We beg to submit our Report on the operations of the Association for the year ended 31st December, 1937, together with the Audited Accounts.

During the year 1937, the Association obtained a total of 68,867 Natives. Of this number, 58,839 came from the Province of Moçambique, south of Latitude 22° South, and 10,028 from certain territories north of Latitude 22° South. The total number of Natives, viz., 292,991, received from all sources of supply during 1937 was 15,869 less than the number received during 1936.

WASTAGE.

The usual statistical table (Annexure A), giving particulars of the number of Natives taking their discharge, and the losses from deaths and desertions for the year 1937 as compared with previous years, is attached.

ACCOUNTS.

CAPITAL.

The Registered Capital of the Association remained unaltered throughout the year under review, viz., 59,800 shares of £1 each, of which 59,754 shares had been issued at the 31st December, 1937. The position of your Capital Account at that date was as follows:—

The Board, acting under Clause 15 of the Articles of Association, decided to make a refund of approximately 10 per cent. on the capitation fees paid for Natives during 1937, which absorbed £29,788 6s. 4d. of the above balance, and £46,000 was carried to Appropriation Account.

The Association's capitation fee for a Native engaged for twelve months' service remained at £3 10s. 0d. throughout the year.

The costs in connection with the Natives allotted by the Association, including all Head Office, Compound and Hospital Expenses, amounted to $2\cdot35d$. per recruited shift for 1937, as compared with $2\cdot22d$. for 1936.

COMPOUNDS.

In addition to the 68,867 Natives received at your three compounds, 83,165 contracted B.S.A. Natives were received at the Johannesburg Compound for medical examination and registration. Of these 152,032 Natives, 1,121 East Coast, 753 Tropical, and 1,868 B.S.A. Natives, who were train-weary or otherwise unfit for immediate distribution, were detained for recuperation and subsequent distribution.

1,609 East Coast, 107 Tropical, and 2,132 B.S.A. Natives, who failed to pass the examination of the mine medical officers, were returned to your compounds for further examination.

1,222 East Coast and 96,647 B.S.A. Natives who proceeded direct from their homes to the mines in search of employment, were received at the compounds for medical examination and registration.

3,860 time-expired East Coast Natives and 22,305 time-expired B.S.A. Natives presented themselves at the three compounds for further service on the mines.

3,028 East Coast, 208 Tropical and 6,352 B.S.A. Natives were received from the mines as medical rejects, which included 4,096 injured Natives and 1,566 Natives admitted under the Miners' Phthisis Act (No. 35 of 1925) for examination and assessment for compensation.

2,750 Natives engaged by contractors to the mines were received for medical examination.

53,448 time-expired East Coast Natives presented themselves at the three compounds for repatriation. A total of 1,062,768 such Natives have been repatriated under the aegis of the Association since 1906.

2,270 Tropical Natives, who were time-expired, were repatriated during the year.

NATIVES IN TRANSIT.—40,771 East Coast recruits, en route from Ressano-Garcia to Johannesburg, were fed at the Witbank Compound, and 2,991 East Coast recruits, 250 East Coast repatriates, with 21,117 B.S.A. recruits and repatriates, were accommodated in the Breyten Compound in transit to and from the mines.

£184,783 18s. 4d. was deposited with the Association at Johannesburg and Witbank for safekeeping by Natives pending departure for their homes, as against £185,983 2s. 11d. in 1936.

RESSANO-GARCIA.—47,456 Natives for Mine work passed through the hands of your compound staff at Ressano-Garcia during the twelve months under review. Of this number, 148 were rejected either by the Association's Medical Officer or the Portuguese officials at that place, 3 deserted, 2,589 were on hand at the end of the year, and the balance of 44,716 came forward. 45,903 Natives repatriated under the aegis of the Association were also dealt with at Ressano-Garcia prior to leaving for their kraals.

ZOEKMAKAAR.—11,107 Natives were examined, of whom 10,432 were received at Johannesburg for Mine work. 10,241 Native repatriates were handled by your staff at Zoekmakaar during the year.

STEGI.—2,991 Natives were sent forward for mining employment, of whom 4 deserted en route to Johannesburg, and 242 East Coast Natives passed through the depot en route home.

WEI-HAI-WEI (China).—This property remains unsold.

All compounds have been maintained in a thorough state of repair.

HEALTH OF NATIVES.

