CARNEGIE NIE-EUROPESE BIBLIOTEK, TRANSVAAL.

VERSLAG VIR DIE JAAR GEËINDIG 31 AUGUSTUS, 1942.

Die Carnegie Nie-Europese Biblioteek, Transvaal, is 'n inrigting wat leesstof vir Nie-Europese persone woonagtig in Transvaal verskaf.

Die Biblioteek werk deur middel van 78 sentrums, wat die hele Provinsie, buiten Johannesburg en Brakpan, dien. Hierdie twee stede het onafhanklike Nie-Europese biblioteke. Die Komitee verskaf asook biblioteke aan 'n klein aantal omgewings geleë in die Noordelike Kaap Provinsie, Betsjoeanaland en Swaziland.

Met hulp en aanmoediging van die Biblioteek Komitee het die Munisipaliteite van Springs, Brakpan, Benoni, Germiston, Vereeniging en Pretoria tak biblioteke, uitsluitelik vir die gebruik van Nie-Europese, gestig. Party van hierdie biblioteke ontwikkel nou in 'n bevredigende manier.

Die Carnegie Nie-Europese Biblioteek het sy Hoofkwartier te Germiston, by die Openbare Biblioteek, waarvandaan kaste boeke per spoor aan skole, sendingstasies, stadsgebiede, ens., in verskillende dele van Transvaal gestuur word. By hierdie plekke word hulle deur 'n onderwyser of sendeling of stadsgebied-superintendent ontvang, wat as vrywillige bibliotekaris vir sy omgewing optree.

Die vooruitgang van die biblioteek hang van die bekwaamheid van die vrywillige bibliotekaris af om die leeslus onder sy bevolking op te wakker. Die Komitee is jarelank al oortuig dat as 'n Nie-Europese Biblioteek doeltreffend moet wees, dan behoort dit onder die toesig van 'n voltydse bibliotekaris te wees, wat goeie opleiding in biblioteekwese ontvang het.

'n Hele aantal Munisipaliteite het „Sports-Organiseerders” in diens wat as deelydse bibliotekarisse ageer. „Sports-Organiseerders” is spesiaal opgelei sodat hulle die Bantoes in sports, en ander ontspannings aktiwiteite kan laat belangstel; maar slegs een of twee van hulle besit enige kennis van die funksie van die biblioteek. Hulle werk lange ure elke dag, en in die algemeen het hulle weinig tyd te spaar vir die biblioteek.

Waar dit moontlik is behoort Munisipaliteite om aange-
moedig te word om voltydse ervare bibliotekarisse in diens
te hê.

SIRKULASIE VAN BOEKE.

Die jaarlikse sirkulasie van boeke in die Carnegie Nie-
Europese Biblioteek word op 12,408 geskat. Hierdie getal
sluit nie die sirkulasie van die boeke behorende aan die
sentrums wat aanvullings voorrade van Germiston kry, in nie.

Bantu Welfare Trust genader met die aanvraag vir 'n spesiale
toelae wat gebruik kan word vir die stigting van 'n Studente-
Afdeling.

Hierdie aanvraag het 'n gunstige antwoord van die Bantu
Welfare Trust uitgelok, wat die gewenste toelae aan die
Biblioteek betaal het.

Die uitslag daarvan is dat die Komitee nou bereidwillig is
om boeke aan enige Nie-Europese persoon woonagtig in
Suidelike Afrika, vry van intekengeld, te leen, mits hy deur
'n Naturelle Kommissaris, Superintendent van 'n Sendingstasie,
of Prinsipaal van 'n Opleidings Kollege, of goedgekeurde
Korrespondensiekursus, aanbeveel is.

SKOLE AFDELING.

Op versoek van die Unie Departement van Naturelle Sake
word meer skole, plattelandse sowel as stedelike, uitgenooi
om vir die lening van stelle boeke aansoek te doen.

Dit is klaarblyklik dat met die kleinere fondse tot sy
beskikking, kan die Biblioteek-Komitee slegs 'n geringe pro-

porsie van die skole van biblioteke voorsien. Verdere pogings word aangewend om meer fondse te verkry tot die doel om biblioteke by meer skole te stig.

Die Komitee wens die Naturelle Komissaris in alle dele van Transvaal vir die hulp wat hulle aan die Komitee verleen het in verband met die aanbeveling van skole waarnatoe kaste boeke gestuur sou word.

BIBLIOTEEK ORGANISASIE.

