Sir, — The Department of Foreign Affairs published a booklet called "S.A. and the Rule of Law" which says that "if an accused is found not guilty he is acquitted and that is the end of the matter."

We feel it is unfortunate that this principle does not also apply to persons found guilty by our courts and sentenced by them.

Robert Sobukwe has now been in jail for eight years although a sentence of three years was imposed upon him by the courts. Parliament is obviously not satisfied with the findings of the independent judiciary and therefore imposes upon him each year a further year's imprisonment without trial.