The Report of your Chief Medical Officer (Dr. A. I. Girdwood) is attached. The death-rate during the years 1937 and 1936 among Native labourers employed by Members of the Association was as follows:—

The above figures are based on deaths occurring on the Mines, and do not include deaths occurring among recruits and repatriates in the Association's Johannesburg, Witbank, Breyten, and Zoekmakaar Compounds. These latter number 140 (vide Annexure G), and, if included, the death-rate from disease only for 1937 is increased to 8·01 per thousand per annum, as compared with 7·51 for 1936.

The welfare of Natives in Mine Compounds received the earnest attention of the Transvaal Mine Medical Officers' Association and the Compound Managers' Association throughout the year.

PAYMENT OF ACCIDENT COMPENSATION TO MINE NATIVES.

The Central Medical Boards established at Johannesburg and Witbank to determine the degree of incapacitation sustained by Natives through Mine accidents, examined 4,096 Native cases during the year. 3,980 Natives were awarded and paid on behalf of members compensation amounting to £33,908 18s. 9d.

In addition to the foregoing amounts, £11,848 12s. 0d. compensation moneys due in the estates of deceased Natives were paid to the Director of Native Labour for administration.

NATIVES FROM NORTH OF LATITUDE 22° SOUTH.

The Union Immigration Act was amended in June last to permit Natives from north of Latitude 22° South to enter the Union for mining employment in accordance with any scheme of engagement and repatriation approved by the Union Government.

In December the General Manager proceeded to Salisbury and participated in a conference with the Governors of Northern Rhodesia, Southern Rhodesia, and Nyasaland, regarding the engagement of Natives of those territories for employment on the Gold Mines of the Witwatersrand.

It has been decided to establish a W.N.L.A. depot on the Rand for the special purpose of accommodating Tropical Natives during their period of 26 working days' acclimatization. The Natives will be engaged in light work under special medical observation and compound supervision.

In October, the Association had the pleasure of receiving the Hon. T. F. Sandford, C.M.G., M.B.E., Senior Provincial Commissioner of the Northern Rhodesia Government, which had deputed Mr. Sandford to enquire into and report on the conditions of employment of Barotse labour on the Gold Mines.

The number of Tropical Natives employed by Gold Mines at 31st December, 1937, was 10,686.

MOCAMBIQUE CONVENTION OF 1928.

The agreement arrived at in 1936 between the Moçambique and Union Governments under which the maximum number of Portuguese Natives who may be employed by members of the Association under Article III was increased from 80,000 to 90,000, was renewed for a further period of twelve months reckoned from 8th June, 1937.

The number of Portuguese Natives employed by Gold Mines and Collieries (members of the Association) at 31st December, 1937, was 90,812.

SOUTH AFRICAN INSTITUTE FOR MEDICAL RESEARCH.

The Association's grant to the Institute remained at £7,500 per annum. The Union Government contributed a like sum.

The Institute continues to render valuable services to Members of the Association.

The representatives of the Association on the Board of Management of the Institute at 31st December, 1937, were:—

During the year the Hon. the Minister of the Interior initiated discussions on a suggestion that the ultimate destination of the Institute should be in association with the University of the Witwatersrand, out of which certain principles to that end were agreed upon.

It was also agreed that the University could proceed to appoint a direct representative on the Board.

NATIVES ON COLLIERIES.

The inspection of the conditions under which Natives are employed on the Collieries showed that in general the terms of the agreement as to rates of pay, hours of work, etc., had been duly observed by the Collieries.

MEDICAL REJECTS FROM MINES.

(a) EAST COAST :-

On the 31st December, 1936, 58 Natives remained in hospital.

During the year, 2,265 East Coast convalescent Natives were received from the Mines for repatriation. Of these, 1,829 were repatriated, 14 died, 10 were transferred to the Miners' Phthisis Bureau wards, 432 were returned to the Mines, 8 were discharged, and 30 remained in the Compound Hospital at the end of the year awaiting repatriation.

(b) BRITISH SOUTH AFRICAN:

On the 31st December, 1936, 45 Natives remained in hospital.

During the year, 5,232 Natives were received from the Mines, of whom 4,209 were repatriated, 15 died, 22 were transferred to the Mines' Phthisis Bureau Wards, 962 were returned to the Mines, 15 were discharged, 1 sent to Rietfontein Lazaretto, 2 deserted, and 51 remained in the Compound Hospital at the end of the year.

