NNUAL REPORT

Speakers from the Transvaal Peace Council addressed meetings convened by other organisations on May 1st., 1954 ColonialYouth Davy 19 March 21st, 1954 and on October 5th the Chairman of the Transvaal Peace Council addressed 400 Food and Canning workers at their General meeting of their Union.

At all of the above meetings resolutions on all important issues were adopted and were in most cases given prominence in the "Advance"

In October a statistics of religious ministers was held in Johannesburg and representatives from the following churches were present.

- o) Transveal Basuto.
- d) Anglican Church.

This was a most successful conference and marked the first instance that the Peace Novement had succeeded in attracting broader organisations. Discussions on the importance of immx peace and ways and means of bringing all issues to the notice of respective congregations constitued the main part of the conference. A decision to hold another conference during the next year wasalso taken.
