The General Body of the End Conscription Campaign in Durban has asked me to write to you and express our great joy at your release. It must be a great relief for you and your family. It is also a victory for the CO movement, and we are happy to think that we have played a small part in it. I am thinking of a public meeting we held in May last year around the theme of <u>Release Objectors Now!</u> at which your mother delivered a stirring address, another vibrant public meeting near the end of the year to remember your first anniversary of imprisonment at which your mother was again one of the speakers, and a march to Natal Command at the end of February this year calling for your and David's release. I wonder if any of us thought you would both be free less than six months later!

We wish you well as you take time to re-adjust to 'normal' life and work out your next step. We hope your plans may include a visit to Durban.
