Dear Dr Xuma. In confirmation of my telephone message.

The Mayor of Johannesburg has consented to introduce a deputation which is being organised by the above Campaign and which it is proposed should visit upon the Ministers of Justice and Native Affairs.

The purpose of the deputation will be to appeal for an immediate enquiry to be made by a representative and impartial body into urgent questions affecting social security which arise from the social and economic circumstances of Non-Europeans in urban and peri-urban areas; and for immediate action to be taken in accordance with the findings of this enquiry and having regard to the need of machinery for industrial conciliation for Non-Europeans. The deputation will consist of representatives from different religious denominations, medical, social and women's organisations, Joint Councils and trade unions.

We shall be very grateful if you would consent to accompanying this deputation as representing the Africa National Congress.

Right Honourable Sir,
Re DEPUTATION AFRICAN NATIONAL CONGRESS:

I have been asked by my Executive to request you most respectfully to be good enough to receive a deputation from the African National Congress.

You may be aware that for some time past the African National Congress has been making a study of the "ATLANTIC CHARTER" with special reference to its implications for and application to the African people of Southern Africa in particular and of Africa generally.

The results of this study have been embodied in a statement which we should like to place before you for your esteemed consideration.

We will appreciate it if you would receive the deputation on a date in September preferably about the middle of the month in order to give us an opportunity to inform other members of the deputation who live in different Provinces in time enough to arrange to be present at the interview.