Die Komitee het 'n Organiserende Bibliotekaris in diens. Dit is sy plig om sentrums te besoek, en vrywilige bibliotekaris met hulle werk te help; hy moedig Adviserende Rade en Komitees aan om vir beter biblioteek-dienste in hulle eie stede te werk; hy besoek skole en probeer kinders tot die lees van meer en beter boeke aan te lei.

Hy tref reëlins vir praatjies vir volwassenes oor letterkundige vakke, debatte, en in die algemeen probeer hy om die leeslus onder die Bantoe en ander Nie-Europese op te wakker.

Gedurende die afgelope jaar het die Organiseerder 191 sentrums besoek, en het 62 praatjies en lesings aan Nie-Europese toehoorders gelewer.

CARNEGIE NON-EUROPEAN LIBRARY, TRANSVAAL.

REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31st AUGUST, 1942.

The Carnegie Non-European Library, Transvaal, is an organisation which provides reading matter for Non-Europeans living in the Transvaal.

The Library has 78 centres, serving the whole of the Province, except Johannesburg and Brakpan, which have Non-European libraries of their own. In addition the Committee provides libraries for a few areas situated in the Northern Cape Province, Bechuanaland and in Swaziland.

With aid and encouragement from the Library Committee, the Municipalities of Springs, Brakpan, Benoni, Germiston, Vereeniging and Pretoria have now established Branch libraries for the exclusive use of Non-European readers. Some of these libraries are progressing very well.

The Carnegie Non-European Library has its headquarters at the Germiston (Carnegie) Public Library, from which point boxes of books are sent by rail to schools, mission stations, locations, etc., in various parts of the Transvaal, where they are received by teachers, mission and location superintendents. These people act as voluntary librarians for their areas.

The success of the library depends upon the ability of the voluntary librarian to interest the people of his locality in reading. The Committee has for many years now been convinced that if a Non-European library is to be effective and be of any use to the adults and children of a Location, it is absolutely necessary that a trained librarian, working on a full-time basis, be appointed.

A few Municipalities employ "Sports Organisers" as part time librarians. "Sports Organisers" have been specifically trained to interest the Bantu in sports and recreational activities, but only one or two have had any introduction to library work. They are employed for long hours daily and usually have not much time to devote to the library. Municipalities should be encouraged to employ full-time trained librarians whenever possible.

BOOK CIRCULATION.

The annual circulation of books in the Carnegie Non-European Library is estimated at **12,408**. This figure does not include the circulation of books owned by those libraries whose stocks are merely supplemented by books from Germiston.

BOOK STOCK.

The Library possesses 10,518 volumes, including books in English, Afrikaans, Sendibeli, Sepedi, Sesotho, Shangaan, Thonga, Tswana, Venda, Xhosa and Zulu.

READERS.

2,710 Adult readers and 5,648 Juveniles borrow books from the library.

STUDENTS' DEPARTMENT.

Applications for the loan of books are being constantly received from Natal, Eastern and Northern Cape Province and the Orange Free State.

In order to provide some opportunity for Non-Europeans living in these and other parts of Southern Africa of procuring books required for study purposes, the Library Committee approached the Bantu Welfare Trust for a special grant that would be used for the establishment of a Students' Department. The Bantu Welfare Trust granted the Committee £50 for this purpose.

As a result the Committee is prepared to lend books free of charge to any Non-European student living in Southern Africa, provided that he is recommended as a person who will make good use of the library by any Location Superintendent, Native Commissioner, Mission Superintendent, or Principal of a Training College or approved Correspondence Course.

Application forms may be had from the Librarian, P.O. Box 246, Germiston.

SCHOOLS DEPARTMENT.

At the request of the Union Native Affairs Department, more schools, country as well as town, are being given the opportunity of applying for the loan of sets of books.

It is obvious that with the meagre funds at its disposal the Library Committee can provide only a small proportion of the applicant schools with libraries. Efforts are being made

to obtain more funds for the purpose of extending the library service to many more schools.

The Committee wishes to thank Native Commissioners in all parts of the Transvaal for the assistance they rendered in selecting schools to be recipients of boxes of books.

LIBRARY ORGANISATION.

The Committee employs an Organiser-Librarian whose duty it is to visit centres, instructing voluntary Librarians in their work; encouraging Advisory Boards and Committees to work for better library services in their own towns; and visiting schools, with the object of inducing children to read more and better books. He also organises talks to adults on literary topics, arranges debates, and in general, attempts to stimulate the interest of the Bantu and other Non-Europeans in books.

The Organiser visited 191 centres during the year and delivered 62 talks and lectures to Non-European audiences.
