(Decisions of the launching conference 7 - 9 April 1989 at
Stoneyridge, Tvl)

1. AIMS OF THE ORDER

- * To encourage a joyful spirituality and a non-violent lifestyle following the example of Jesus
- * To encourage others to choose active non-violence in the search for justice
- * To investigate, analyse and expose the causes of violence and conflict
- * To support those who take costly non-violent decisions in the cause of peace and justice
- * To develop and employ skills in creative conflict-management
- * To establish bonds of fellowship with each other and all groups involved in peacemaking

2. THE RULE OF LIFE

- A. A commitment to christian fellowship, devotion and practice.
- B. A lifestyle reflecting the renunciation of violence -
 - (i) In our personal lives
 - (a) Through daily spiritual disciplines
 - (b) Through discovering and dealing with our own violence
 - (c) Through study in non-violence
 - (ii) In our social lives
 - (a) By affirming the human dignity of all
 - (b) By understanding conflict and responding non-violently
 - (c) By preventing and resolving violence
 - (d) By confronting injustice and seeking justice
- C. A participation in the fellowship, training and activities of the Order, through a local chapter.