(c) TROPICAL:-

On the 31st December, 1936, there were 2 Tropical Natives in hospital.

During the year, 197 Tropical Natives were received from the Mines for repatriation. Of these, 150 were repatriated, 38 were returned to the Mines, 1 deserted, 1 was discharged, 2 were transferred to Miners' Phthisis Bureau wards, and 7 remained in hospital at the end of the year awaiting repatriation.

CHAIRMAN'S SPEECH

At the Thirty-sixth Ordinary General Meeting, held in Johannesburg, on Monday, 25th April, 1938.

PRESENT.—Mr. F. A. Unger (Chairman), Sir George W. Albu, Bart., Messrs. P. M. Anderson, D.Sc. (Eng.), G. H. Beatty, W. D. Dereham, M. J. du Preez, A. S. Hersov, R. L. Innes, H. P. Jeppe, W. H. A. Lawrence, W. A. Mackenzie, J. H. L. Manisty, Theodore Marks, Lionel Maynard, A. W. Stewart, R. S. G. Stokes, D.S.O., and H. A. Wilson, with the General Manager, the Native Labour Adviser, and Mr. D. Smith (representing the Secretaries—the Transvaal Chamber of Mines).

The Chairman said :-

GENTLEMEN,

The Annual Report and Audited Statements of Account for the Year ended 31st December, 1937, are laid on the table.

It became evident early in 1937 that the harvesting of abundant food supplies by the natives throughout the Union and the three Protectorates, after several years of indifferent crops, would have repercussions on the native labour supply of the Gold Mines. In the aggregate, the engagements for 1937 were 15,869 less than for 1936, the respective numbers being 292,991 and 308,860, and for the same reason more natives took their discharge during the year, the total being 301,821; an increase of 29,075 over 1936.

The inability to obtain sufficient natives for the needs of the Gold Mines was accentuated by the increasing competition of other employers of native labour, including the Government in its National Roads scheme and the Railways. Steps are being taken towards meeting this competition.

The engagement of Portuguese natives was maintained at the number necessary to keep the total employed at the figure of 90,000 permitted under the Mozambique Convention.

The number of Tropical natives engaged was 10,028; 6,652 more than in the preceding year.

In the final result, the total number of natives employed by the Gold Mines and Collieries at 31st December, 1937, was 18,000 less than at 31st December, 1936; the respective numbers being 299,738 and 317,745. Since the end of the year an unusually large seasonal native labour influx has taken place, and at 31st March, 1938, 330,634 were employed.

In addition to maintaining its operations in Portuguese territory south of 22° South Latitude, the Association's operations in tropical areas were considerably extended during the year under review. Permission has been given for the engagement, in Nyasaland, of 8,500 natives, and a W.N.L.A. organization is being established there.

The death rate, from disease, of the Tropical natives employed on the mines since the commencement of their experimental employment (i.e., 1st January, 1934) to 31st March, 1938, was 15·54 per 1,000 per annum, and from accidents 1·98 per 1,000 per annum; a total death rate of 17·52 per 1,000 per annum. These natives were all employed underground, and their death rate must therefore be compared with the death rate of the underground natives employed on the mines, which, for the year 1937, was 11·29 per 1,000 per annum. In view of the fact that the Tropical natives are nearly all "novices," new to mine work and to aggregation, their death rate is not, in the opinion of the Industry's medical advisers, in any way abnormal. Everything possible, however, is being done to reduce it; and to that end a special depot is being established on the East Rand where these natives will spend an acclimatization period of one month and be employed on light work under special medical observation and compound supervision, before being sent underground.

The potentialities of the northern territories in the supply of natives for the Witwatersrand gold mines are very considerable.

As regards financial matters, the Association's total revenue exceeded the total expenditure by £75,788. Your Board decided to refund 10 per cent. of the capitation fees paid by members during the year, which absorbed £29,788 of the surplus. The balance of £46,000 was carried to Appropriation Account, which now stands at £94,000.

In conclusion, I should mention that during the past year the Association was accorded the customary friendly and valuable assistance by the various bodies with which it comes in contact, and especially by the Government departments concerned, both in and outside the Union. On behalf of your Board, I desire to record its appreciation of that assistance.

You will also join me in expressing our thanks to the officials and staff of the Association for their very efficient services throughout the year.

I now move the adoption of the Report and Accounts before you.
