The Hanns Seidel Foundation in South Africa

To assist in the process of transition the Hanns Seidel Foundation opened in early 1991 an office in Johannesburg and is currently envolved in the following programmes:

The Political Leadership Programme (PLP)

The Political Leadership Programme conducted in cooperation with the **Institute for Multi-Party Democracy** provides practical training and skill acquisition for political leaders. In addition it engenders political tolerance by providing opportunities for informal contact and dialogue across the political spectrum. The programme is unique, in that it combines experimental learning, political socialisation and the acquisition of valuable political skills. Fortytwo in-depth political training workshops will be conducted during 1991 in various regions.

New Public Administration Initiative (NPAI)

The New Public Administration Initiative has been supported by the Hanns Seidel Foundation since its inception. With this project we provide an independent forum for experts of various universities and training institutions to formulate and implement appropriate strategies for the rapid professional development of public management practice and training in line with the task and challenges of the New South Africa. Internationally experienced experts on public administration from well established german training institutions are prepared to assist the NPAI in the difficult tasks of curriculum development, enhancement of the effectiveness, efficiency and productivity of the public service and public sector of a new South Africa as well as institution building.

Institute for Defence Politics (IDP)

In cooperation with the Institute for Defence Politics (IDP) the Hanns Seidel Foundation is providing here again an independent forum to open up the debate in various conferences on military-civil relations in a post apartheid South Africa. The IDP is also providing CODESA with working papers regarding the code of conduct for security forces and the constitutional framework for civil-military relations.

Township project in the Western Cape

In several townships in the Western Cape the Hanns Seidel Foundation is supporting a number of underprivileged communities with a variety of small projects to improve the social framework and the living conditions in these areas.

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
