



I note, however, that the Company recommends asphaltting under conditions stated in the last paragraph of the enclosed copy of their letter.

The implications of this paragraph are not quite clear for two reasons.

1) What extra charges, if any, are to be made for rendering the job satisfactory, including asphaltting?

2) What do they mean when they write "That the owner assume responsibility for any holes etc. appearing in the Surface caused by the sharp legs of the old stoves etc." ?

One would like to know whether they expect the owner to do the levelling so that they merely pour on the asphalt. Do they expect that if one put an irregular weight or weights on loose sand or gravel, the sand would remain in position? This seems an unreasonable, antagonistic, and unbusiness-like attitude to adopt.

There is no objection in the suggestion "that the owner have all the rubbish removed from the yard entirely before the work be commenced."
