We have been trying to make a garden here. So far it is more of an archeological excavation that we are engaged in, uncarthing layers of rock. We could build Hertgog's Tower with the rocks we have uncarthed. Now and again we come across an interesting formation and our heares beat fast - Diamonds! we think. But we have uncarthed so hidden treasure, so far.

The Economist Bookshop has once more written to say they cannot trace the individual or organization responsible for my account with them. They

may Wana has written to them but the phone number and address he has given them are invalid.

Regarding the LLB Course, I am in two minds. I should very much like to do it - and "collect" another degree. But I also want to start earning as soon as possible.

If, therefore, it is possible and permissible to do the LLb in three years I shall cerainly tackle it. But I am not too sure that I can easily spend five years not earning my living.

I shall look forward to your visit in December, I should love to meet Anne. It will be interesting to review our situation once more.

The children - Miliswa and Dini - are fine. Dini has to go to Waterford on the 29th November to write admission tests. Veronica will be accompanying him.
