Mr. J.D. Fraser, said that S.A.H.Q. had agreed to lend the Transvaal sufficient money to pay the usual expenses for this month, £67 .-. - but no further loan would be made. The Transvaal now owed about £500 to different people or Associations and had no money.

A Finance Committee consisting of Rev. Albertyn, Mr. Montwedi, Mr. Rathebe, Mr. Seepe, Mr. Musgrove, and Mr. Rees was appointed, with power to co-opt. The first meeting was fixed for 2nd. May, at 10.00 a.m.
