8. This badge to be worn as it stands by 3rd. Class Scouts, with "2" in red in top left hand corner for 2nd. Class Scouts and "E" for 1st. Class Scouts. Senior Scouts with "S" super-imposed. Higher ranks to have a Crown in red in top left hand corner. Leaders & Sub-leaders to wear Rank of their Scout service with two or one white chevrons on the left arm.

See 4 Shoulder knots to be worn.

Colours of all troops to be Black & White.

All Troop flags to be of Ensign Pattern, on white ground with Union Jack in top left-hand corner and Name of chapter with distinctive Motto (if desired) below. Badge of Chapter in bottom right hand corner.

Scout Law, Signs, and Salute to be retained; also Scout Promise.

to be affiliated with the Boy Scouts

- (1) The Order to be composed of Eurafrican, Native or Indian Boys between the ages of 10 and 18.
- (2) "Old Boys" Clubs may be arranged in connection with any Chapter for boys over 18.
- (3) For the present, in order to ensure adequate European supervision, chapters must be composed of Christian boys, attached to some definite Mission, and the name of a European Minister of religion must be registered as a "Visitor" to such Chapter: his consent to such an appointment in writing to be attached to a Chapter's application for registration.
- (4) The Organisation to be as under:-
 - Grand Master of the Order (for the Union)
 - Provincial Committees of Control (each under its President)
 - Chapter Committees (to control each chapter, if possible)
 - (a) The Grand Master to call a joint Grand Committee for the Union composed of all members of the Provincial Committees together if and when desirable.
 - (b) Any chapter registered in a country district where it is impossible to form a Committee must produce a written consent from the Visitor to so that he will inspect and enquire into the working of the chapter 3 times a year at least.
- (5) The term "Chapter" to be used instead of "Troop" in the European Organisation. The term "Patrol" to be retained.

The ranks of King's Scout, All-Round Scout & Silver Wolf will not be held in the Order. Any First Class Scout possessing Six Proficiency Badges or Three Proficiency Badges and a Medal for Life-saving to be known as Senior Scout.

(7) Badges

The general badge of the Order to be a black cross on White grounds surrounded by a circular inscription in Black on White:

"Fear God; Honour the King"

in cloth or metal.

This badge to be worn as it stands by Third Class Scouts, with the figure 2 in red in the top left hand corner for Second class Scout and the figure 1 in red in the top left hand corner for First Class Scout. Senior Scouts to have the letter S in red surper-imped. Higher ranks to have a Crown in red in the top left hand corner. Leaders to wear the badge of their rank as Scouts but in addition to wear two White chevrons and Scout Leaders one white chevrons on the left arm.

Shoulder knots not to be worn.

(Examples)

Colours of all Troops to be Black and White .

All Troop flags if desired to be of Eusign Pattern, on White ground with Union Jack in top left hand corner, Badge of the Order black in bottom right hand corner and below name of Chapter and if desired any distinctive Chapter Motto; An Imaginary example given

The Scout Law, Signs and Salute to be retained as at present, also the Scout Promise.

The tests to be as under-

Third Class Scout

as present Tenderdoot Test.

Second Class Scout.

as present Second class Test, omitting item "have 6d. in the Savings Bank" (owing to difficulty of running Savings Banks in the Country Chapters)

First Class Scout.

as present First Class Test, omitting item(1) Swimming Test and also Map Drawing and Reading and Savings Bank Tests making test re-tree-felling optional and adding tests:-

- (1) Must keep a small garden at least 6" by 6" to be in satisfactory condition when inspected.
- (2) Must produce an article of basket-work made by himself.
- (3) " " " " " Carpentry " " "
- (4) Must be able to write a passage of dictation and a simple letter from verbal directions given five minutes previously either in English or Dutch.

Two of additional tests (1) to (4) to be taken.

N.B. Indian Scouts may substitute Curry and Rice for stewed meat and Potatoes in Second Class Cooking item.

Proficiency Badges.

(8) Uniform as under:-

Felt hat, looped up at side, and with Black puggaree Navy Blue or dark blue shirt.

Navy blue or black shorts.

Navy blue or black stockings and black boots (nature Chapters) may dispense with these if desired but a Uniform practice must obtain throughout any particular Chapter)

Plain belt of dark brown or black leather or elastic cloth.

No Shoulder knots.

No hat-badge.

Black and White Neckerchief.

(Indian Chapters may use a Khaki turban in place of hat)

(9) Patrol Animals may be used but no Patrol Flags unless desired.

If desired to be black on white. The same practice must attain throughout any particular Chapter.

(10) Staves not to be used.

- (11) Where Chapters cannot obtain a European Scoutmaster, they may be formed under a Native Eurafrikan or Indian Scoutmaster on special Supervision (say e.g. once a month) by the visitor being arranged for a special permission being granted by the Provincial Committee of Control.
- (12) Every Chapter must have a Visitor and all Chapters in popular centred a Committee of whom three at least shall be Europeans, the Visitor being chairman.
- (13) The Provincial Committee of Control shall depute one or more Provincial Visitors annually to exercise a general supervision and report to the annual meeting of the Provincial Committee of Control. An Official hand-book should subsequently be compiled giving all details, the above details however, mark a complete differentiation between the European and other Scouts. Further safeguards should be.
- (1) No joint parades to be held unless the Local Committee of the (European) Boy Scouts by a 2/3 majority extends an invitation to the Local A.O.P. Scouts.
- (2) Any officer or member of the (European) Boy Scouts assisting in the A.O.P. Scout to wear his (European) Boy Scouts' Uniform or Badges when so engaged.
- (3) All tests except additional test (4) of the First Class Badge and the Interpreter's Proficiency Badge may if desired and practicable be conducted in the vernacular.
