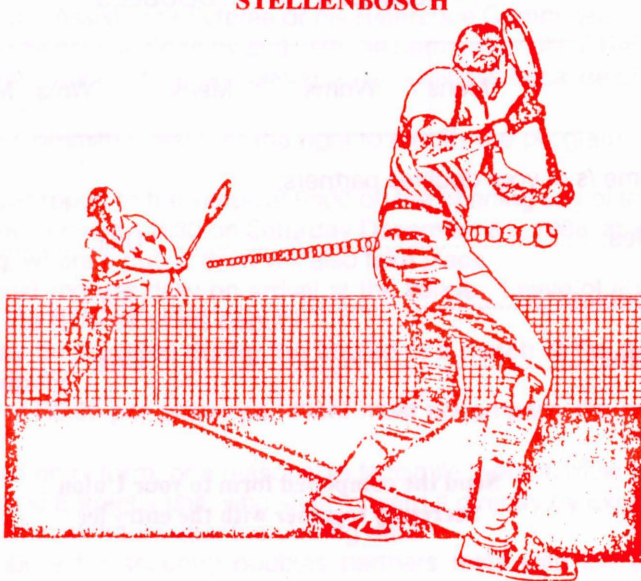

TOURNAMENT RULES & CONDITIONS
(This sheet should be retained by the competitor for Reference)

1. The Tournament shall be conducted under the rules of the International Tennis Federation.
2. All matches shall be decided on the basis of the best of three sets, except for the Men's Doubles events in the TASA Open which shall be decided on the basis of the best of five sets from and including the Quarter Finals.
3. Play shall commence at 9h00 daily and stop at such times as may be decided by the Referee.
4. Players must abide by the Reference or his deputy as to the court and venue to be used, and the time a match has to commence. Defaulters shall be scratched.
5. All competitors may be required to assist with court duties. Competitors who do not fulfill their obligations shall be liable to disciplinary measures by the Reference Committee.
6. Competitors must wear acceptable tennis attire. The Reference or his deputy shall be the sole judge.
7. Competitors shall abide by the decisions and rulings of the Reference, or in his absence, that of the Assistance Referee or his Reference Committee.
8. Substitutions shall only be done by and with the permission of the Referee in respect of a doubles combination where one player is not available because of an acceptable reason.
9. The Reference Committee reserves the right to modify the programme in any way it deems fit.
10. All players must report to the venue at 9h00 on the opening day of the Tournament, Registration takes place at 14h30 on Saturday December 31, 1988, at the Compusory Players' Meeting, where a public draw will also take place.
11. All players must register daily on arrival at the venue. Leave of absence shall be granted only by the Referee or his deputy.
12. New balls may be provided during the course of a match at the discretion of the Referee or his deputy.
13. An entry fee of R6,00 per player per event must accompany the completed entry form.
14. The completed entry form, or a reasonable facsimile thereof, must be submitted to the Secretary of the Entrant's unit, who shall forward it directly by Express Post to the address given within 48 hours after the closing date.
- X 15. The responsibility for securing doubles partners rests with the entrant...../and partner entries will only be considered from units where only one player enters. In such a case the referee cannot guarantee competition in a doubles event.
16. The TASA tie-breaker shall be used.
17. The closing date for the submission of TASA Open entries shall be Saturday 17 December 1988.
18. Entry fees are not refundable.
19. Entries shall only be entertained if submitted in the manner described above.
- X 20. Players will be permitted to enter one singles event only.
