First Class—Letters, written and sealed matter for local delivery or otherwise.

per oz. 3c

Air Mail—Anywhere U. S. Domestic Mail Service is in operation . . . per oz. 5c

Second Class—Newspapers, magazines, and other periodicals entered as second class matter, when mailed by the public, 1c for each 2 ounces or fraction thereof (or the fourth class rate whichever is lower).

Third Class—(limit 8 ounces) Circulars and other miscellaneous printed matter, also merchandise, $1\frac{1}{2}c$ for each 2 ounces. Books (including catalogs) of 24 pages or more, seeds, cuttings, bulbs, roots and plants, 1c for each 2 ounces.

* Fourth Class—(Parcel Post) Merchandise, printed matter, and all other mailable matter not in first, second or third class. Zone rates of postage apply. Consult nearest Post Office for rates.

Special Handling—Fourth class matter only. Parcels of fourth class matter indorsed "Special Handling" will be given

the most expeditious handling, transportation and delivery practicable (but not special delivery) upon payment, in addition to the regular postage, of the following charge: Up to 2 pounds, 10c; Over 2 lbs. up to 10 lbs., 15c; Over 10 pounds, 20c.
