

- (f) NATIONAL SPEAKER: The National Speaker shall preside over all National Conferences. In his absence the Deputy-Speaker shall preside at such conference.
- (g) NATIONAL CHAPLAIN: The National Chaplain shall lead the delegates in prayer at National Conference and shall conduct the National service and otherwise provide spiritual leadership for the organisation.

8. THE NATIONAL WORKING COMMITTEE :

- (a) There shall be a National Working Committee (N.W.C.) consisting of all those members of the N.E.C. within a radius of 75 miles from the National Heaverters.



14. QUORUM :


