IN CITIES OF 100,000 PEOPLE AND OVER. THESE MAY BE HARD FIGURES TO GRASP. BUT THEY ARE EVEN MORE ASTONISHING WHEN APPLIED SPECIFICALLY TO JOHANNESBURG. THE TRANSVAAL'S POPULATION IN 1960 WAS 1,468,305 WHITES. JOHANNESBURG'S METROPOLITAN POPULATION FOR THE SAME YEAR WAS 413, 153 WHITES. IT IS EXPECTED THAT IN THE YEAR 2,000 JOHANNESBURG'S POPULATION WILL HAVE MORE THAN DOUBLED ITS WHITE FIGURE TO 943,000 - THE TOTAL POPULATION IN THAT YEAR IS EXPECTED TO HAVE INCREASED FROM 1,152.525 TO 2,867,000.

I AM MENTIONING THESE FIGURES SPECIFICALLY TO INDICATE HOW
POPULATION GROWTH HAS TELESCOPED. FROM THE PERIOD 350 to 1850 A. D.
POPULATION IN THE WORLD DOUBLED ITSELF. FROM 1850 to 1950 - A CENTURY WORLD POPULATION AGAIN DOUBLED ITSELF BUT... IN A PERIOD OF 40 YEARS,

FROM 1950 to 1990, IT IS ESTIMATED THAT THE WORLD POPULATION WILL AGAIN DOUBLE ITSELF. WE ARE USUALLY SO INCLINED TO APPLY POPULATION FIGURES TO THE WORLD, TO CHINA, TO RUSSIA, BUT THE FIGURES I HAVE GIVEN YOU FOR THE JOHANNESBURG METROPOLITAN AREA, SHOWING THAT IN 40 YEARS WE ARE GOING TO MORE THAN DOUBLE OUR POPULATION WILL MAKE YOU, OUR VISITORS TO JOHANNESBURG, APPRECIATE THAT THIS IS INDEED NO MEAN CITY.

TO YOU, MR. MINISTER, AND TO YOU, MRS. WARING, THANK YOU FOR COMING A THOUSAND MILES FROM CAPE TOWN TO MAKE THIS EVENING EVEN MORE MEMORABLE.
