Dear Mama.

I kept you waiting for a reply to your last letter of the 30<sup>th</sup> ult. hoping to let you know when I may go away from Moscow. I did tell you in my last letter, that it is quite possible I shall take a position with Mr. Nasarenius for a time, but will have to go to Siberia, and that will give me a better opportunity to give you the necessary assistance in order that the children might continue as hitherto.

I am very glad indeed to think that you yourself recognise that this is the best way. It is very unlikely that any one will be permitted to go to England for a time. So that meanwhile in order to carry on, I accepted a position which will give me the opportunity to provide you for time. I will write you more fully in a few days, when all will be more

Clear. At times I feel very lonely &  
longing to see you all, but I am trying not  
to think too much, knowing well that  
at present it can't be helped. No matter  
what people think I am conscious of  
one thing, & that is that I am doing  
the right thing under the circumstances.  
I have written L. Radonitsch asking  
him to give you £10 - and then again  
I asked him to give you £50 or 60  
which sum I am here paying to  
his brother. That should keep you  
going for a time. I will endeavour  
to keep you posted often where I  
am going to be, but in case you  
do not get a reply quickly I want  
you not to worry.

The newspapers will in all probability  
write all sorts of nonsense about  
the state of affairs here. Don't

believe them it is all best.

I am glad you and the children are well and hope you will keep well. If you can fix up to let the house for a month or so while you go on holiday say in August it would be a fine thing.

But of course this is a matter which you yourself can decide. I can not say any thing, but you might like to try.

I have nothing more to say except will say more in a few days.
