In regard to the soousec's membership of the unlawful \(P_{a n}\) Africanist Congress - that is Oount 1 my submission to Your forship is that there has been no evidence led that the accused was ever at any time a member of the \(P_{\text {an }}\) Africanist Congress cither before it was declared an unlawful or ganisation or subsequent to it beins declared unlawful.

In relation to Count 2 which alleges that he took part in the activity or activities of the unlawful organisation - one refers to the further particulars which have beon supplied by the State and reads through them ny submission to Your Worship is that the evidence coes not disclose that the accused took part in any of these activities or any other activities which are not listed. There is no evidence of his cenvassing for members; collecting membership fees - organising a branch - organising an attack on Whites - organising Task Force leaders - organising the purchasing and acquisition of weapons - or canising action against members of the Police Force, forwarding information and monies to Wascru - ennducting corresponcence with the Fiead Office of the P.A.C. to achieve its aims and objects - and therc is no evidence at all of his attendance at any meetings of the Pan Africanist Congress or of any other organisation.
