr. Shelley c.s. A lovely day. All went happily

and the experiment of trying the The Three Hours at the Church was fully justified as many more people from the Township came. The Jan Hofmeyr Girl Guide camping in the field attended & sat in the Sanctuary. Fr. Jarvis Palmer from St John's College Johannesburg conducted the The Three Hours. The girls throughout the day were very good & kept the silence well. At 6-20 p.m. the three ^{east} Stations of the Cross were read & a service held for the girls with them & taken by Mother.

Easter Eve. 16th

Preparations all day for the Festival. Fr. Maynes arrived in the afternoon to take the Blessing of the Easter Fire etc. & to stay the night for the Easter Day Mass. M^{rs} Kermae drove Father over & also stayed the night. The Blessing of the Easter Fire was at 5-15 p.m. Elizabeth English went to Portmarn in the morning to collect flowers etc. Compline, Matins, & Lauds. 8-15 p.m. Tea & Sext after breakfast. None after the practice for the Blessing of the Fire.

Easter Day.
17th

A lovely day. Sung Mass. 6-15 a.m. The Warden, Fr. Reynolds, c.r. M^{rs} Kermae took Father back to Pretoria directly after the Mass as he was taking another Mass at the Priory Church. Tea 9-15. Sext & None 12-15. (Visiting Sunday) Sung Vespers 4 p.m. Tea 4-30 p.m. There was no Evening so the Easter records, & others were played in the Recreation Room. Compline, Matins & Lauds. 8-15 p.m. The Waverley Sisters drove over at 1-30 p.m. & left at 6 p.m.

Easter Monday.
18th

Mass 8-15. Fr. Toelawny P.O.S. c.r. A lovely day. Miss Hague left for her holiday. Elizabeth English left. Miss Savage came. The girls

- had dancing from 6 p.m. Supper 7.30 p.m. In the morning Mother went to see the Chaplain who seemed better.
- Easter-Thursday. 19th Mass 7.15. Fr. Treleway-Pross. Sister Benita from "Jane" came in the evening from the School where she had been for the previous night. She had come up to arrange to fly to England & wished to return to "Jane" with Mother on Wednesday.
- Wednesday. 20th Octave. No Mass. At 9.30 a.m. Fr. Cordall, c.r. called for Mother & Sister Benita & all left for "Jane" Hospital for the laying of the stone of the new Ward for the Hospital.
- Thursday. 21st Octave. Mass 7.15. Fr. Treleway-Pross. c.r. The Girls had a Film in the evening which was shown by two young boys sent by Martin Gibbs as Mother was away.
- Friday 22nd Octave. Mass 7.15. Fr. Treleway-Pross. c.r. The Assistant went to Robert's Heights to have her inspection for yellow fever & took Miss Jepson with her. Dora Parker came to stay. Mother returned from "Jane" being brought back by Fr. Cordall c.r. No classes.
- Saturday. 23rd Octave. Low Sunday. 24th Mass 7.15. Fr. Treleway-Pross. c.r. Also Solemn Evening & Procession 6.30 p.m.
- Sunday. 25th Mass 7 a.m. Fr. Treleway-Pross who left for Sophiatown at 10 a.m. No Evening. Cecily Paget came for two nights.
- Monday. 25th No Mass. At 9.45 a.m. Mother & the Assistant went to Hillcrest & left Sister Charity there for a few days rest. The Assistant was vaccinated before her flight. Miss Savage left, very unwell. Fr. Maund came for Retreat, also M^{rs}. Clack. A very much colder day.
- Tuesday. 26th Mass 7.15. Fr. Maund. A very cold day. S^{rs}. Edith Aidan, & Sister Angela went into Johannesburg.
- f. George M. (transferred)

to shop. Miss Paget left on the Van. Joyce Fairclough came down to see Mother in the Morning.

Wednesday 27th Mass. 7-15. The Assistant drove into Pretoria for shopping + to show D^r Venning her room which had not apparently taken.

Thursday 28th Sunny Mass. 8 a.m. Fr. Maund. Owing to the Chaplain's illness St. Mark had to be transferred to today. After Recreation Mother went to see the Chaplain who seemed better. Drenching rain with thunder + lightning started at 3 p.m.!

Friday 29th Mass. 8-15. Fr. Maund, who left on the Van. Sister Rosemary + Sister Tom came for the long Retreat; Sister Charity returned from the school with them. Classes as usual. M^{rs} Clark left.

Saturday 30th No Mass. Mother, Sister Ida, + Sister Isabel Wood went over to Durbanville for their Great Day. They took Dove Packer with them + brought back Fr. Boardman c.r. to take the Sunday service. No Evening. Sister Benita came for the week end + Sister Mildred of the Cross for the Retreat.

Sunday, Easter II. SS. Philip + James App. May 1st Sunny Mass. 8 a.m. Fr. Boardman c.r. Sister Benita's son Jim Shattoch came over to spend the day with her. Sister Mildred of the Cross sister came over to see her in the afternoon. A crowd of visitors to see the girls. Fr. Boardman took a service for the girls at 6-15 + also heard their confessions in the morning.

Monday 2nd Fr. Athanasius D.C.P. Mass 8-15. Fr. Boardman c.r. who left on the 8-30 a.m. train. Nearly all the Sisters turned up for the Retreat. Mother went to Worcester in the afternoon for a Meeting + brought back Sister Emily Isabel with her. Sunny Mass 7 a.m. (Fr. King from Germiston.)
