I beg to renew my application to you to address a public meeting either on Sunday the 10th or 17th October, 1948 at 10-30 a.m. If my request is acceded to please advise me as soon as possible in order to enable me to give the meeting a wide publicity.

May I again call your attention to the fact that Wilberforce Institute still owes the Croghan Community Clinic about £84, being balance on grant from the Native Affairs Department and refunds on Nurses' salaries which you banked into the Wilberforce Institute account.

Further, on August 17th, 1948, Rev. Mareka handed you a cheque for £150 which, although drawn on Wilberforce Institute at your advice and suggestion, was specifically stated to be on account of the Clinic expenses. It was further suggested and you concurred that you ask the O.P.S. Conference to pay in a similar amount of £150 to wipe off the Clinic's indebtedness to date.

You, however, converted the Transvaal Grant to other accounts and have not yet carried out the undertaking in the Free State.

Kindly pay the balance on the Government Grant and refund as well as balance on the last Transvaal Conference grant to the Clinic.

On requesting me to continue the work you promised that my salary and other expenses of the Clinic will be paid. Now you are confiscating funds paid for the purpose.

The driver gave a fist-blow twice on my left ear. You examined me when I was there. Now, at present I am making a case against the driver. I have employed the solicitor for that purpose. I beg you to do the best you can in giving your recommendation towards the procedure. The solicitor I employed needs to be given these information contained in his letter I enclose to you and after noting its contents you may return it to me. The reason my lawyer requires these points he wants to have strong points in his defence. I apply to you for your help as a doctor.

Who once examined me. I can  
afford to make means that I may  
call to your office again and  
examine me thoroughly for the  
solicitor question. I am now  
out of work. I was discharged by  
the Railway Department simply of  
complaining about the ailments of  
my ear & they said I was very  
troublesome. I always write to them  
about my complaints and yet the  
driver still works they did not  
take any step against him  
I, then, bring this letter from my lawyer
