Dear Rev. Father,

At my arrival here after a whole week's absence the Rev. Father Superior gave me your letter of the 16th inst. I hasten to give you a few answers to your questions.

1. It is very hard, especially at the present time, for Natives to get employment in the different trades.
2. I could not say which class of tradesmen finds it most difficult to get employment. I should say that all of them find it very hard.
3. An employment bureaux would certainly be welcome<sup>d</sup> and would be made use of by the Natives.

4. There are many Natives who would be able to build houses for other Natives. I may mention that about two years ago the Native Affairs Department of Pietermaritzburg, Natal, inserted a small advertisement one single time in our Weekly Native Paper "Um-Afrika", ~~From Secretary's office~~ inviting Natives to apply for a job of building a "dipping tank". Afterwards the Secretary wrote to me that <sup>he</sup> ~~they~~ got over 30 applications after one single insertion. Therefore I am sure that a good ~~many~~ number of Native buildings would report themselves if an advertisement were put in our Newspaper and also in other Native papers.

Dear Mr. Bottrill

For some time past my wife & I have been concerned over the question of the training & employment of Native girls for domestic service. We both realize <sup>many</sup> ~~some~~ of the difficulties with which <sup>the</sup> ~~the~~ institutions <sup>both in respect of training & employment & training for home life</sup> have to deal & we also know something of the problem of <sup>securing</sup> ~~finding~~ suitable employers <sup>of employment</sup> & satisfactory conditions. We both have experience of the problem in respect of White girls as well through our membership of the Juvenile Affairs Board).

Now these questions have come before us in a more definite form because other institutions are embarking on extensive programmes of domestic training, while one or two which already have courses in existence have approached us for advice.

It seems to us that it would be advantageous for all concerned if a small, informal conference were held to discuss common difficulties & to if possible to arrive at <sup>an</sup> ~~agreements~~ <sup>to form</sup> common policy in respect of the matters mentioned below.
